

Faculty Positions in Microbiology

The Department of Microbiology at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) (www.uab.edu/medicine/microbiology) invites applications for multiple tenure track or tenured faculty positions in microbiology. Candidates studying mucosal pathogens or commensal microbiota are particularly encouraged to apply. Successful candidates, who have demonstrated records of originality and productivity in research, will be provided with a highly competitive startup package and salary.

The Department of Microbiology includes a collegial group of scientists whose research focuses on microbial and viral pathogens as well as the immune system that controls these pathogens. UAB and the Department are leaders in NIH funding and medical research. Collaborations among basic scientists and between basic and clinical faculty are a strength of UAB and are stimulated by multidisciplinary centers such as the Center for AIDS Research, Comprehensive Cancer Center, Center for Structural Biology, Center for Clinical and Translational Sciences and Center for Emerging Infectious Diseases. Other critical research support includes a campus-wide Program in Immunology, a world-class BSL3/ABSL3 facility, and a collaborative drug discovery program with the neighboring Southern Research Institute.
