Call for abstracts 2008 Purdue-UAB Botanicals Symposium March 3, 2008

All participants in the Symposium are invited to submit abstracts for presentations as posters during this one-day meeting at UAB. There is no fee for submission and all submissions will be presented during the session. If you wish to present a poster, please submit it to C.J. Krueger as detailed below. **All abstracts are due on February 1 at 12:00 noon.**

All participants are encouraged to present a poster of their recent research. To insure that we have appropriate space available, all poster abstracts must be submitted by the deadline. We encourage all speakers, project and core leaders and pilot grant recipients to present a poster at the meeting. All abstracts that are submitted by the deadline will be published in the proceedings of the Symposium, which will document the progress of the center.

Please submit the abstract electronically as **WORD** documents to CJ Krueger (kruegerc@purdue.edu) according to the following guidelines:

- 1. Use 12 point Arial font and 1 inch margins.
- 2. The total length of the abstract text, not including authors and title, should be 200 words or less.
- 3. The title should be no more than 75 letters and characters, and it should provide a straightforward description of the important findings. The title should be **bolded** and in initial capitals case.
- 4. List all authors (last name and initials) followed by their departmental and university affiliation (see below). The name of the presenting author should be underlined, and his/her e-mail address should follow the general address.
- 5. The text should begin on a new line and provide descriptions of the biomedical problem addressed, the methods used, the results found and your conclusions.

Your total submission length should not exceed 24 lines.
