

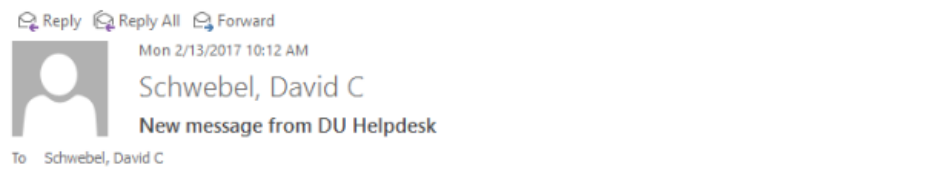


Tuesday Tip

Something's Phishy

Phishing emails (the ones that are attempting to steal your information) can be hard to spot. Others might be obvious. When in doubt, do these three things:

- #1 Check for spelling and/or grammatical errors. If you find some, proceed with caution.
- #2 Before you click on a link in an email, hover over the link. A box will pop up over the link that will show you the web address. If it looks phishy, proceed to step #3.

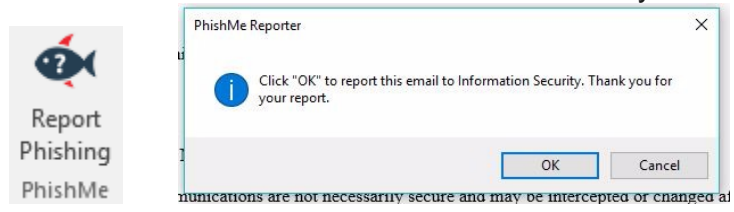
