Did You Know?

The Alabama Genomic Health Initiative (AGHI), one of the nation's first statewide efforts to harness the power of genomic analysis to help identify those at risk for 59 actionable diseases due to genetic abnormalities, has released an annual report for its first fiscal year in action (2016-17). Among its many achievements, including extensive strategic planning, a CCTS bioethics-guided consent process, and a successful launch, AGHI has recruited more than 1,000 participants--10% of the eventual goal of 10,000. In 2018, the initiative will move on from Birmingham to recruit in new cities, including Huntsville, Montgomery, Selma, Tuscaloosa, and Mobile.






