CORE CURRICULUM HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES REQUIREMENTS**

A total of 18 semester hours in the areas of humanities and fine arts and history, social and behavioral sciences are required to fulfill the undergraduate program requirements in every engineering discipline. The credit hour requirements are subdivided into two areas. **Engineering's students must complete 6 semester hours in a discipline (please note: for Core Area IV, students cannot use more than 6 hours of History.) Bolded courses are highly recommended.**
