The **Clinical Research Forum (CRF)** is accepting nominations for the 2019 Top Ten Clinical Research Achievement Awards. The Awards, which will be presented at the National Press Club in Washington, DC, on March 5, honor outstanding achievements in clinical research and seek to identify major advances in the biomedical field resulting from the nation's investment in health and welfare. Every nominated paper must address findings from a study that utilized human subjects, tissues, or cells; was conducted at a U.S. institution; and was published in a peer-review journal between November 1, 2017, and January 1, 2019 (a letter or email confirming a publication date prior to Jan. 1 will be accepted). Three studies will receive additional recognition and cash awards. All winners will be invited to present at the Translational Science 2019 meeting March 6-9, also in DC.
