If such students completed an empirical master's thesis as part of their master's program then they are not required to complete a master's thesis in our program. Fellowships, Assistantships, Tuition and Fee Remission

Support in Year 1:	All incoming students receive a Blazer Graduate Research Fellowship, another fellowship, or a research assistantship. All funding mechanisms include an annual stipend of \$28,000 plus full coverage of tuition and fees, as well as individual health insurance if the UAB student plan is selected.
Support in Years 2-5:	Full support (stipend, required tuition, and individual health insurance) is guaranteed up to the end of Year 5, contingent on the student continuing to make at least adequate progress. Support usually takes the form of a traineeship/fellowship or a research, clinical or teaching assistantship. All forms of support include a training component and assistantships also include a service component. The guaranteed annual stipend continues at \$28,000, and required tuition, fees and insurance continue to be covered as in Year 1. Average stipends are greater than \$28,000, and stipends are increased to at least \$29,500 beginning in the term after the student is admitted to doctoral candidacy, which requires approval of the dissertation proposal by the dissertation committee and the IRB. Students also receive financial incentives for applying for and receiving external pre-doctoral fellowships (e.g., from NIH or NSF), and internal grants are also available.
Support beyond Year 5:	Most students are supported by funded internships in Year 6. Funding from the internship site generally includes both a stipend and individual health insurance. No tuition is charged to students on internship. Students who remain in residence at UAB beyond their 5 th year are typically supported by assistantships, fellowships, or traineeships full support including tuition, fees and health insurance is not guaranteed.
Support for Students from Under-represented Groups:	The Medical / Clinical Psychology Graduate Program is committed to increasing diversity among students and professionals in our field. To advance that goal we assist students from under-represented groups in applying for intramural and extramural awards that provide enhanced support relative to funding that is already guaranteed in our program.
