HIV/AIDS Education Resolution

❖ As required by a 1987 Alabama State Board of Education Resolution, <u>acquired</u> <u>immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS)</u> <u>and human immunodeficiency virus</u> (<u>HIV) education are included</u> as part of the approved health education curriculum in Alabama for students in Grades 5-12.

Sex Education Law

Code of Alabama, 1975, §16-40A-2*

- Identifies minimum content to be included in sex education program or curriculum.
- Emphasize sexual abstinence.
- Statistics based on the <u>latest medical</u> <u>information</u> that indicate the degree of reliability and unreliability of <u>various forms of</u> <u>contraception</u>, while also <u>emphasizing the</u> <u>increase in protection</u> which is afforded by the use of various contraceptive measures.
