#### Did You Know?



Do you have or anticipate having an NIH training grant by Oct. 2019? If so, you may want to check out the NIH eRA Commons' xTRACT system, which enables the creation of research training data tables used for tracking trainee outcomes. A recent NIH *Extramural Nexus* post suggests xTRACT will be required for research performance progress reports (RPPRs) with training data tables as of Oct. 1, 2019, and for all T32, TL1, T90/R90, and T15 application submissions on or after Jan. 25, 2020. NIH has enhanced xTRACT features to allow batch uploading for faculty and trainee data and to accept the uploading of non-NIH funding sources from internal institutional systems. **More**

#### **CCTS Presents at Medical Grand Rounds**


