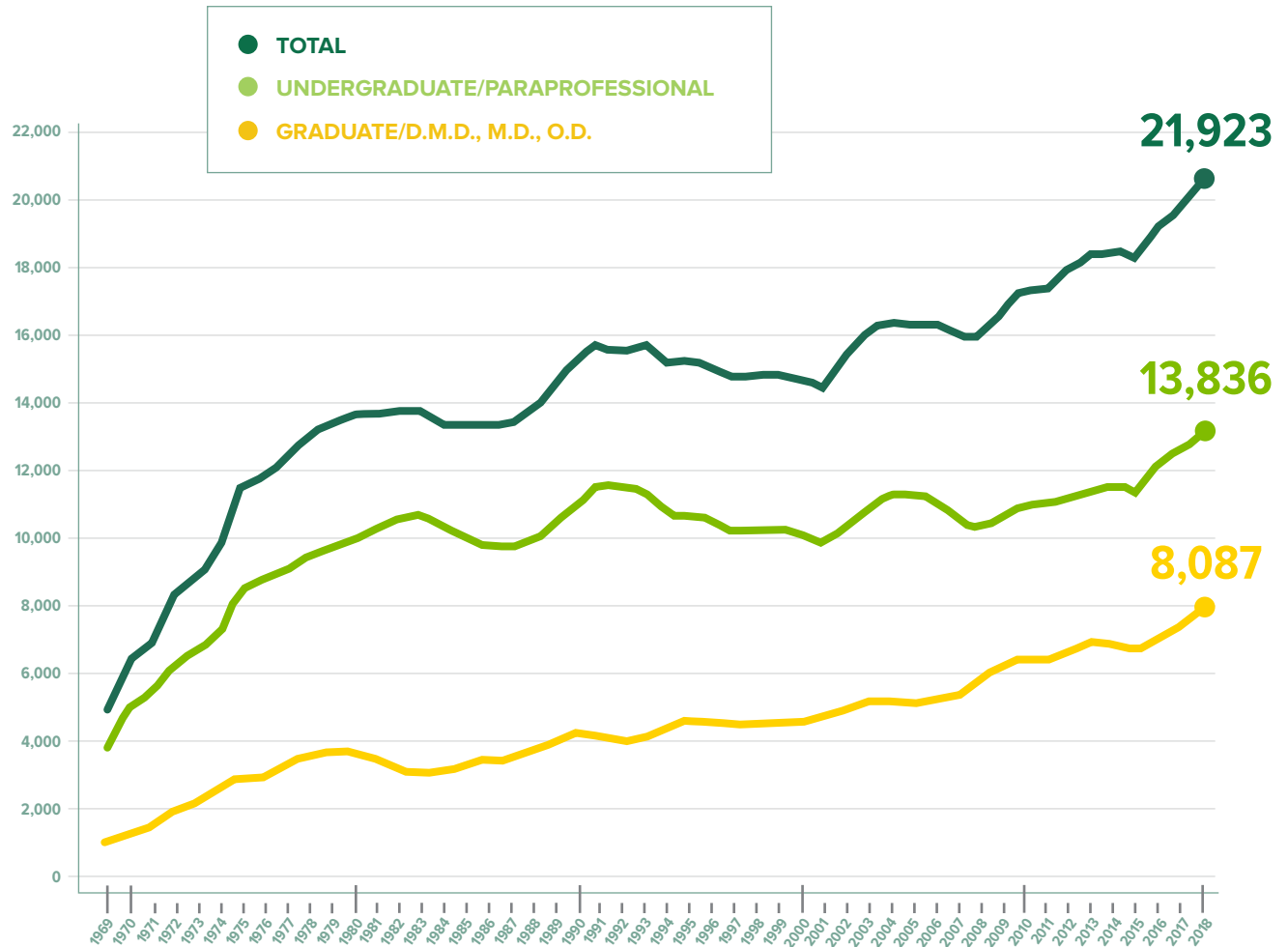

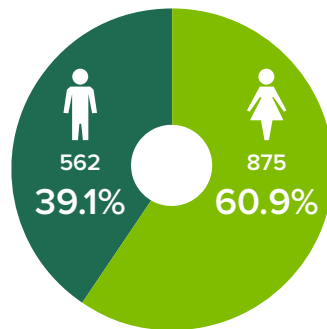

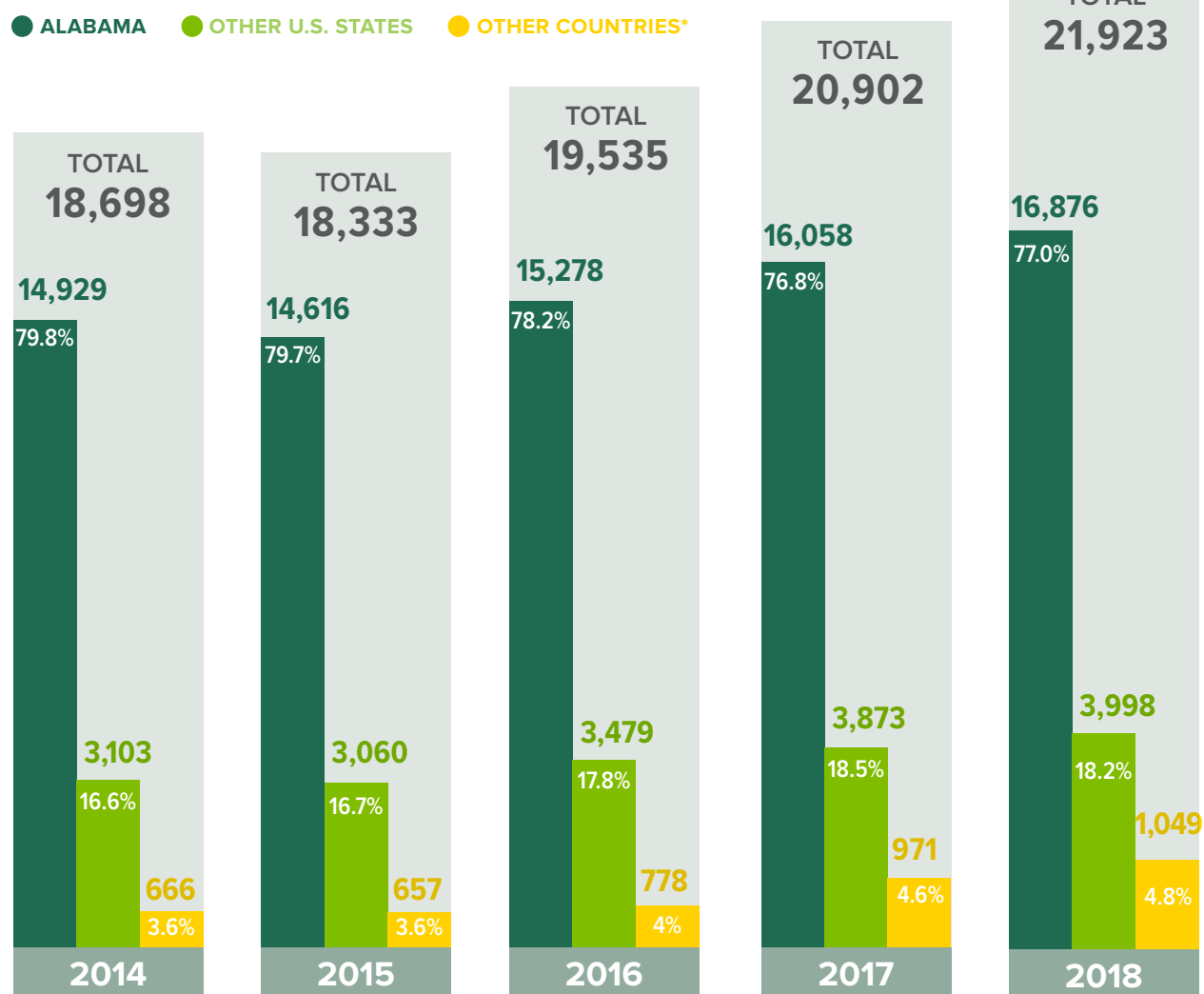

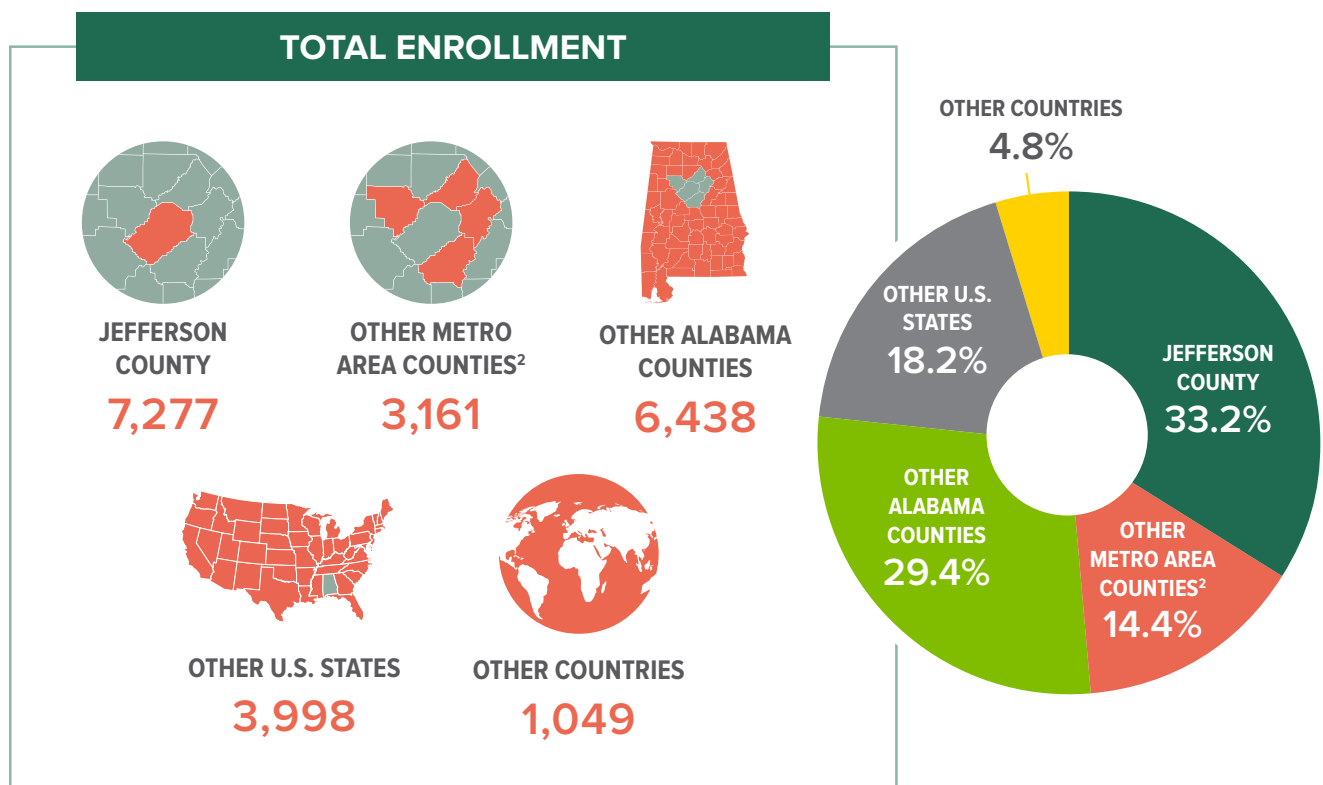

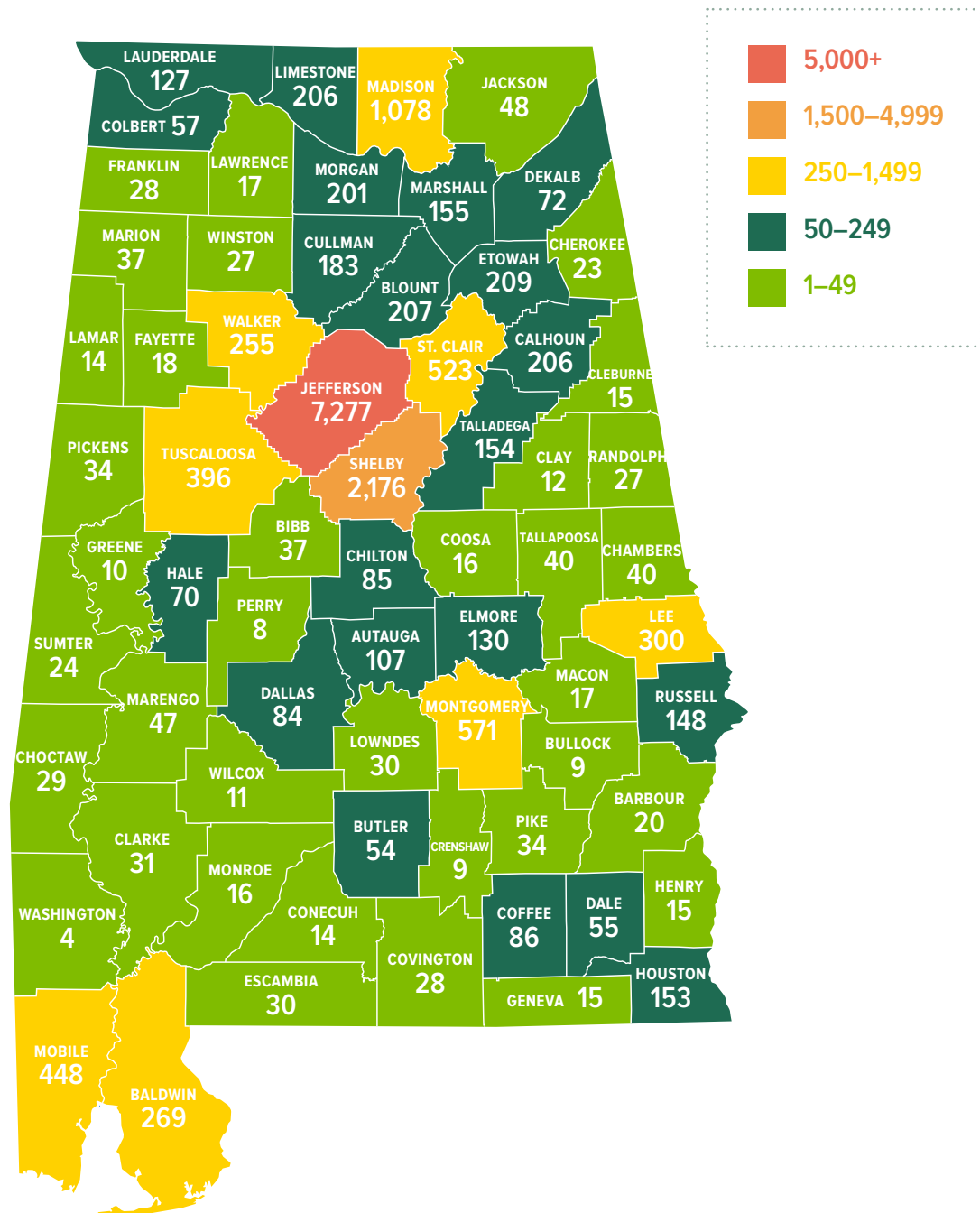

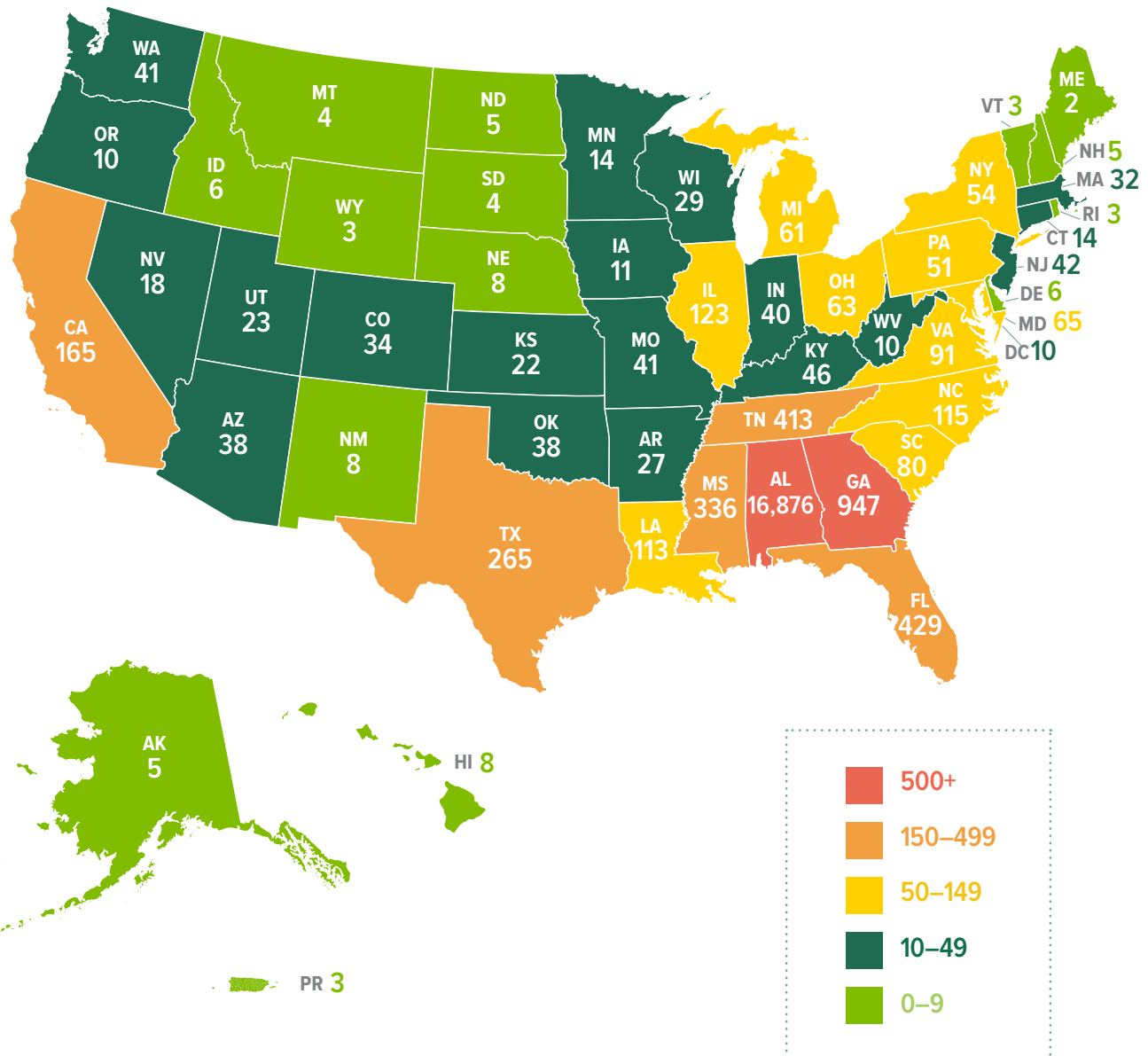

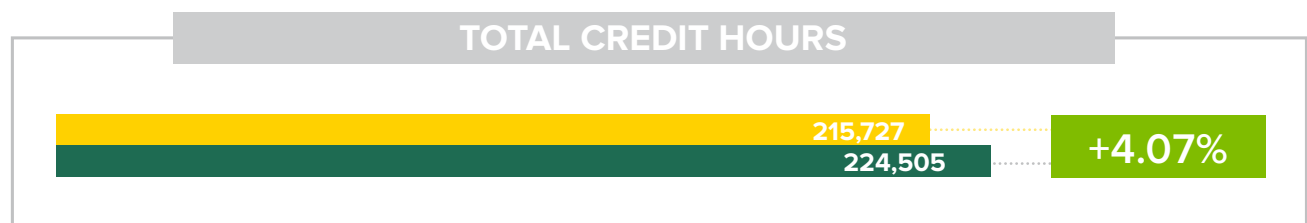
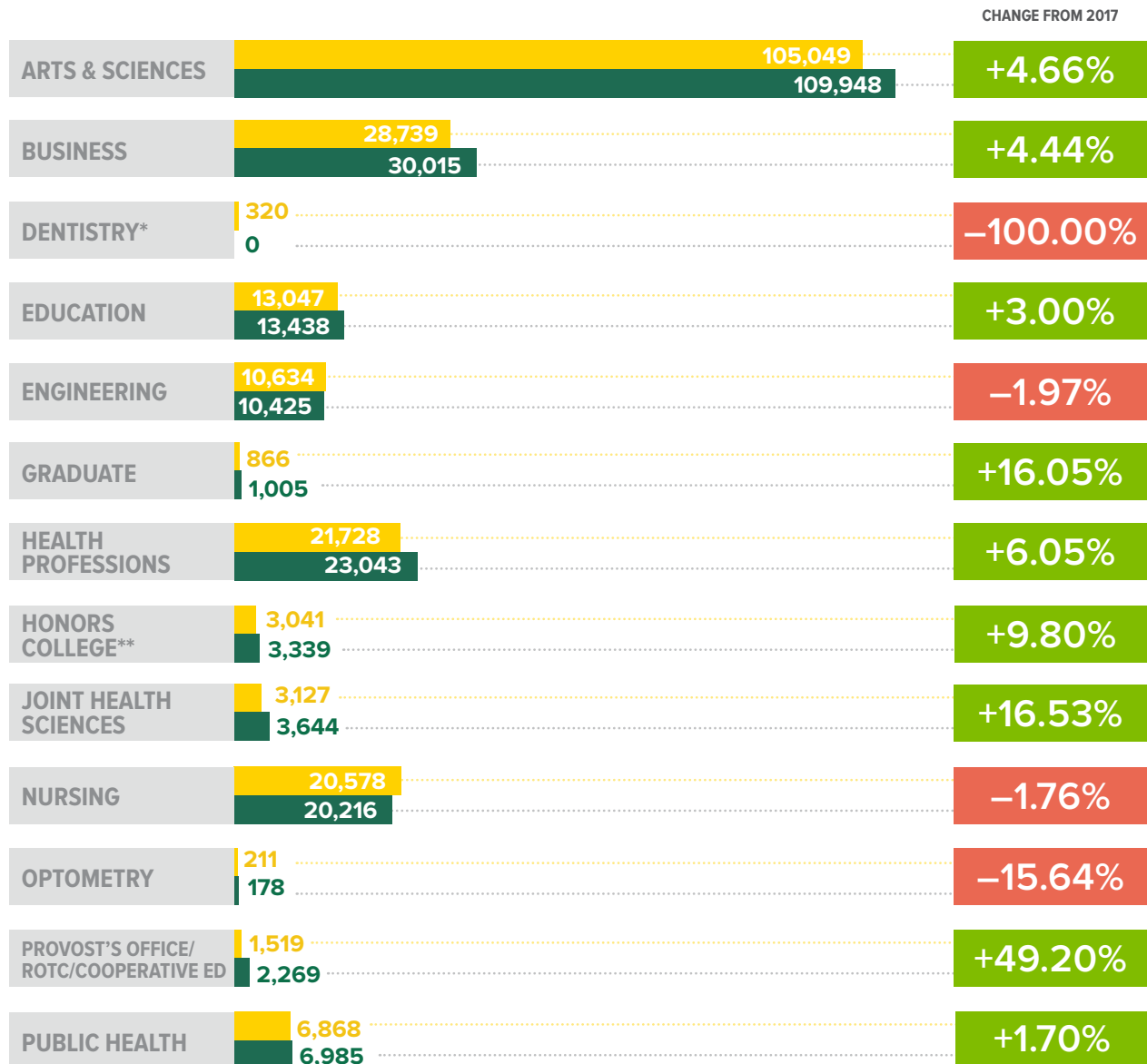

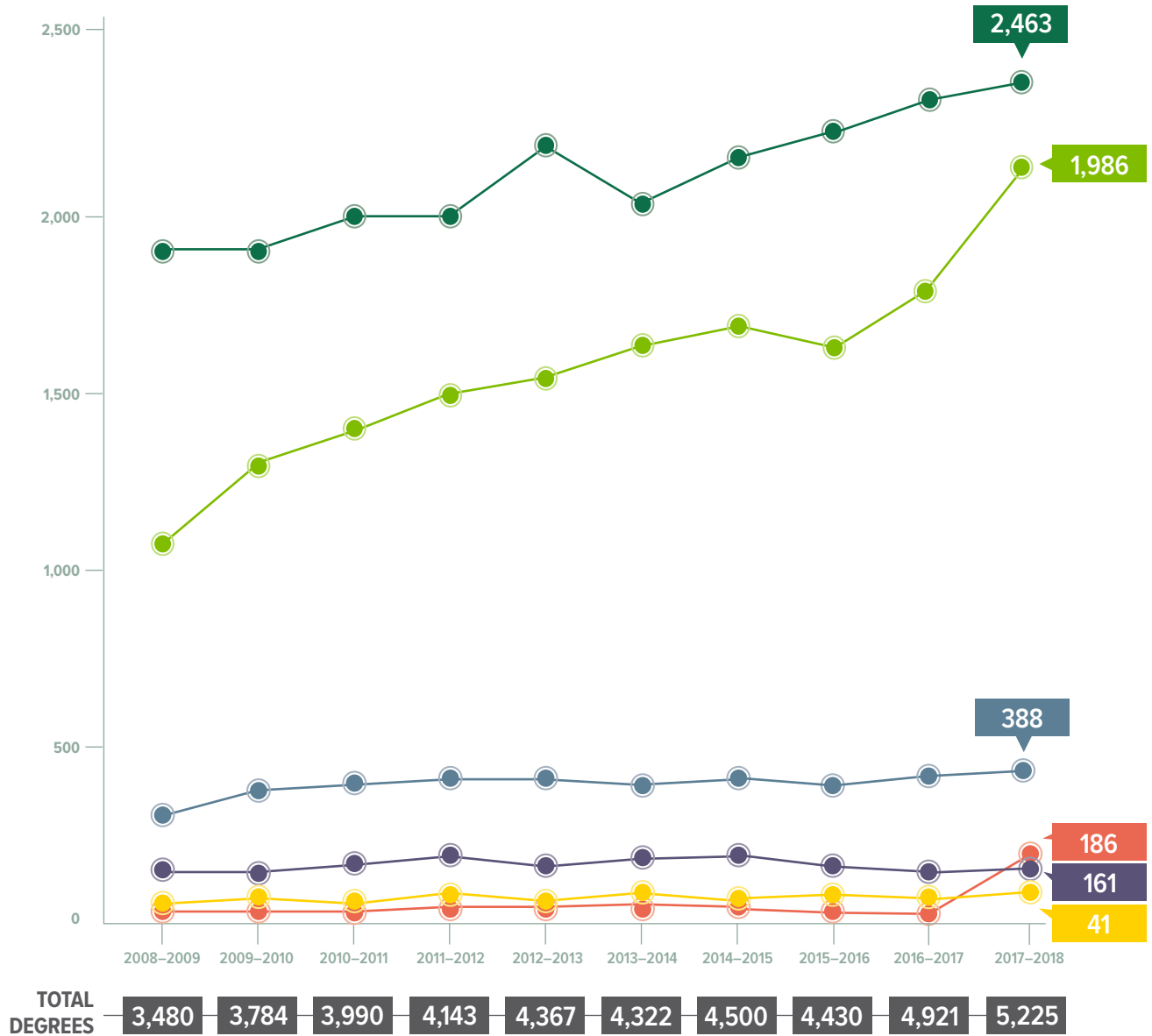

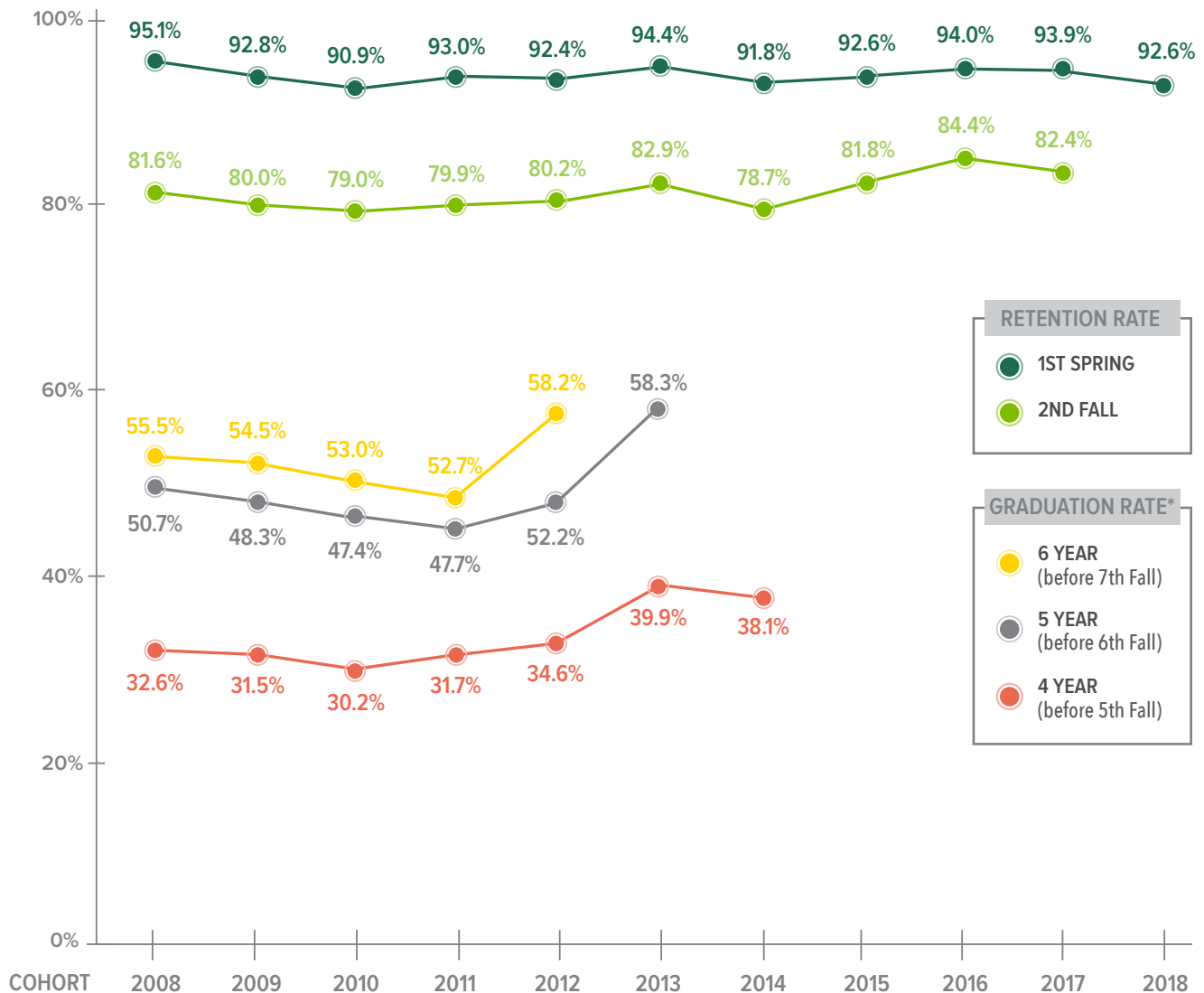

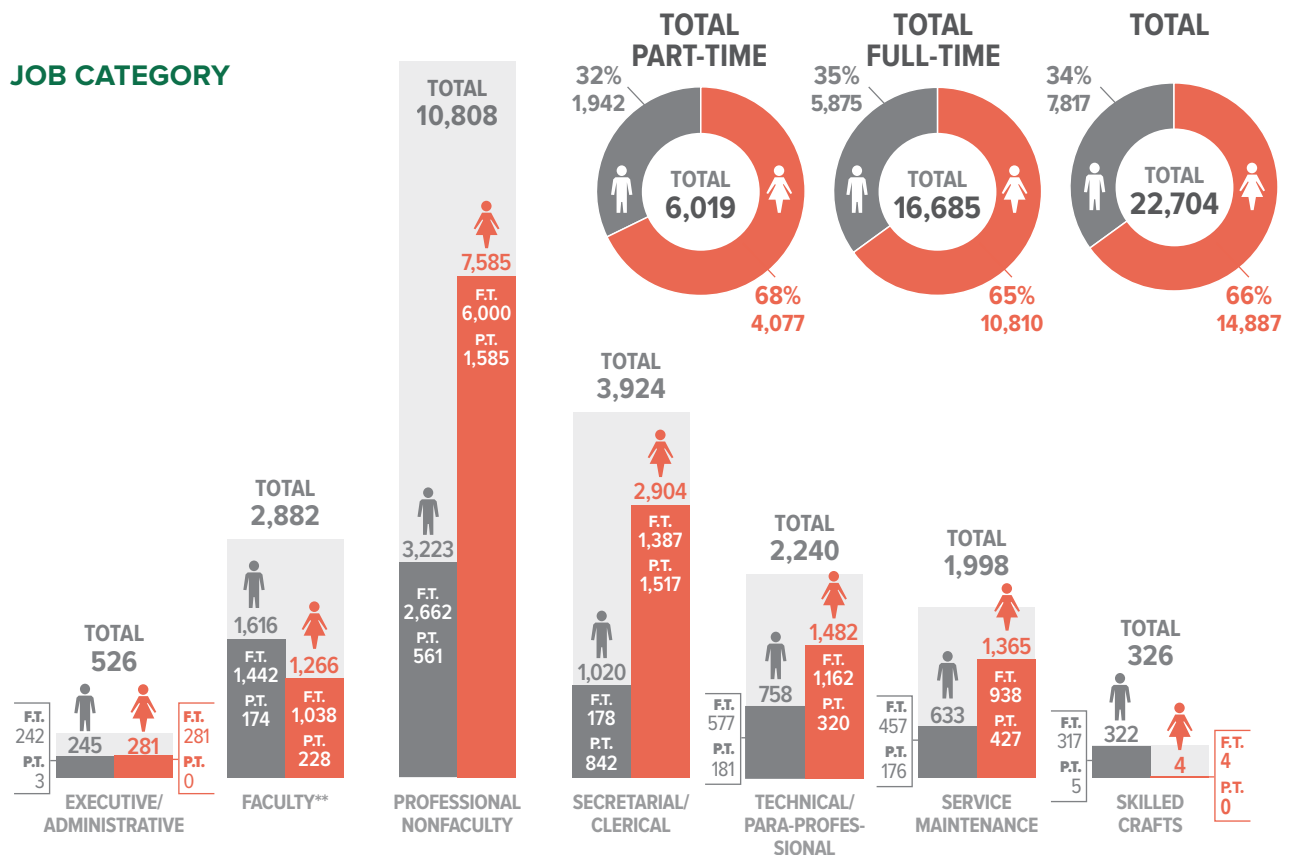

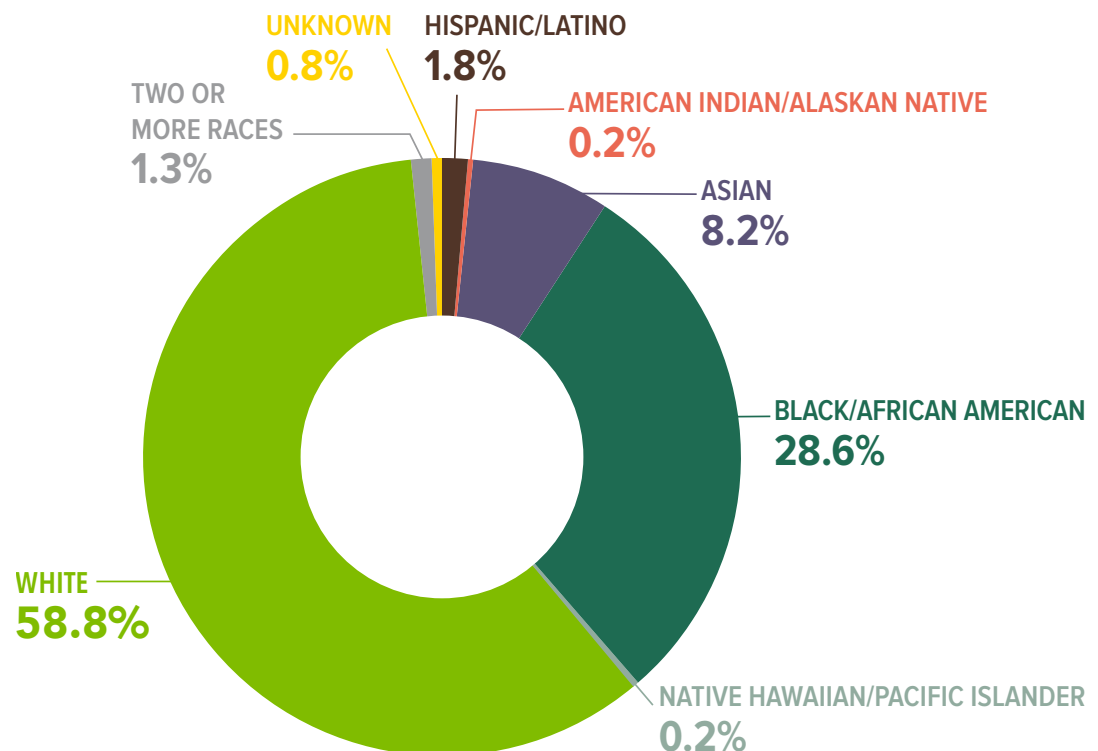

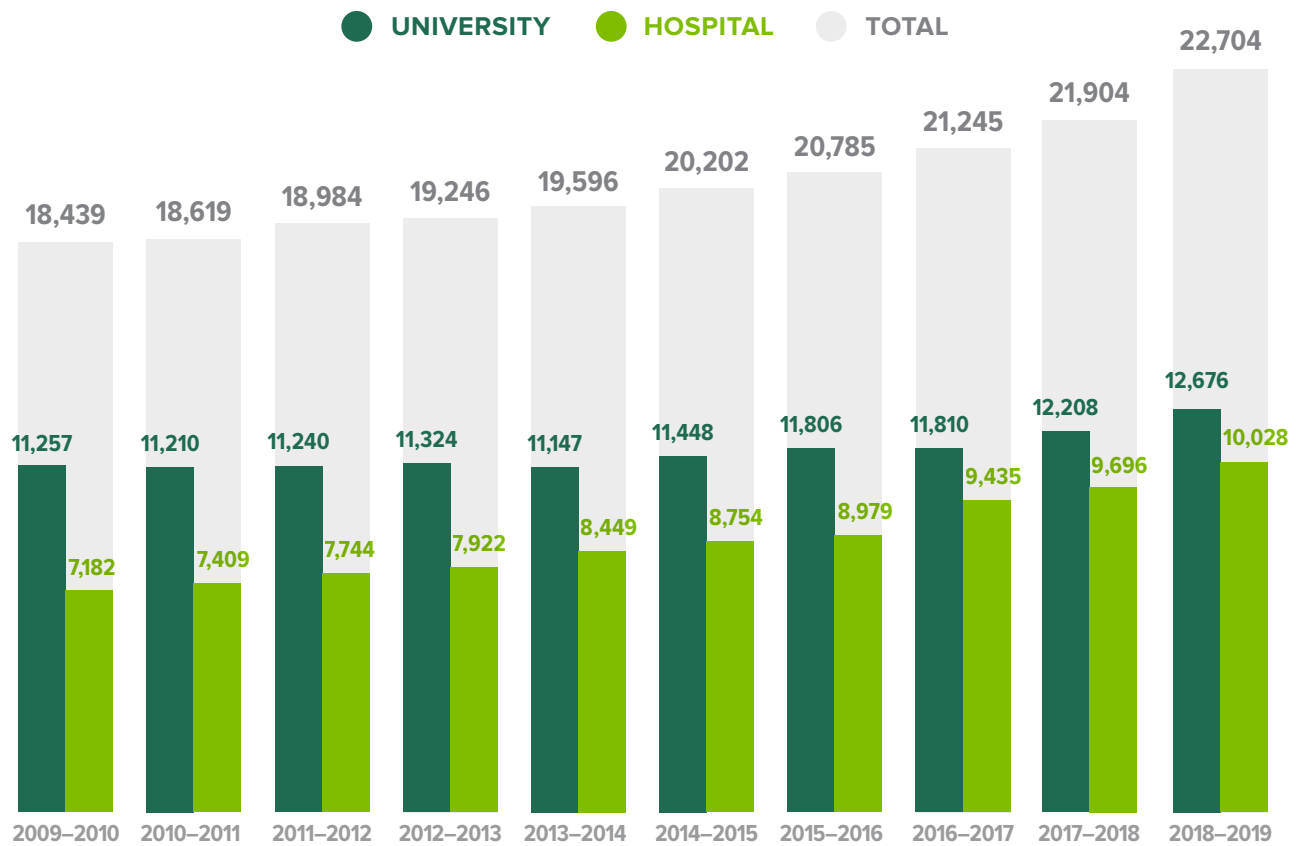

UAB WORK FORCE BY AREA

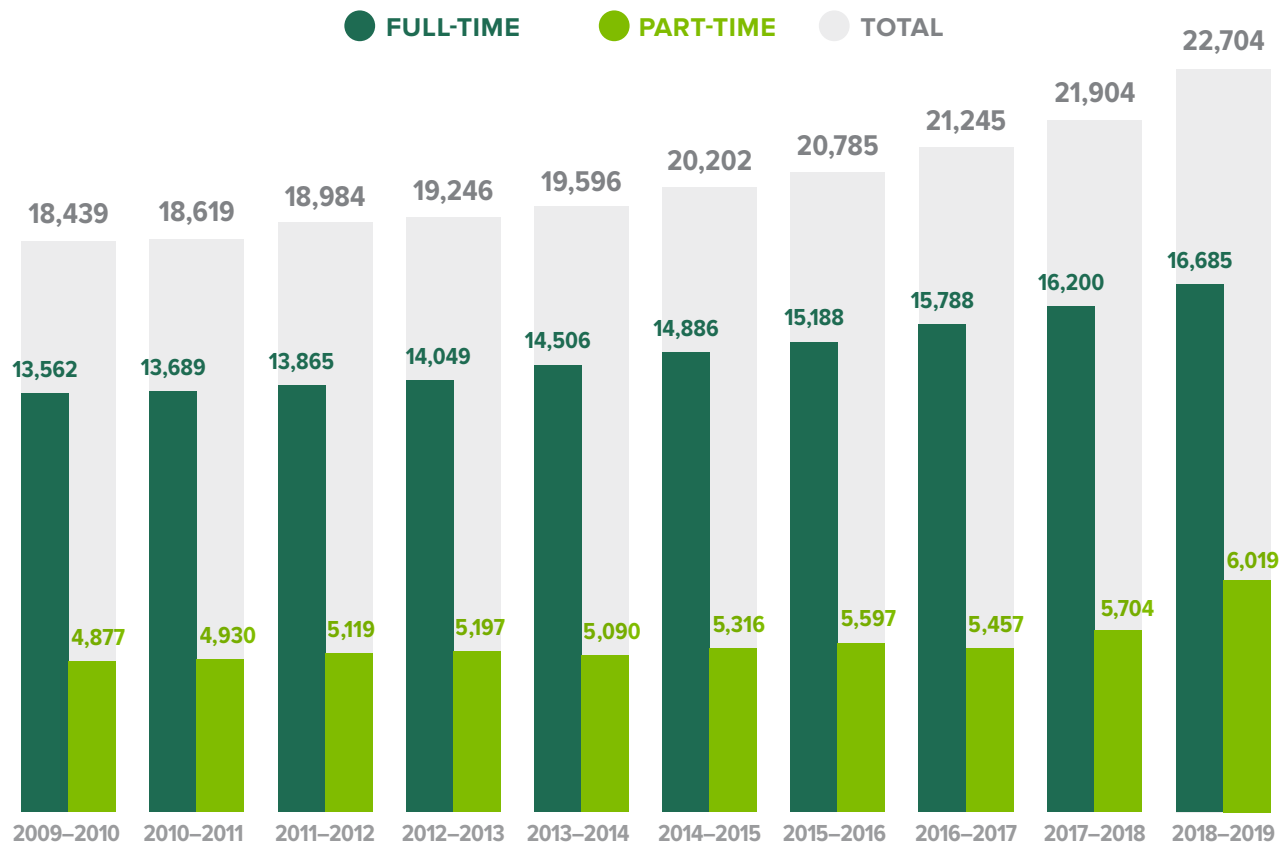
2009–2010 THROUGH 2018–2019

UAB WORK FORCE BY STATUS

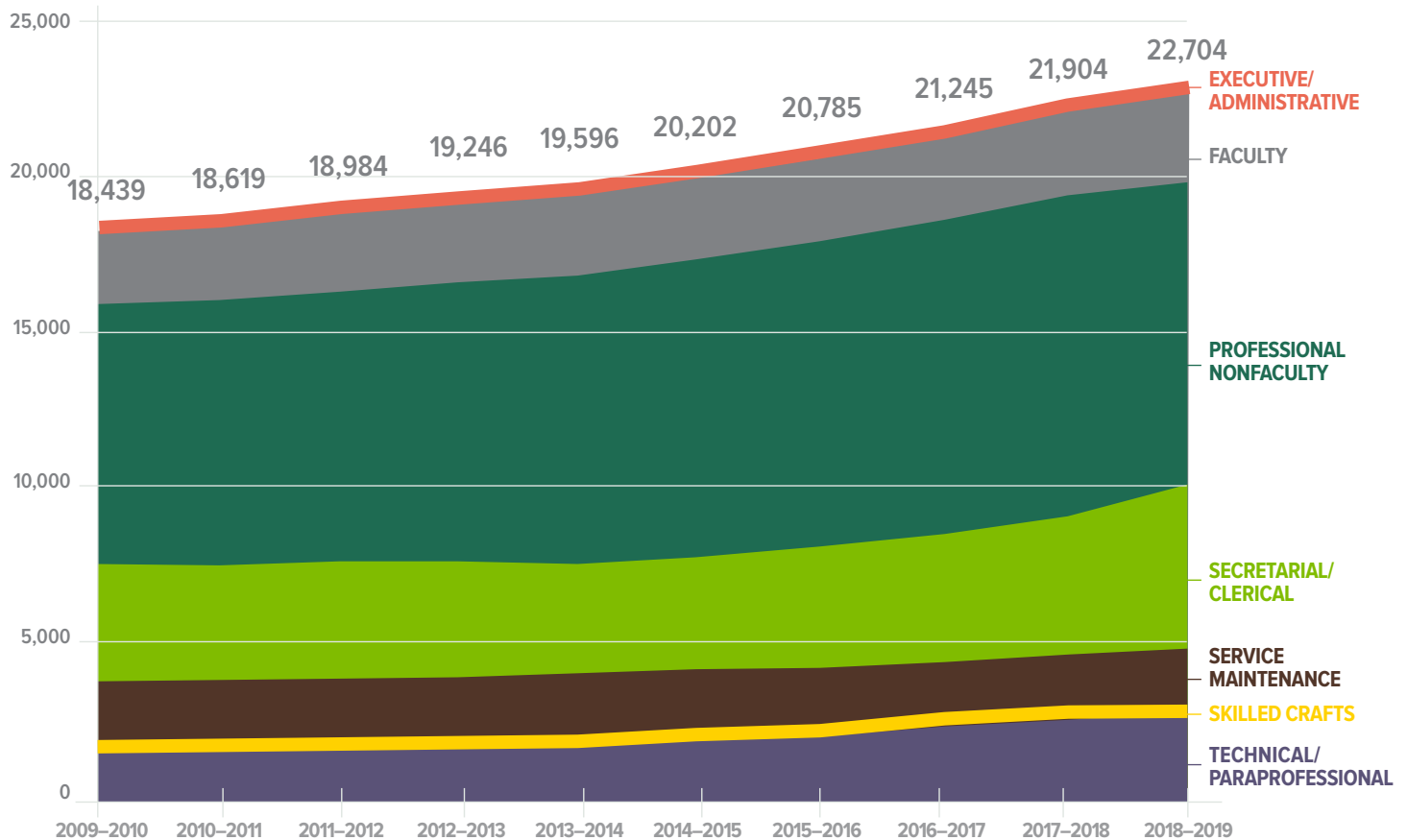

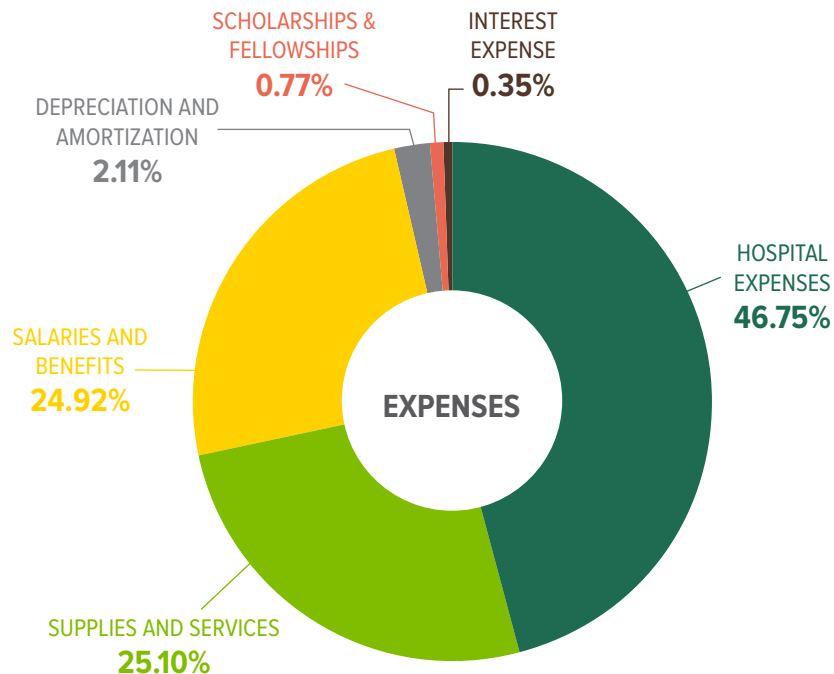
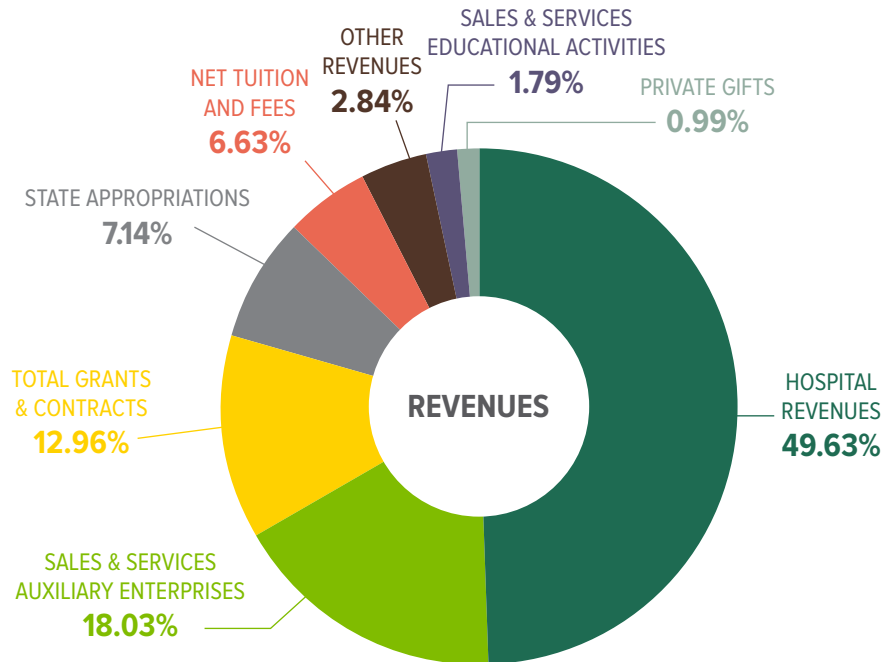

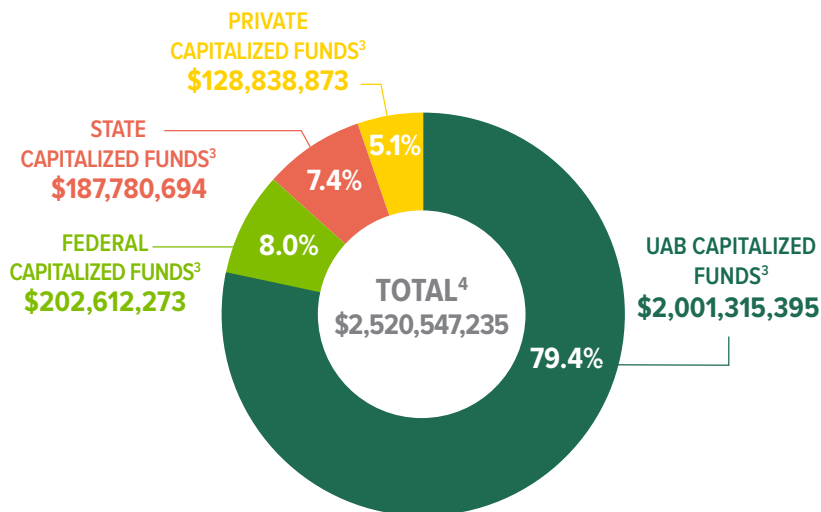
