DISCHARGES BY PATIENT ORIGIN



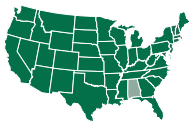

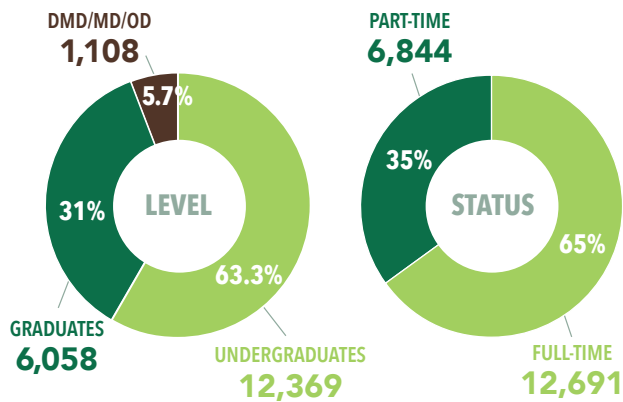

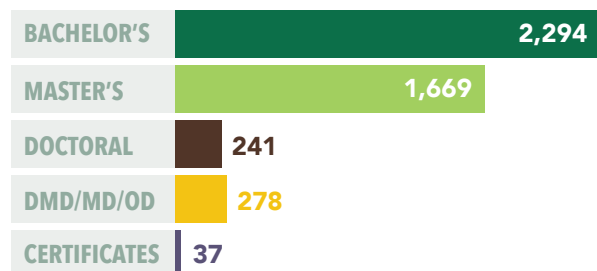

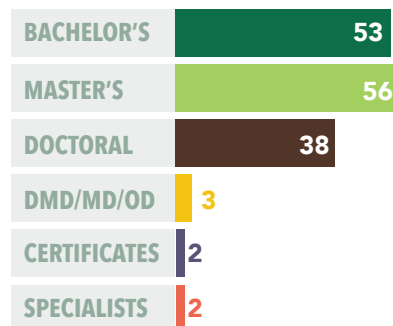

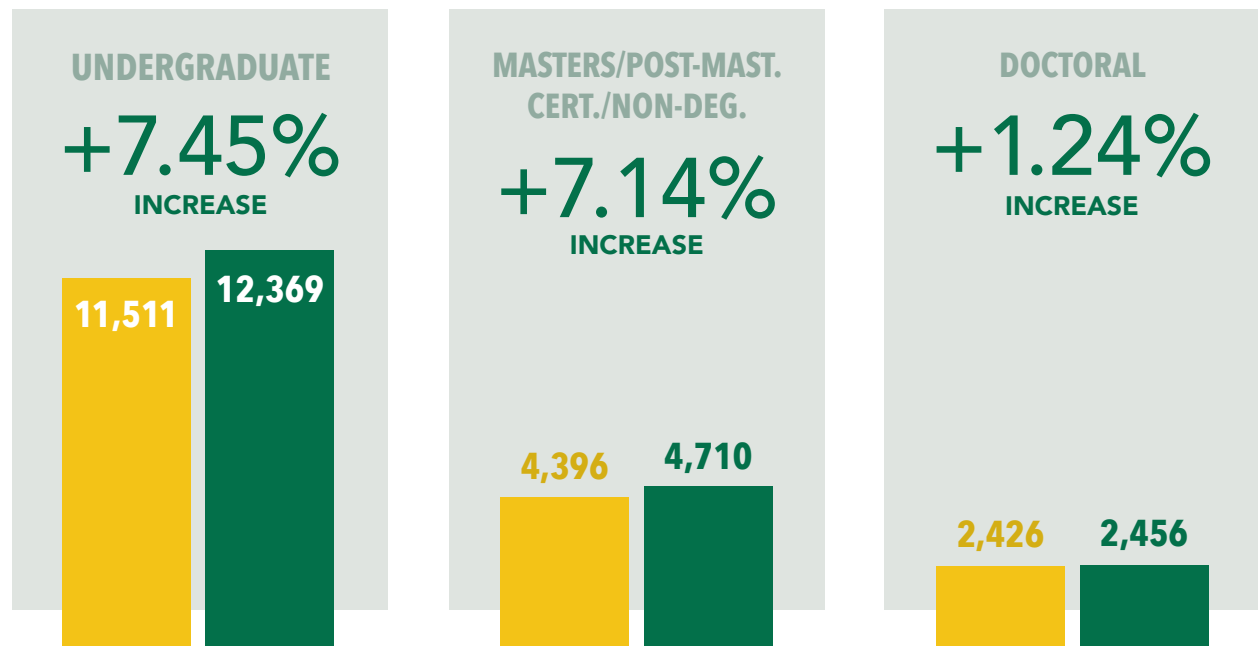

FALL 2016

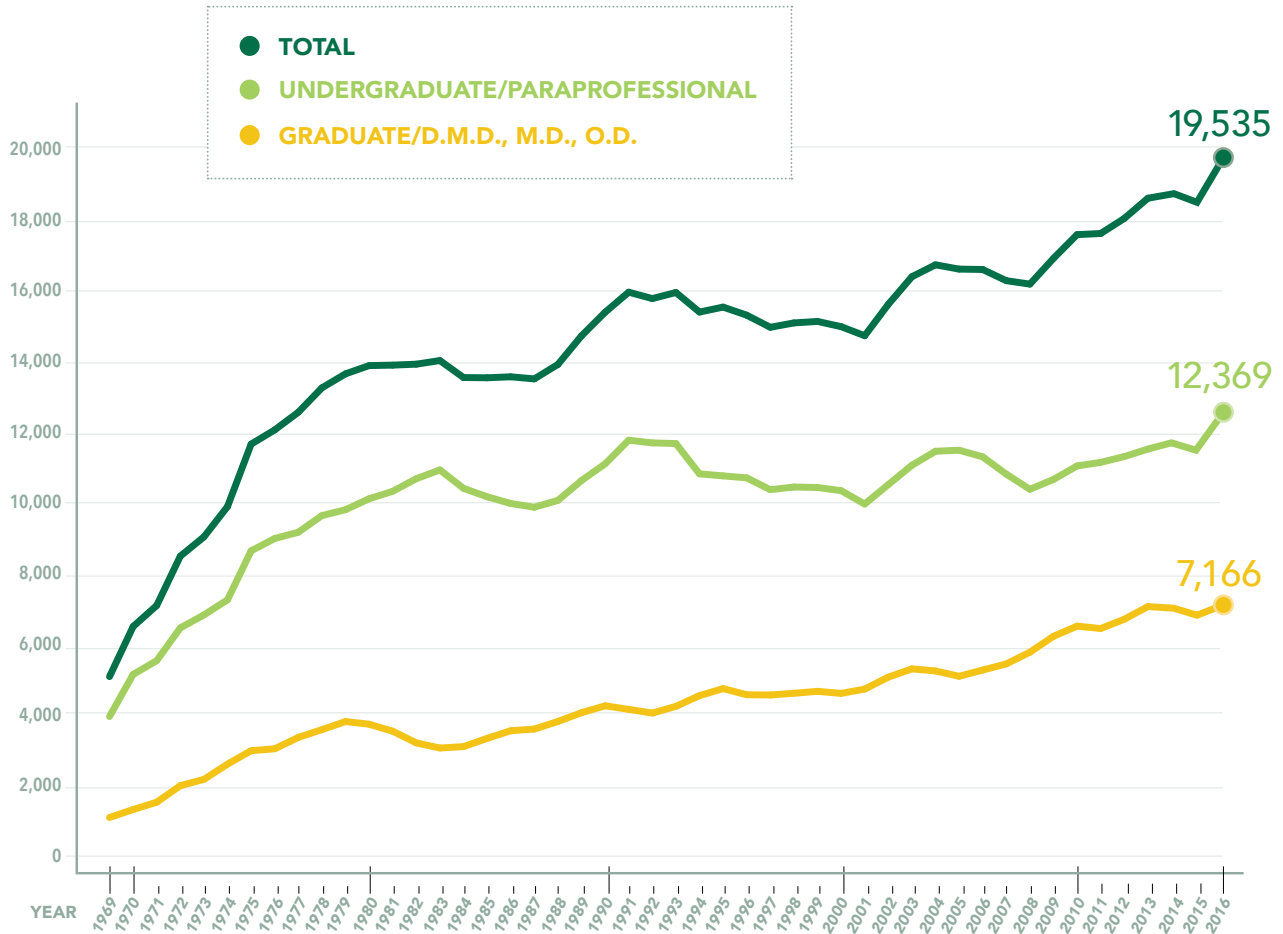
TOTAL ENROLLMENT

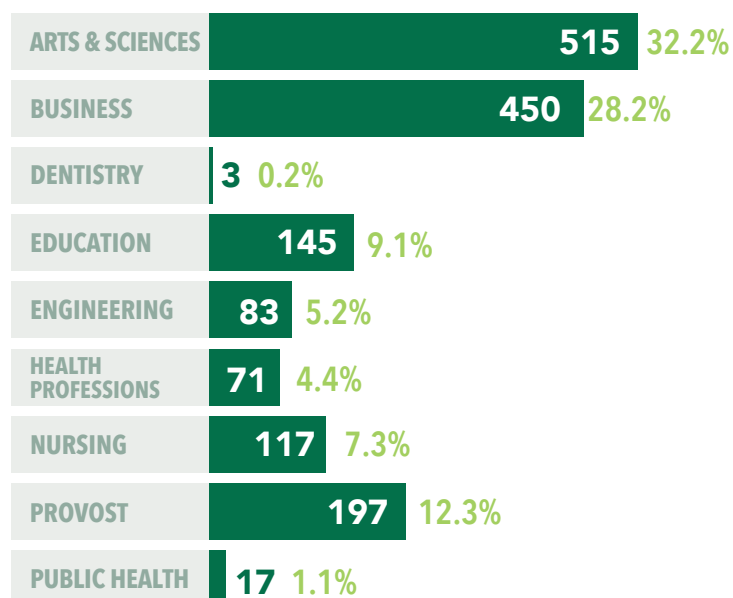

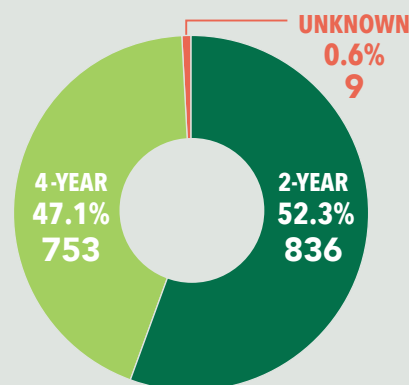

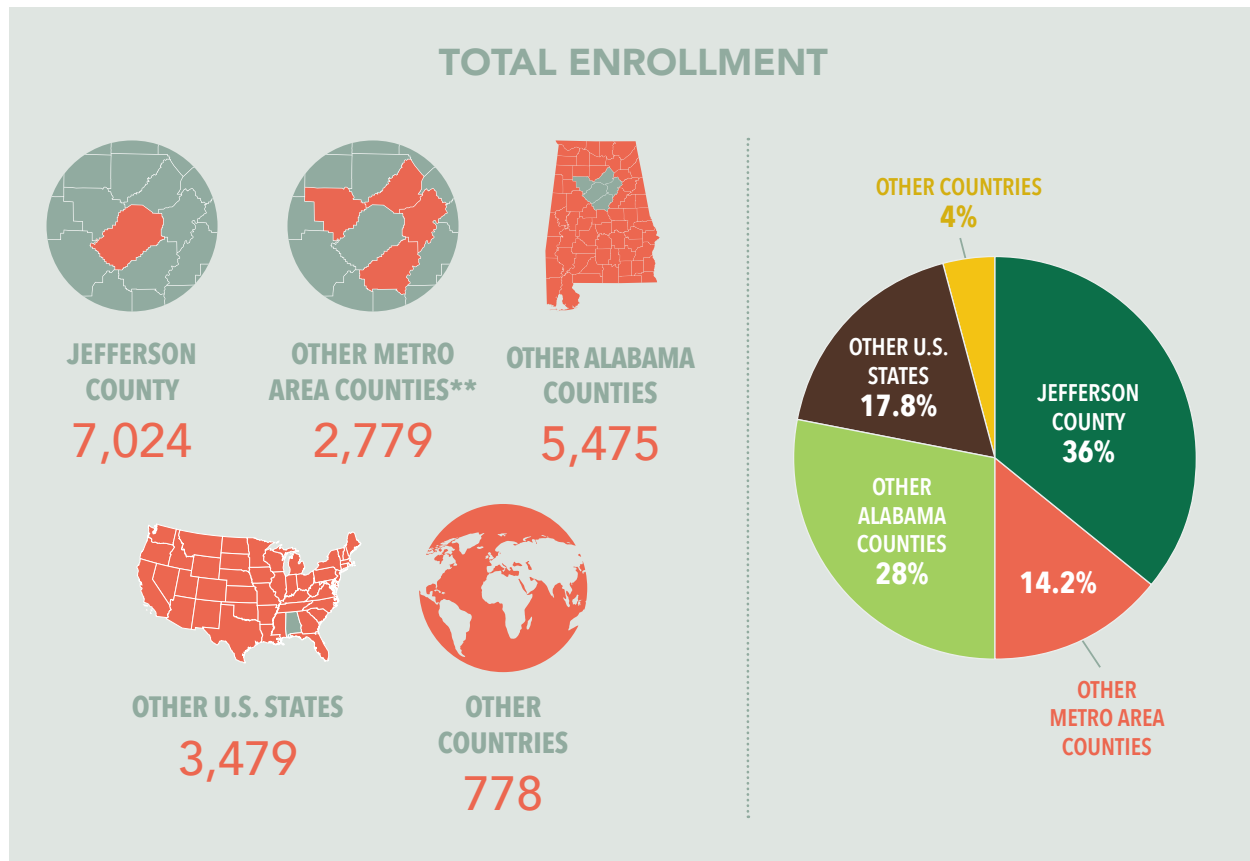

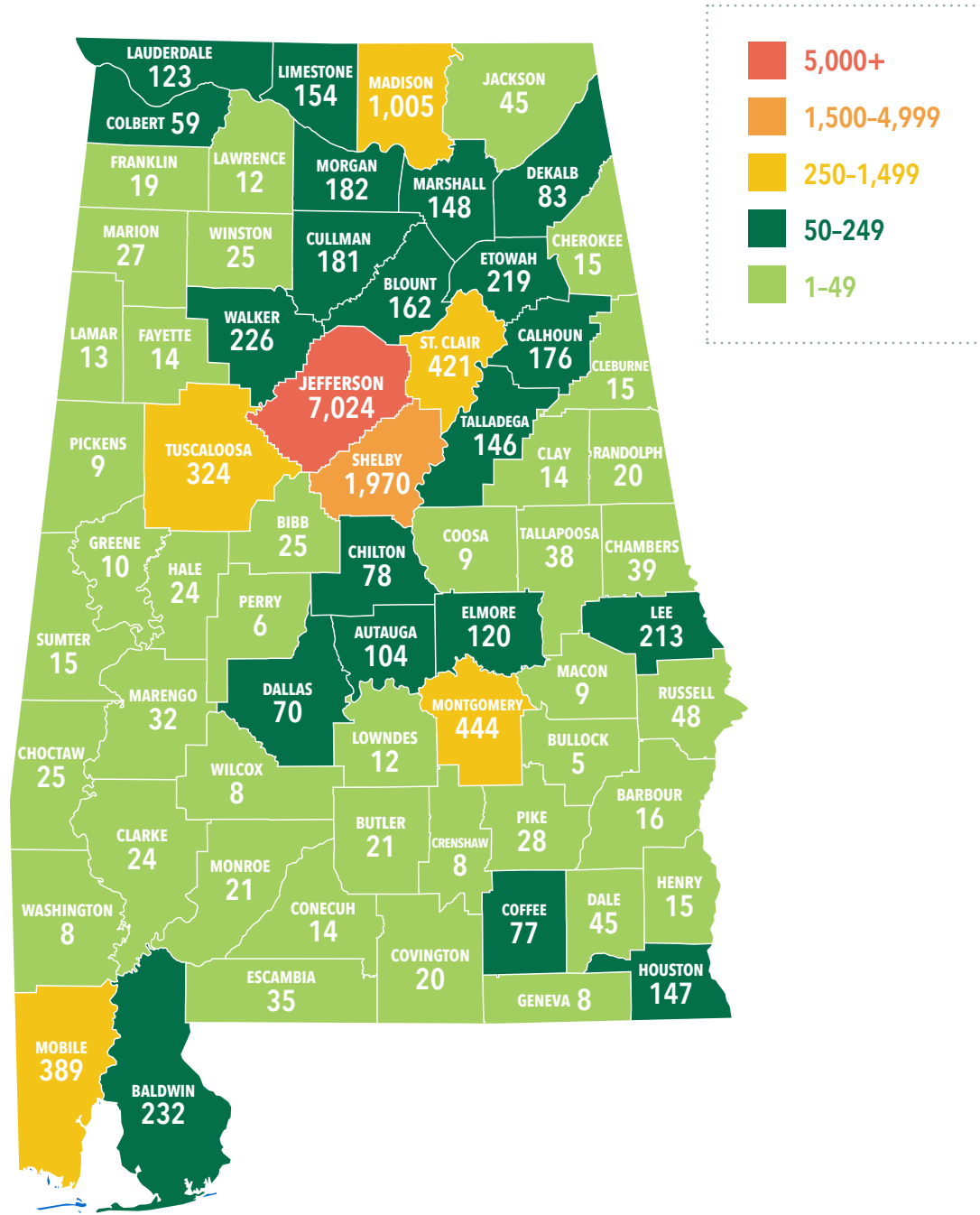

FALL 2016

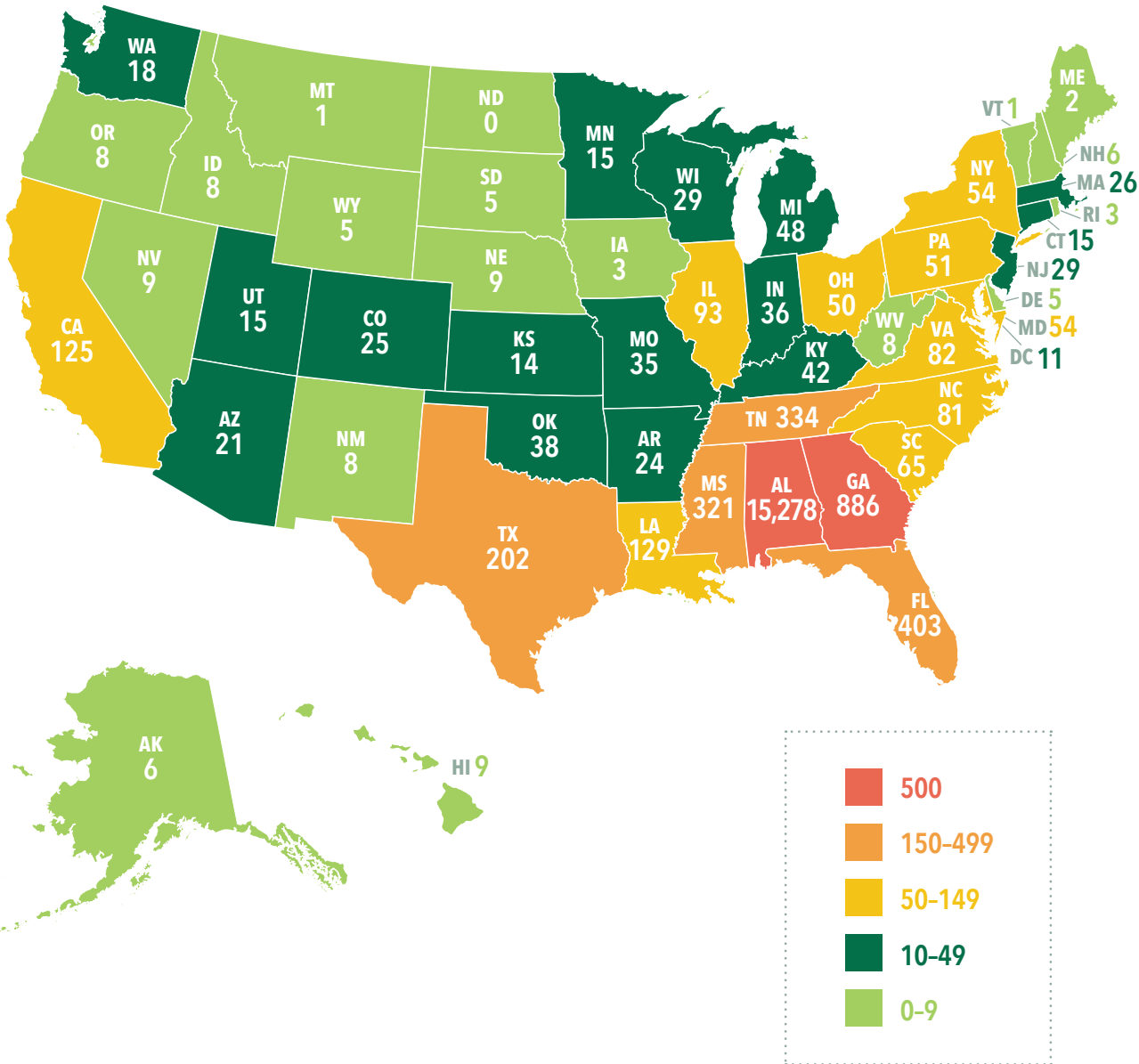

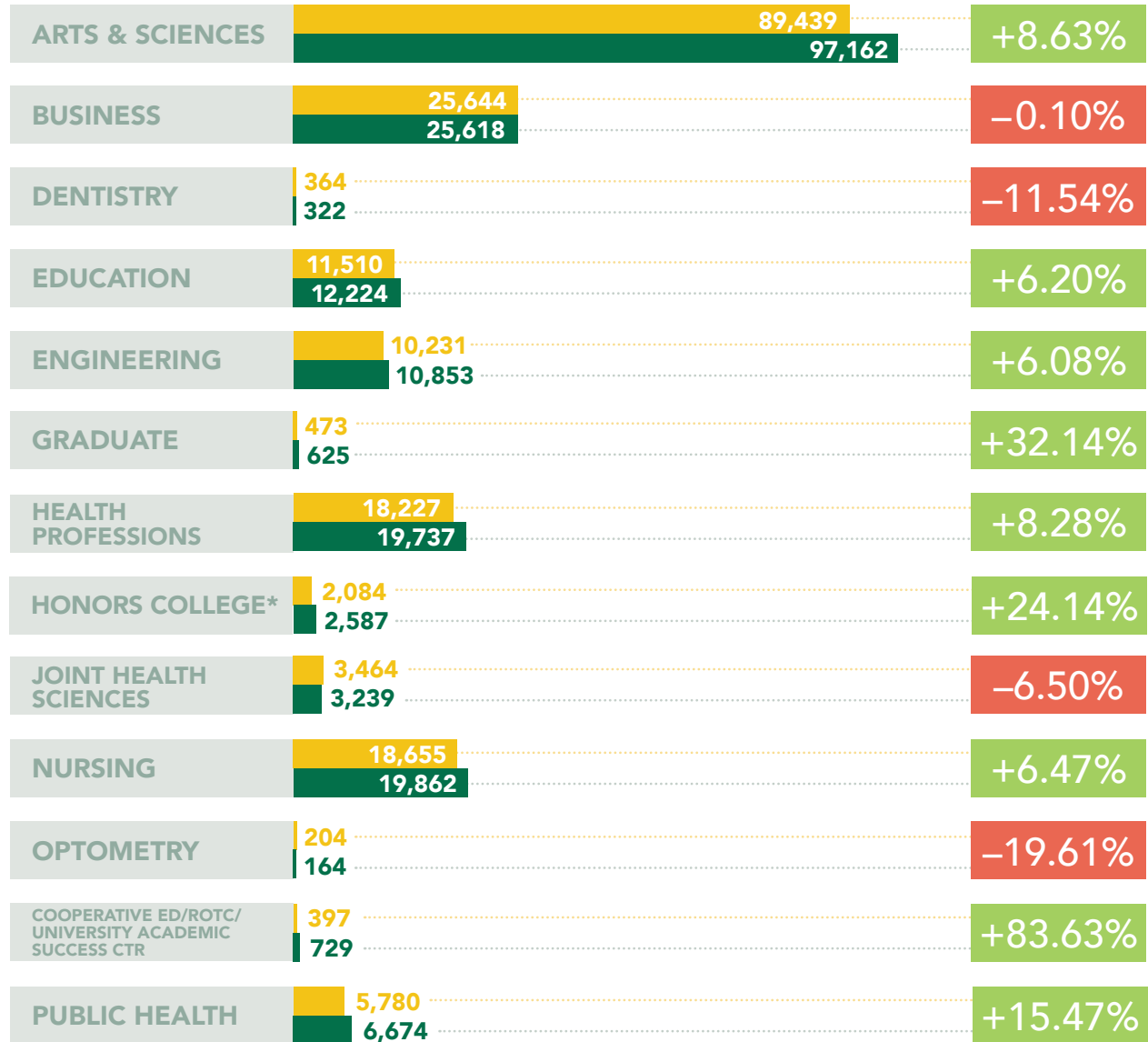

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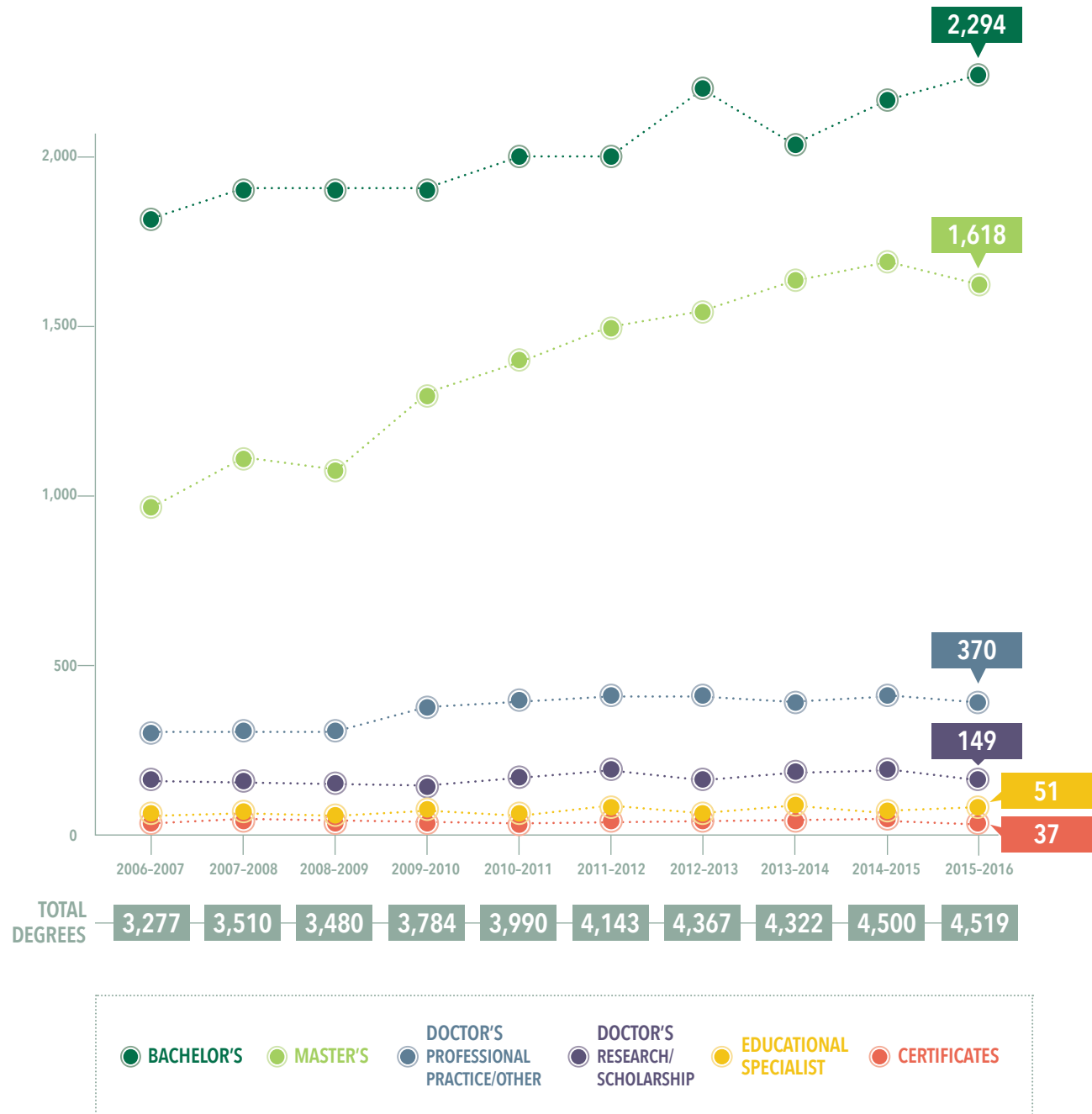

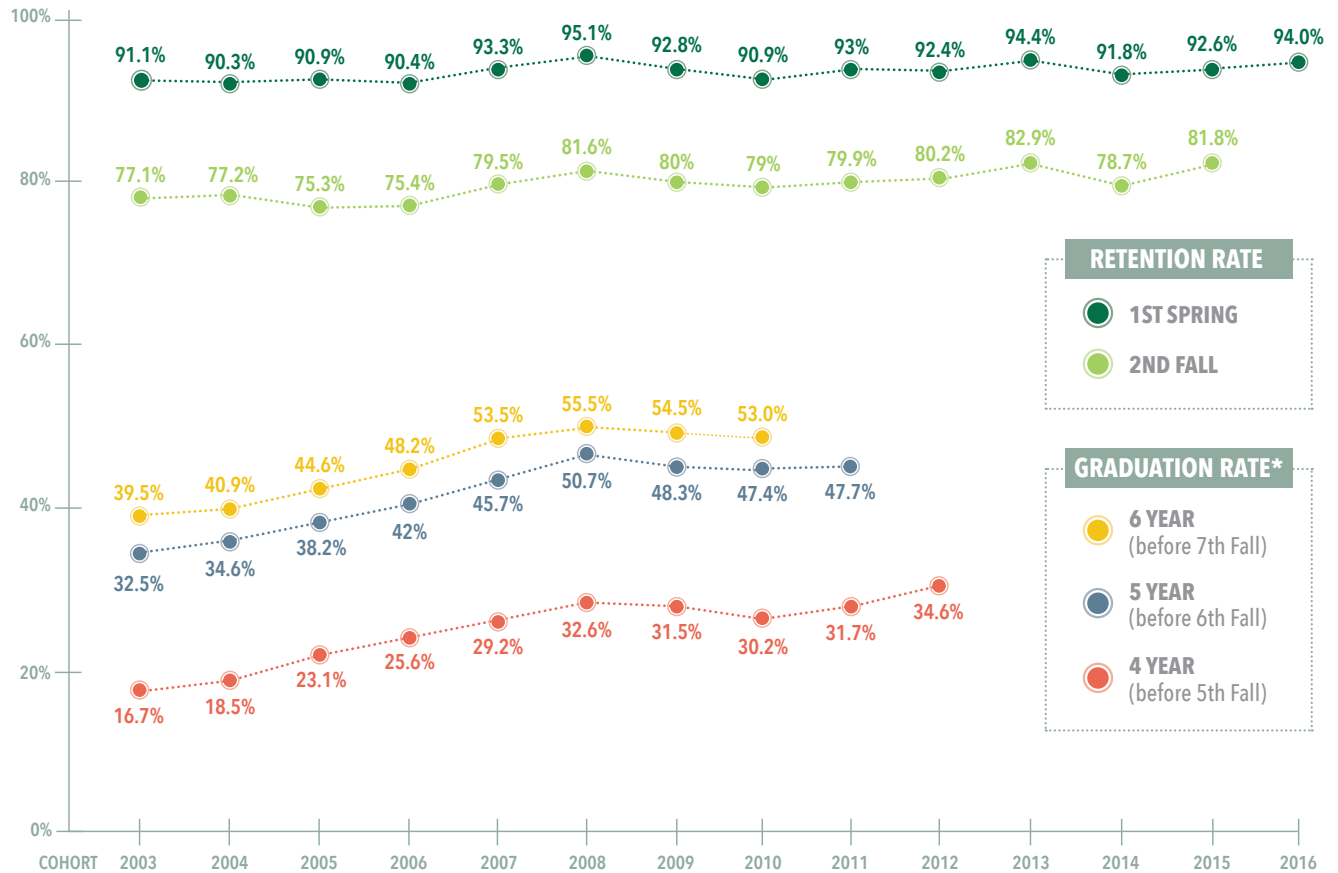

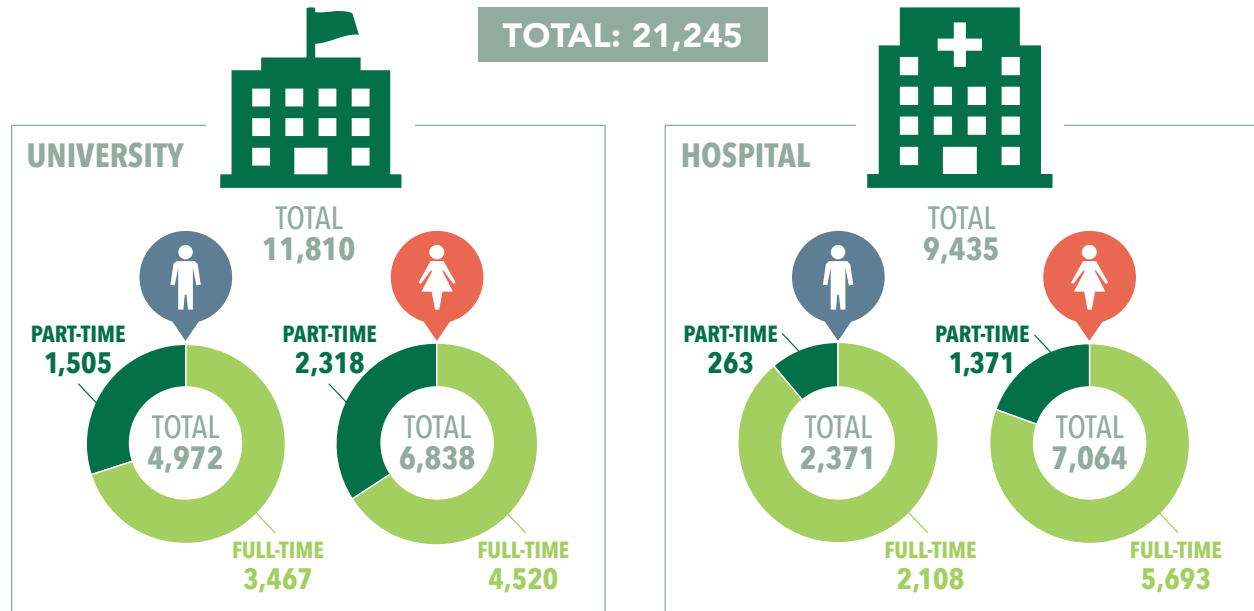

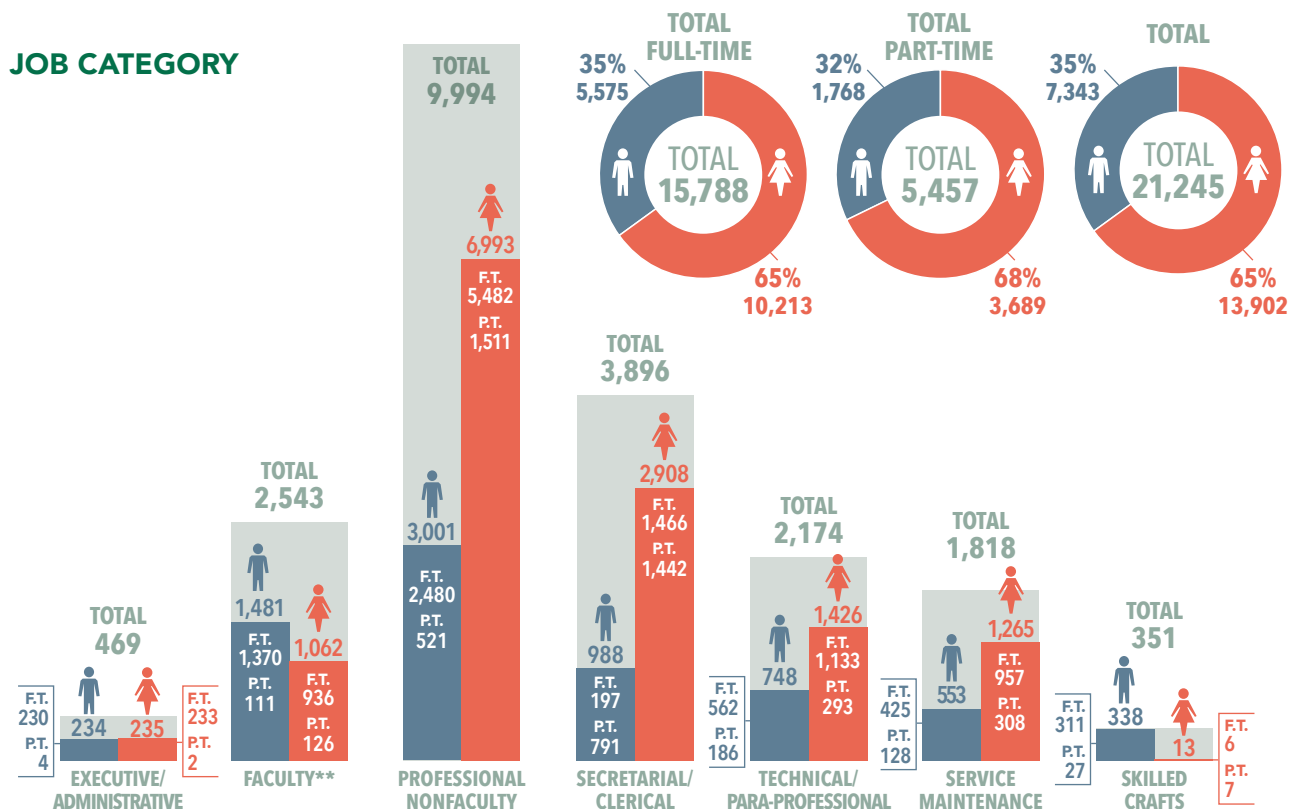
FY 2016–2017

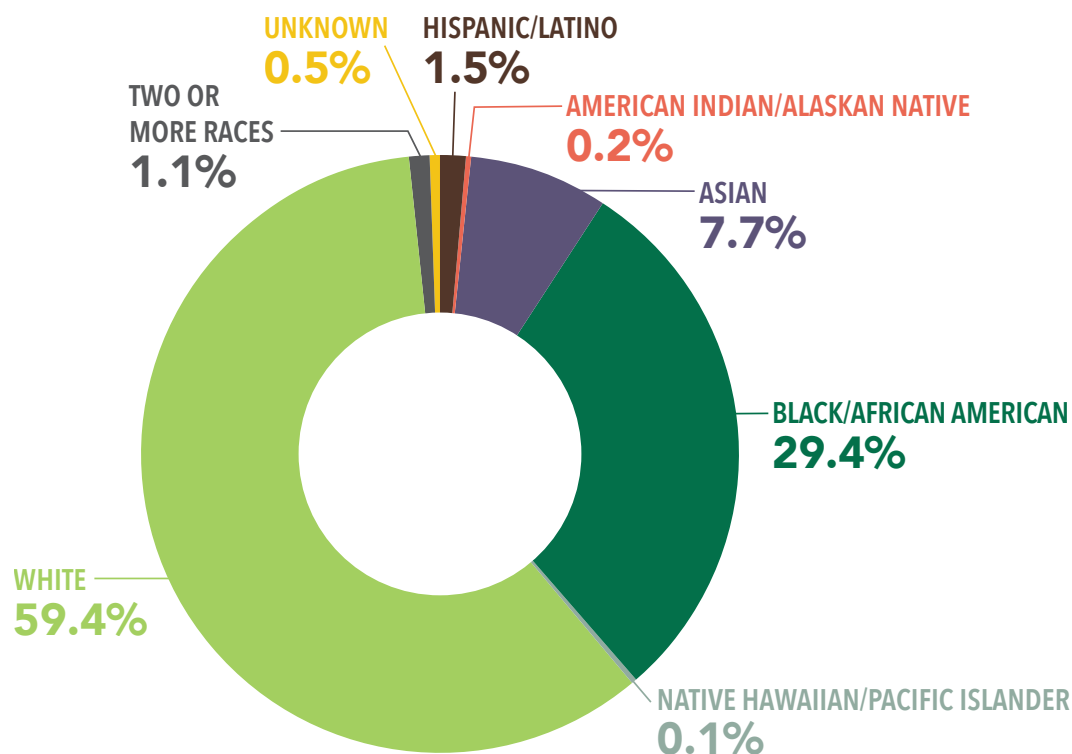

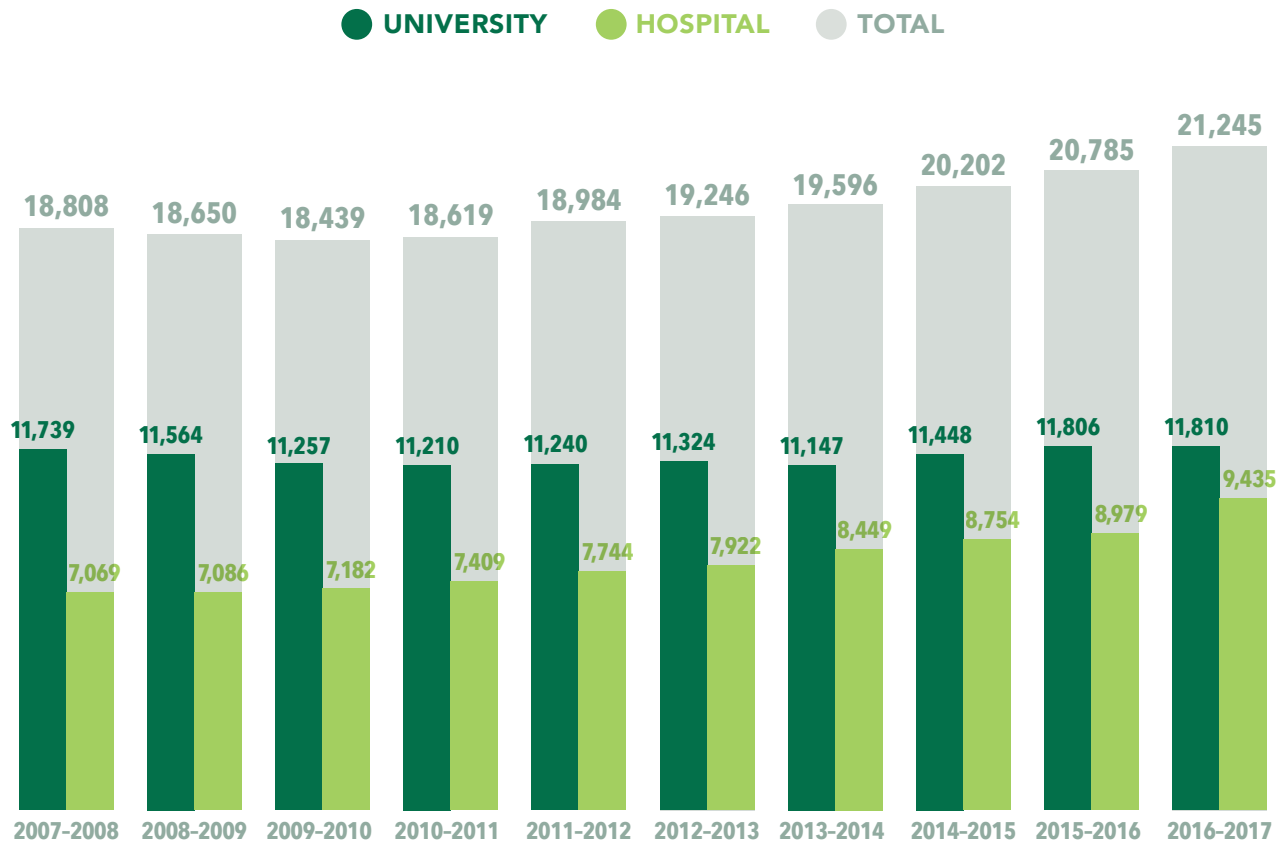

UAB WORK FORCE BY AREA

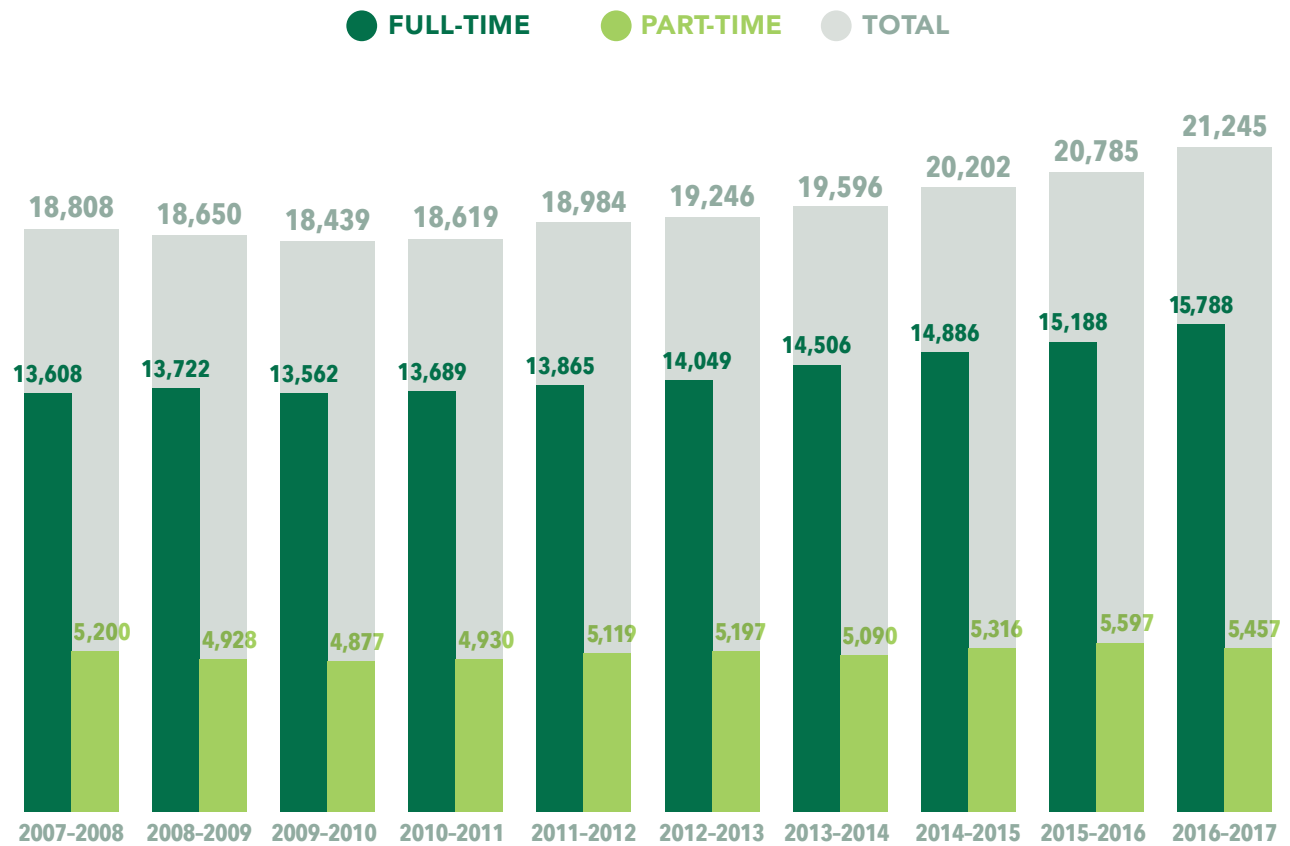
2007–2008 THROUGH 2016–2017

UAB WORK FORCE BY STATUS

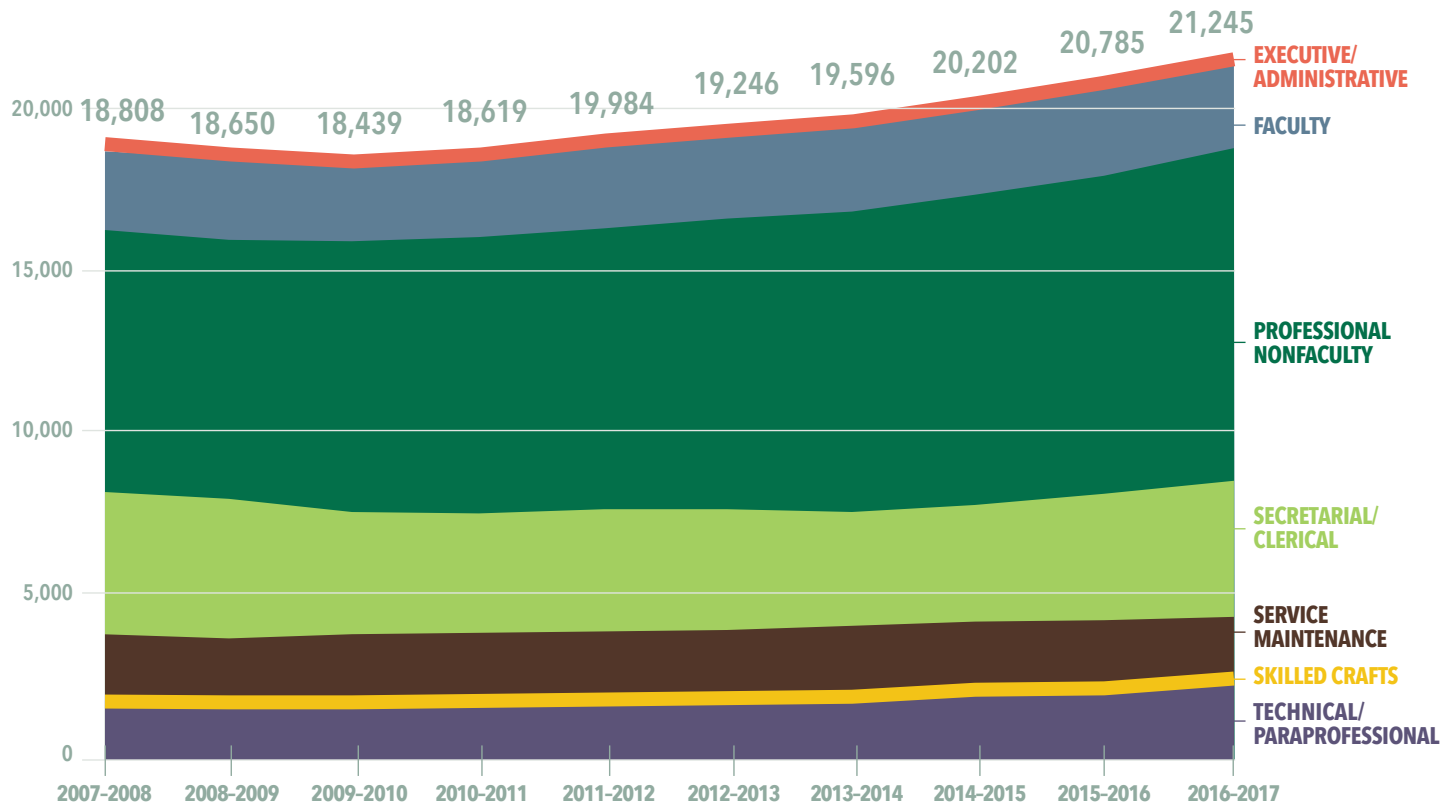
2007–2008 THROUGH 2016–2017

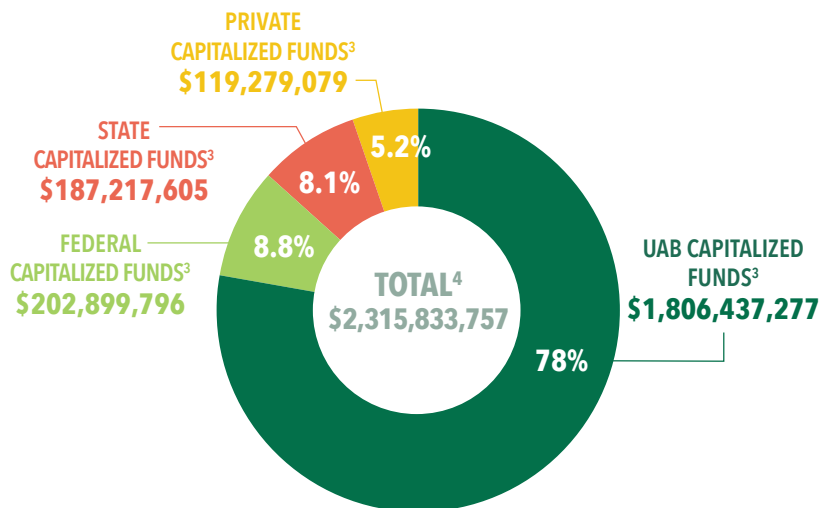
