The movement of people across borders is a central political issue throughout the world. In East, West, North and South, migration has become a controversial issue linked to citizenship, environment, nationalism, and violence. Relying on a variety of visual and non visual texts produced in North Africa and beyond, this course will study notions of home, migrancy, identity and deterritorialization with a particular focus on the frontiers of gender, race, class and sexuality which inform the ongoing debate on immigration. It will also examine migration in relation to the nature and history of global economy and the expanding mobility of capital, labor and systems of representations in a transnational context.
