## UAB Lister Hill Library

The Lister Hill Library's primary mission is to serve the educational, research, and clinical information needs of UAB students, faculty and staff.

Patrons should be aware that under Alabama state law, public display of obscene material is illegal. This applies to computer monitors in public areas.



## Responsibilities of Lister Hill Library Patrons

The Lister Hill Library's primary mission is to serve the educational, research, and clinical information needs of UAB students, faculty, and staff. Members of the general public are welcome to use LHL resources when those uses do not interfere with the education, research, and clinical information purposes of UAB students, faculty, and staff.

If a complaint regarding unacceptable behavior is made by another patron or if unacceptable behavior is observed by a staff person, the patron will be warned (no more than once) or ejected from the library (by UAB Police if necessary).

Non-UAB individuals who are ejected from the library will not be allowed to return. UAB students ejected from the library will be reported to the Assistant Vice President for Student Life and the incident will be handled according to UAB's due process procedures.

*If all public workstations are in use, non-UAB patrons may be told to stop using a workstation if a UAB individual needs to use one.*

**Patrons should be aware that under Alabama state law, public display of obscene material is illegal. This applies to computer monitors in public areas.**



Examples of unacceptable behavior include (but are not necessarily limited to):

- Violation of computer misuse guidelines
- Loud talking (including on cell phones)
- Playing music loud enough to be overheard at the next workstation
- Solicitation
- Vandalism of any sort
- Any violation of general UAB or Lister Hill Library policies and procedures
- Disruptive behavior of any kind
- Leaving bags or other materials unattended
