Sparks an Early Intervention Site

The Civitan-Sparks Clinics applied to the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services in June to become an Early Intervention site for Jefferson County. The clinics received notification in mid-July that they were approved as a new site. Screening Clinic

The new Screening Clinic began on Tuesday, July 19 at the UAB Civitan-Sparks Clinics. For now, the clinic sees younger kids who are covered by Medicaid insurance. Several disciplines evaluate a child, summarizing their work briefly for a joint clinic note. Graduate student trainees gain experience in this new endeavor, also.

Research and Publications

Sarah O'Kelley, PhD received funding by the Association of Maternal & Child Health Programs through the Department of Psychology, Division of Psychology in the amount of \$15,000 for the period 12/1/2010 through 11/30/2011 for her grant, "Act Early Alabama Awareness and Training Initiative."

The Biochemical Genetics Team (Inherited Disorders of Metabolism) has begun their fourth consecutive year of a grant from the Alabama Department of Public Health to provide low-protein foods for clients with metabolic disorders who are in financial need. **Suzanne Geerts, MS, RD** and **Lauren Dodd, MA, RD** facilitate the program to benefit the families.

The UAB Rett Syndrome Team under the direction of Dr. Alan Percy traveled to Miami, FL on July 10, to conduct ongoing Rett Syndrome Natural History Study. **Suzanne Geerts, MS, RD** is part of the team. Other medical teams involved in the study include those from Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, TX and Greenwood Genetics Center, Greenwood, SC. The event was hosted by the International Rett Syndrome Foundation and the Rett Syndrome Parents Support Group of Florida. Families attending represent the southeast United States and South America.

Suzanne Geerts, MS, RD was published as a co-author of "Vitamin D Deficiency is Prevalent in Females with Rett Syndrome" in *Journal of Pediatric Gastroenterology & Nutrition*, May 30, 2011.

The USC University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities (USC UCEDD) has translated the "Learn the Signs. Act Early" Autism Fact Sheet from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) into multiple languages to reach underserved populations. The Autism Fact Sheet provides a one-page tool for clinicians to share with families to raise awareness about developmental delay, which may be related to autism or other developmental disabilities. It is now available in Arabic, Armenian, Farsi, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Mandarin, Tagalog, Thai, and Vietnamese.

RoboBraille is a free, non-commercial provider of document conversions for accessibility. You can send an e-mail with an attached text document to the RoboBraille e-mail account and receive the document back in an accessible format – for instance, an audio file or Braille. There is no software to install, and use is unlimited.
