AMIA 2007 Award to Jackie Moss

Congratulations to Dr. Jackie Moss who received the Harriet H. Werley award by the American Medical Informatics Association at the AMIA 2007 symposium in Chicago.

This prestigious award is given to the a nurse who is first author of the paper judged to make the greatest contribution to advancing the field of nursing informatics. The candidate's papers are recommended by the AMIA Annual Symposium Scientific Program Committee, and the selection of the recipient is made by a special commit-

tee within the AMIA Nursing Informatics Working Group. "An analysis of narrative nursing documentation in an otherwise structured intensive care clinical information system" will be available via PubMed in early 2008.

Additionally, Dr. Moss's BSN Honor student, Margot Andison, was a finalist for the Nursing Informatics Working Group Award for best student paper, "What nurses do: Use of the ISO reference terminology model for nursing action as a framework for analyzing MICU nursing Practice Patterns".

Greetings from the Center for Nursing Research (CNR). We continue to develop new programs and evaluate existing programs in the CNR. I would like to share with you a new support enhancement, which is the role of the Research Consultant. A research consultant is a faculty who has experience in grant writing, submission, and funding. The research consultant agrees to work one-on-one with faculty who are developing or in the beginning stages of preparing research proposals for external funding. A research consultant helps to guide faculty in external grant preparation earlier rather than later in the cycle of grant submission. The research consultant can also help faculty to see where minor or major changes to the grant application can strengthen the proposal earlier in the

process. In addition, we have instituted the role of the research consultant starting with our grant submissions for the February 2008 grant cycle.

The CNR staff is eager to develop research and scholarship programs that are relevant to our faculty's interests. Thus, SON faculty recently received a needs assessment about faculty scholarship development

CANS (Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science) Update

There is increased recognition that practice-based evidence is a vital source of information to guide clinical practice and to generate new knowledge. The Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science, better known as CANS, hosted the Special Topics Conference in Washington, DC on October 24, 2007. The one day conference titled, ‘Practice-based evidence – other side of the knowledge development coin,’ was devoted to practice-based evidence. The morning sessions were devoted to presentations that described the conduct of practice-based research. Presenters shared examples of this type of research in the practice areas of stroke rehabilitation, joint replacement, pressure ulcers,

and bronchiolitis. In the afternoon, presenters outlined the data entry and data organization standards necessary for the collection of clinical information used to derive evidence from the practice setting. Chronicity of HIV & Aging on Neuropsychological and Everyday Performance. As individuals with HIV age, the effects of having HIV may produce cognitive declines that impact daily functioning & quality of life, resulting in poorer mental health and decreased autonomy. This study will examine how age & disease duration impact cognition and daily function in this population.

A Culturally Adapted Intervention for Rural Immigrant Latino Parents & Teens. The project modify an existing parent/adolescent program making it culturally relevant for rural immigrant Latino families in the Southeast.
