Our Presenters

Daniel C. Marson, JD, PhD, is a tenured Professor in the Department of Neurology at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB). He is the Director of the NIA funded Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at UAB, and he also directs the Division of Neuropsychology within the Department of Neurology. Dr. Marson has lectured nationally and internationally regarding medical, legal and ethical issues in dementia and other neurocognitive disorders. His area of research focus is loss of medical decision-making capacity, financial capacity, and other higher order instrumental activities of daily life.

Jennifer Manly, PhD completed her graduate training in neuropsychology at the University of California at San Diego in 1996. After a clinical internship at Brown University, she completed 2 years of postdoctoral training at Columbia University in New York. In 1998, she became an Assistant Professor of Neuropsychology in Neurology at the G.H. Sergievsky Center and the Taub Institute for Research in Aging and Alzheimer's disease at Columbia University. Her research on cognitive test performance among African American and Hispanic elders is currently funded by the National Institute on Aging and the Senator Mark Hatfield Award for Clinical Research in Alzheimer's disease from the Alzheimer's Association. She has authored over 30 peer-reviewed publications and 6 chapters.



Congressman Artur Davis has served two terms in Congress, representing the Alabama 7th District, earning a reputation as a productive and effective legislator who has set a new standard of service for his constituents. As Congressman Davis begins his third term, he is poised to influence the national debate, as a member of one of the most prestigious committees in the House, the Ways and Means Committee, which oversees economic policy in a wide array of areas, including tax

Congressman Davis' strong legislative track record in Washington is matched with an active presence in his West Alabama district. He has chaired the Health Care Subcommittee of Governor Bob Riley's Black Belt Action Commission, an effort that has led to expanded delivery of vital services throughout the Black Belt. The Commission has been heralded by various news organizations as one of the best public-private partnerships in the state's recent history. He has been recognized by the Washington Post, the National Journal and CNN as one of the future leaders to watch in Washington.

Richard E. Powers, MD, is a Geriatric Psychiatrist and Neuropathologist. He trained at the University of Kentucky, in Lexington, KY, and at Johns Hopkins Hospital, in Baltimore, MD. He is currently Associate Professor of Pathology in the Division of Neuropathology at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. He is the Director of the Bureau of Geriatric Psychiatry for the Department of Mental Health and oversees the Dementia Education & Training Program for the State of Alabama. He is also the Medical Director for the State of Alabama Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation.

Harbert Center Directions

From South of Birmingham on I-65, take I-65 north to the Third Avenue North exit ramp and turn right. Turn left on 23rd Street North, then left again at Fourth Avenue North. The Harbert Center is three blocks away on the left.

From North of Birmingham on I-65, take I-65 south to the I-20/59 east (toward Atlanta). Take the second exit, which is 22nd Street North, and turn right. At Fourth Avenue North, turn right. The Harbert Center is one block away on the left.

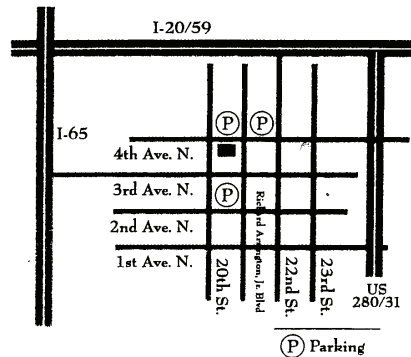
From South or East of Birmingham on Highway 280 or Highway 31 (The Red Mountain Expressway), exit at the First Avenue North ramp and turn left. At 23rd Street turn right. Go three blocks to Fourth Avenue North and turn left. The Harbert Center is three blocks away on the left.

From East of Birmingham on I-20, take I-20 to the 22nd Street exit. Go to Fourth Avenue North and turn right. The Harbert Center is a block away on the left.

From West of Birmingham on I-20/59, take I-20/59 to the 22nd Street exit. Turn right. At Fourth Avenue North, turn right. The Harbert Center is a block away on the left.
