Please download, complete, and sign <u>USCIS Form I-539</u> and return it to us at your earliest convenience along with the following documents as checks, as relevant.

PLEASE NOTE: Forms I-539 and I-765 cannot be expedited. Since March 11, 2019, USCIS has refused to process dependents' I-539 applications on an expedited timeline when the H-1B spouse's petition is filed with premium processing. Therefore, even though your spouse's H-1B petition may be approved within 15 calendar days, USCIS processing times for I-539 dependent petitions are currently around 4-5 months. You can always check USCIS processing times here: https://egov.uscis.gov/processing-times/ (select Form I-539 and the California Service Center). USCIS will not speak to UAB ISSS representatives about pending I-539 applications because we are the employer and are not related to or authorized representatives of employees' family members. If you wish to contact USCIS about your pending application, please feel free to do so at any time. The I-539 and I-765 applications are personal to you and have nothing to do with UAB. Your biometric appointment notice and I-539 approval notice(s) will arrive via US Mail at the home address you provide on Form I-539. They will not come to the UAB ISSS office.
