Did You Know?

Many investigators have experienced the "CCTS bump" after participating in a Panel Done Quickly (PDQ), in which CCTS assembles a peer group to review a grant application prior to submission. Fewer are aware of our Nascent Project Panel (NPP), which focuses on the conception stage of a study. In addition to fine tuning hypotheses, aims, and protocols, the CCTS NPP can help early stage investigators connect with faculty and other potential collaborators, find pilot funding, and navigate critical career junctures, such as the K to R transition. Request an NPP and let CCTS assemble a multidisciplinary team of experts who will help you make your science shine--and jumpstart your research career. More


