GETTING THERE

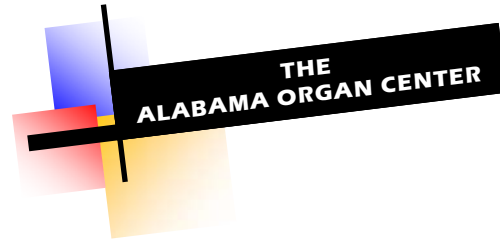
From Mobile Airport: Turn east on Airport Blvd. and travel 7 miles to I-65. Take I-65 South 3.5 miles to I-10. Take I-10 East 25 miles to Exit 44 (Hwy. 59). Take Hwy. 59 South 29 miles to Hwy. 182 (This is the beach highway in Gulf Shores). Take Hwy. 182 East 8.5 miles to the Perdido Beach Resort.

OR—Use the Foley Beach Express from Mobile Airport: Turn east on Airport Blvd. and travel 7 miles to I-65. Take I-65 South 3.5 miles to I-10. Take I-10 East 25 miles to Exit 44 (Hwy. 59). Take Hwy. 59 South 15 miles to Foley Beach Express. Take Foley Beach Express to Hwy. 180 (Toll Bridge cost is \$2.00). Take Hwy. 180 East 5 miles to Hwy. 161 to Hwy. 182. Take Hwy. 182 East 2 miles to the Perdido Beach Resort (Beachside).

From the North: I-65 South Exit 37 (Hwy. 287). Take Hwy. 287 South to Hwy. 59 South. Take the Foley Beach Express from Hwy. 59 in Foley to Alabama Hwy 180 in Orange Beach and to Hwy. 182 along the beach to the Perdido Beach Resort.
