

Application For The Ellen Shizuko Takahashi Award For Painting

Description:

The Department of Art and Art History annually awards the Ellen Shizuko Takahashi Award for Painting to a student demonstrating talent in the area of painting. The Award is granted from the income of an endowment created by the family and friends of the late Ellen Shizuko Takahashi, Professor in the Department of Physiological Optics at UAB.

Application deadline: 4:30 pm on the fourth Wednesday in January

Requirements:

1. The completed form on the reverse of this announcement.
2. The applicant's unofficial UAB transcript.
3. A representative CD portfolio of your work as an artist. The CD should include no fewer than 5 works and no more than 10. Images should be in JPG format at 2400 pixies in there largest demotion. Please do not send original work. All portfolios should include a list of works including title, size, medium, and date.

Rules governing the award and tenure of the scholarship:

1. The applicant must at minimum have completed or currently be enrolled in ARS 210 Beginning Painting with the understanding that preference will be given to those students with intermediate and advanced levels of painting experience.
2. Preference will be given to majors in art studio with a focused interest in painting and drawing.
3. The applicant must have at minimum an academic record of a 2.75 GPA overall and a 3.0 average in all art courses.
4. The faculty of the Department of Art and Art History will choose the Ellen Shizuko Takahashi Award from among the applicants. If there is no applicant who is qualified in the judgement of the faculty, no award will be granted.
5. The scholarship will be paid in the subsequent semester of the award being announced, either Summer or Fall term as to the student's preference.
6. Preference will be given to full-time students registered for at least twelve semester hours in the term for which the scholarship is paid. A student using the award in the summer term need only be registered for 9 semester hours. Exceptions to this rule can, however, be made.
7. If the student withdraws in a term for which they receive the stipend, or fails to maintain a "C" average, any balance of the Scholarship will not be paid.
8. Late applications will not be considered.
