RE: RFA Faculty Development for Educators – Immersion Program

The HSF-GEF funded RIME program is pleased to announce a request for applications (RFA) to the Faculty Development for Educators – Immersion Program. The main aim of this RFA is to identify up to three UASOM faculty members to apply to advanced degrees or immersion programs.

Priority will be given to junior or mid level faculty members who have demonstrated a commitment to medical education (undergraduate or graduate level). Priority will also be given to degreegranting programs. At the end of this RFA is a list of potential programs; applicants are not limited to these programs (application is the sole responsibility of the faculty).

The RIME program will provide up to \$10,000 for up to three qualified UASOM Faculty members for one year. Funding from the applicant's home Department is a required element for a successful application. Funding can be in the form of matching funds, or funding equivalent to offset the educational or clinical responsibilities as a result of attending the faculty development program.

A successful application should have the following elements (7 pages maximum):

- 1) **Letter of intent (1-2 pages).** Describe how the funding will advance the educational career of the individual and educational activities at the Department or UASOM. If describing a project or educational innovation, include: background, objective, methods (setting, participants, timeframe, measures, and analytical plan), potential barriers, and significance.
- 2) Bio sketch/CV (2-3 pages). Include main teaching responsibilities, past 5 years.
- 3) **Budget (1 page).** Include costs to be borne by the Department. Funds cannot be used for any other programs and is contingent upon acceptance to the program. Unless an extension is requested, the use of funds expires December 31, 2016. Expenses must conform HSF-GEF guidelines and may be subject to change (travel and salary are not eligible).
- 4) **Letter of support (1page).** Letters can be from Department Chair or immediate supervisor and should include: **a)** funding support, **b)** protected time to attend meetings and complete the assignments, and **c)** level of enthusiasm.

Selected individuals commit to:

- a) Present one workshop at a future RIME week program (past programs: <u>http://www.uab.edu/medicine/gim/education-summit</u>),
- b) Mentor one UASOM Primary Care Scholar on a scholarly project, and
- c) Report the results of a medical education project at a future RIME week program.
