



School of Nursing Faculty Positions

Candidates for faculty positions with expertise in Adult Health and Care-giving, Gerontology, Psychiatric/Mental Health, Acute or Critical Care, Community, Nursing Administration and Health Systems, Maternal-Child, Pediatrics, and Family Health are encouraged to apply. Faculty may elect different degrees of emphasis on the teaching, service and scholarship components of the faculty role. Rank, tenure, and salary are competitive and commensurate with professional background and experience.
