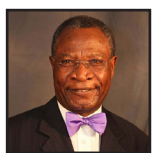

Cohosted by CCTS Partners Tuskegee University and UAB, this event aims to bring together researchers and bioethicists to discuss special challenges in population-based genetic and genomic research, with a special emphasis on ethical questions around return of results to research participants. Speakers will share lessons learned from the Alabama Genomic Health Initiative (AGHI) and Southern All of Us. The program will include consideration of historical experience with return of results, discussion of the role of trust and trustworthiness on compassionate and effective return of results, and practical insights gained by research navigators, genetic counselors, and study subjects.
