

Application For The Schnorrenberg Scholarship

Description:

The Department of Art and Art History awards a Schnorrenberg Scholarship to an undergraduate student with a concentration in Art History. The Scholarship is awarded from the income of an endowment created by the family and friends of John M. Schnorrenberg, Professor Emeritus of Art History at UAB.

Application deadline: 4:30 pm on the third Wednesday of April.

Requirements:

1. The completed form on the reverse of this announcement
2. The applicant's unofficial UAB transcript.
3. A representative portfolio including at least two papers on art historical subjects. Papers submitted for courses are acceptable. They may be corrected and improved versions of what an instructor has read and criticized.

Rules governing the award and tenure of the scholarship

1. An applicant must have completed 203, 204, 206 and at least one 400-level art history class by the beginning of Fall Semester.
2. The applicant must have a concentration in Art History.
3. The applicant must have a good academic record, with an overall GPA of 3.0 and above a 3.0 in Art History.
4. The faculty of the Department of Art and Art History will choose the Schnorrenberg Scholar. If there is no applicant who is qualified in the judgment of the faculty, no scholarship will be awarded that year.
5. The scholarship will be paid in two semesters or two semesters and a summer term.
6. The Schnorrenberg Scholar must be a full-time student registered for at least twelve semester hours in the term for which the scholarship is paid. A student using the award in the summer term need only be registered for 9 semester hours. Exceptions to this rule however, can be made.
7. If the Scholar withdraws in a term for which the Scholar receives a stipend, or fails to maintain a "B" average, any balance of the Scholarship will not be paid.
8. Late applications will not be considered.
