NIH Releases 40+ Fast-Track HEAL FOAs--Apply Soon!

The NIH Helping to End Addiction Long-term (HEAL) funding opportunities posted over the past few weeks offer translational researchers from across the T-spectrum (T0-T4) a new source of support for discovery research, preclinical development, clinical trials, implementation/dissemination studies, and technology development or commercialization. The catch? Most have short application windows (i.e., late January-early February deadlines) and specialized submission criteria (e.g., all applicants to RFA-NS-19-021, which will fund pain-related comparative effectiveness clinical trials, must include a letter of support from CCTS). 


