

Application For The Incoming Freshman Dean's Scholarships

Description:

The Department of Art and Art History awards two Incoming Freshman Dean's Scholarships each year. The Scholarships are awarded from an annual fund generously given by the Dean of the School of Arts and Humanities. Awards are granted based on academic and artistic promise evident in the application submitted.

Application deadline: 4:30 pm on the fourth Wednesday in January

Requirements:

1. The completed form on the reverse of this announcement.
2. The applicant's high school transcript.
3. A representative CD portfolio of your work as an artist. The CD should include no fewer than 5 works and no more than 10. Images should be in JPG format at 2400 pixies in there largest demotion. Please do not send original work.
4. Letters of recommendation are welcomed, but not required.
5. Applications are to be delivered to the office of the Department of Art and Art History, 113 Humanities Building, 900 13th Street South. (934-4941) Portfolios should be picked up during the following week in the same office.

Rules governing the award and tenure of the scholarship:

1. The applicant must be entering UAB with the intention to major in Art or Art History.
2. The applicant must have an overall GPA of 3.5 and an ACT score of 26. (A portfolio of exceptionally high quality may support a waiver of the GPA and ACT requirements.)
3. Students who apply for the Incoming Freshman Dean's Scholarship are also automatically considered for an Incoming Freshman Scholarship in the event they do not receive one of the Dean's Scholarships. (Only one application needs to be submitted.)
4. The faculty of the Department of Art and Art History will choose the Art Scholars from among applicants. If there is no applicant who is qualified in the judgement of the faculty, no scholarship will be awarded.
5. The Art Scholar must be a full-time student registered for at least 12 semester hours in each of the semester for which the Scholar elects to receive an installment of the Scholarship. A student using the award in the summer term need only be registered for 9 semester hours. Exceptions to this rule can, however, be made.
6. If the Scholar withdraws in a term for which the Scholar receives a stipend, or fails to maintain a "C" average, any balance of the Scholarship will not be paid.
7. Late applications will not be considered.
