

# MA Information Packet Master's Degree and Class A Teacher Certification in Secondary Education and Single Subject K-12

Welcome to UAB's MA program in secondary education. The first purpose of this program is to guide educators in meeting the evolving needs of learners, primarily in grades 6-12, within today's rapidly changing society.     Upon taking the exam, you must request that a score report be sent directly to UAB's Graduate School. For most students, the MAT offers greater advantages than the GRE. The MAT is shorter, less expensive and conducted at UAB several times a week. Students can usually improve their MAT score by marking "C" on all questions they don't know. - Provide names of 3 people for recommendations (UAB will automatically send them a form by email.)

#### 4. Consider submitting a non-degree seeking application

If you are unable to submit a degree-seeking application by the Graduate School's deadline and you wish to start taking courses that will count towards your master's degree, you may consider submitting a non-degree seeking application. If so, you should follow these instructions:

- a. Go to the *ApplyYourself* website: https://app.applyyourself.com/?id=uab-grad.
- b. Create an application account, write down your user name and password, and log-out.
- c. Log back in, select non-degree seeking, and mark education as your intended major.
- d. With non-degree status, you can only take 12 credit hours towards your degree. NOTE: While taking courses with non-degree seeking status, you are not eligible for financial aid.

## Responsibilities after being Admitted to UAB

The day after you process your BlazerID, you will be able to register for class. You should consult with your Program Director prior to registering for courses. Upon registering, check when the deadline is for paying 50% of your tuition. If you do not pay by this deadline, you will be automatically withdrawn from your courses and must pay a reinstatement fee.

Tuition and fees = \$1,200 for 3-hour graduate education course in 2012-13. (NOTE: Yearly increments may occur.)

- Pending final approval: After starting your first course, you must purchase an online TaskStream account to submit key assessments for certain MA courses. After creating this account, you should post the following admission artifacts: your Class B certification from the ALSDE and the certification checklist on which you were admitted.
- If recommended by an instructor and/or faculty advisor, you must take GRD 727 Academic Writing.
- You should avoid taking more than 4 program courses (12 credit hours) before being admitted to the MA program.
- You should meet each term with your faculty advisor or send an email. If needed, you should seek advising more frequently.
- You should submit an Application for Degree to the Office of Student Services about 7 months before you plan to graduate http://www.uab.edu/graduate/apply/acrobat/app-for-degree.pdf

You must complete this form online, print it, SIGN it, make a copy for yourself, and submit it in person or by fax or email. This deadline and other important dates were provided on the preceding page.

Failure to meet the deadline for submitting the application for degree may delay graduation by a full semester.

- During your final semester, you should do the following:
  - a) Ask your advisor if your Class A program requires a comprehensive exam. If so, you should contact Nancy Timpa mtimpa@uab.edu at the beginning of your final semester and submit a comps sign-up sheet.

- d) To be eligible for a higher salary bracket, submit an online request to the UAB register for an official UAB transcript to be sent to your school system. When requesting your transcript, be sure to mark "upon posting of degree."

#### **Graduation and Teacher Certification**

UAB's School of Education (SOE) recommends candidates to the Graduate School for all graduate degrees. After verifying documentation, the Graduate School approves and awards the degree. This process is usually completed 2 weeks after graduation.

#### Requirements for being awarded an MA degree

Completion of the degree program (which is based on the corresponding certification checklist)

Master's degree GPA of at least 3.0

Satisfactory professional dispositions

Satisfactory completion of key assessments

Electronic assessment portfolio (probably on TaskStream)

The SOE recommends candidates to the Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) for teacher certification in a targeted teaching field. After verifying documentation, the ALSDE approves and issues certification. This process may take several months.
