

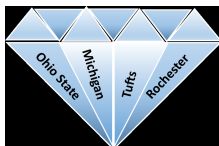

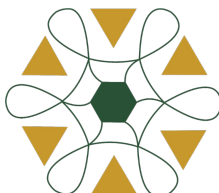

The project, a collaboration involving four Hubs including University of Michigan and Ohio State, Rochester, and Tufts universities, aims to provide a sustainable, federated database that ensures consistency in measures of competency across the workforce.
