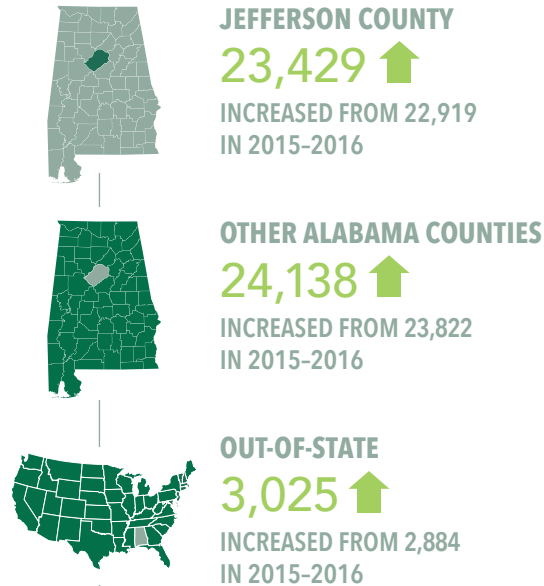

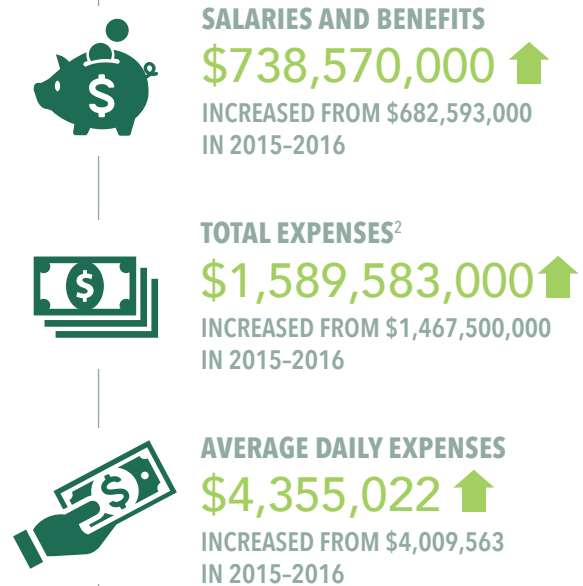

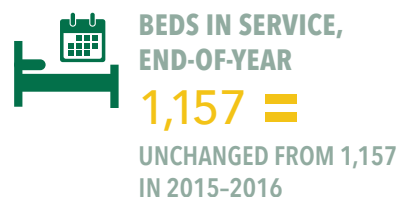
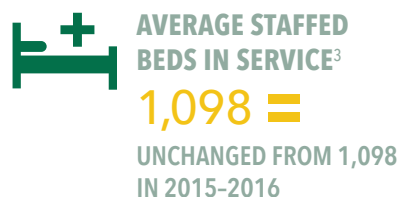
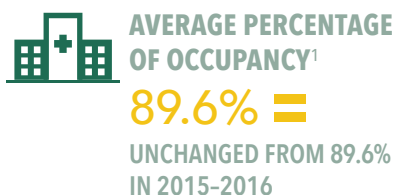
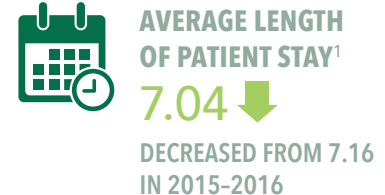
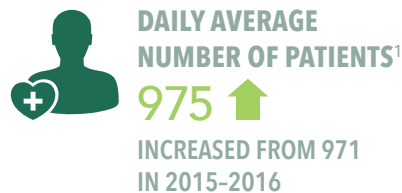
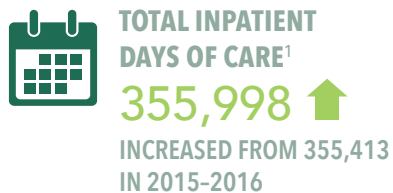
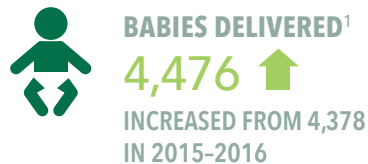
DISCHARGES BY PATIENT ORIGIN¹

UAB HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT REPORT

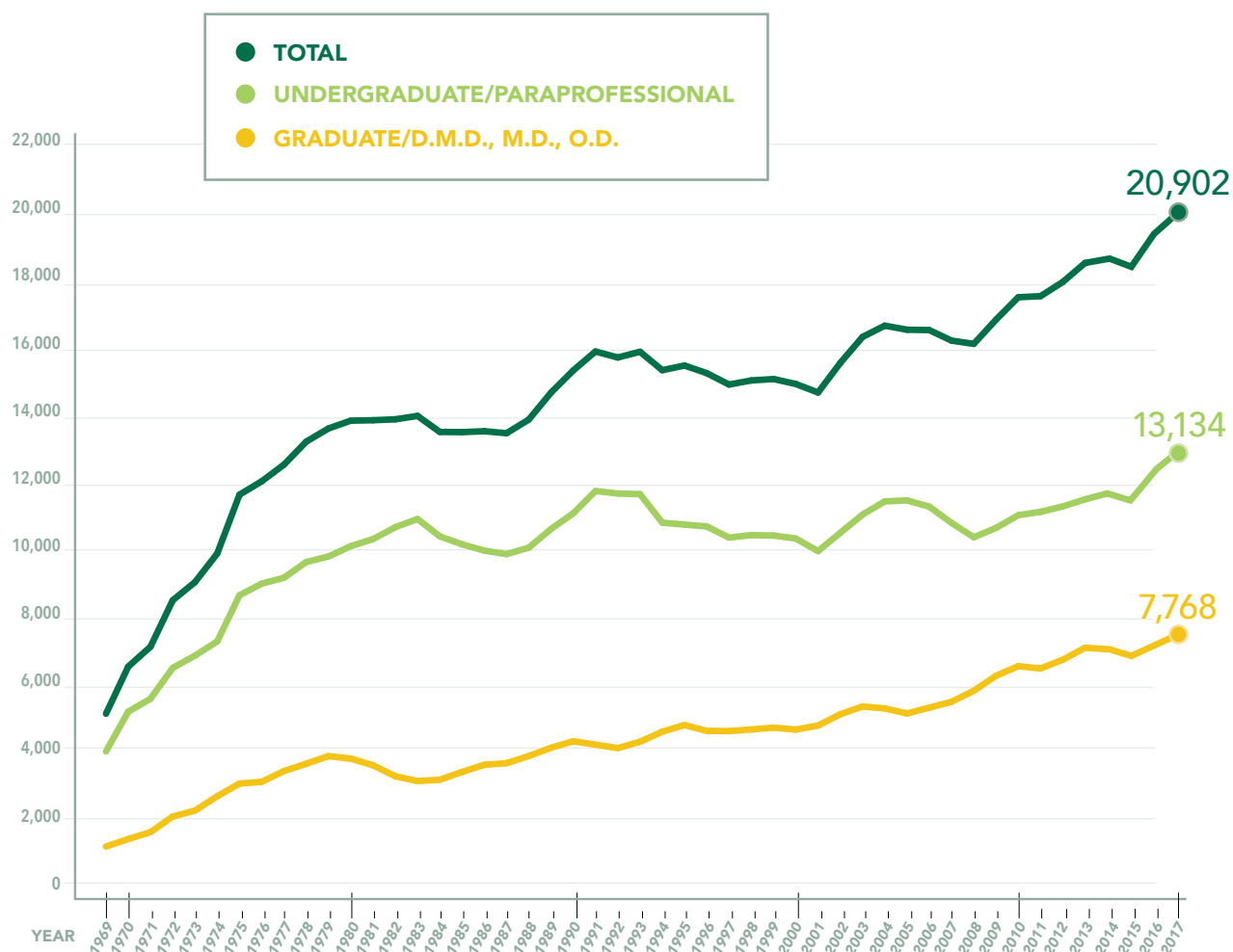

FALL 1969–FALL 2017



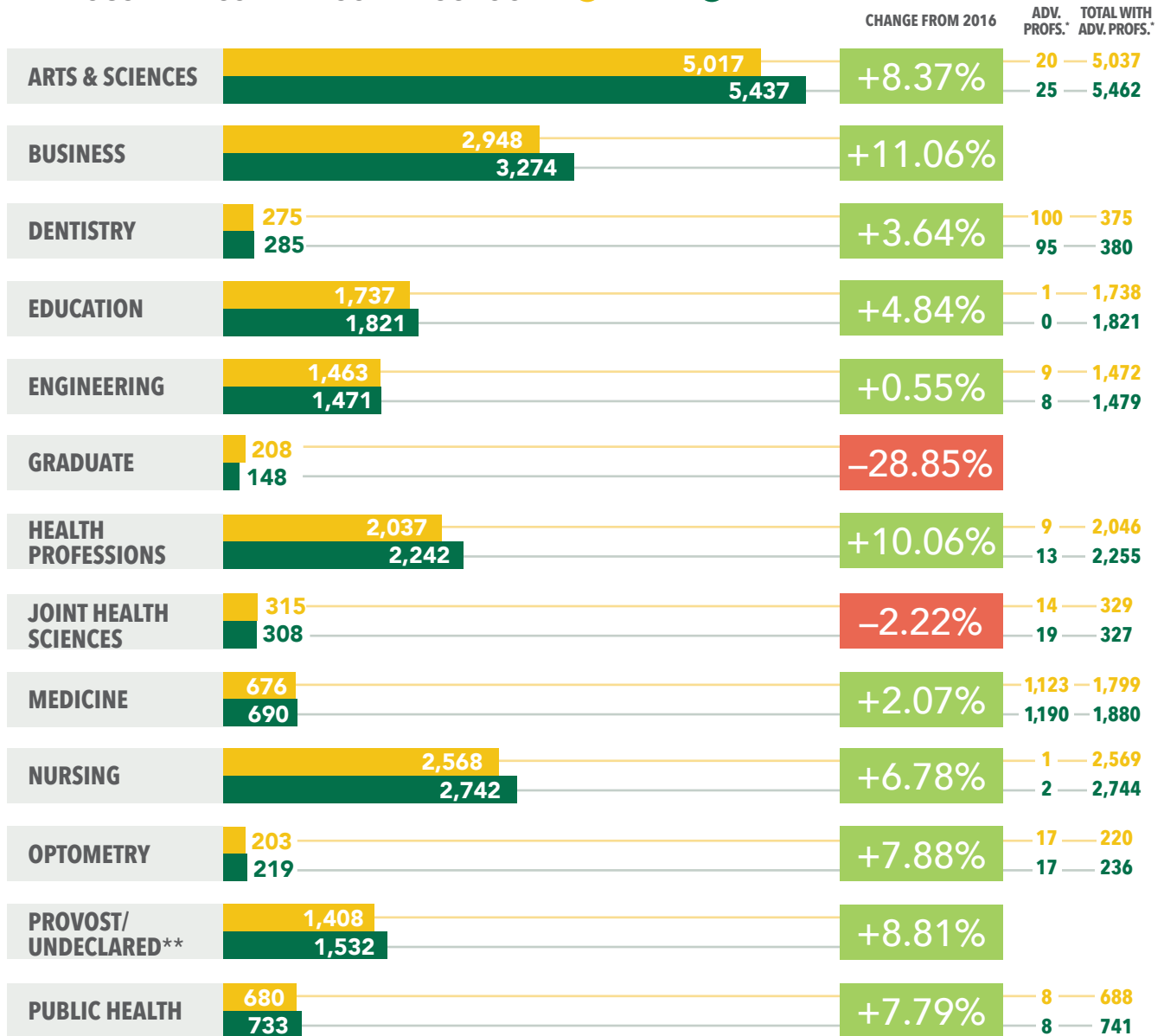

FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME STUDENTS

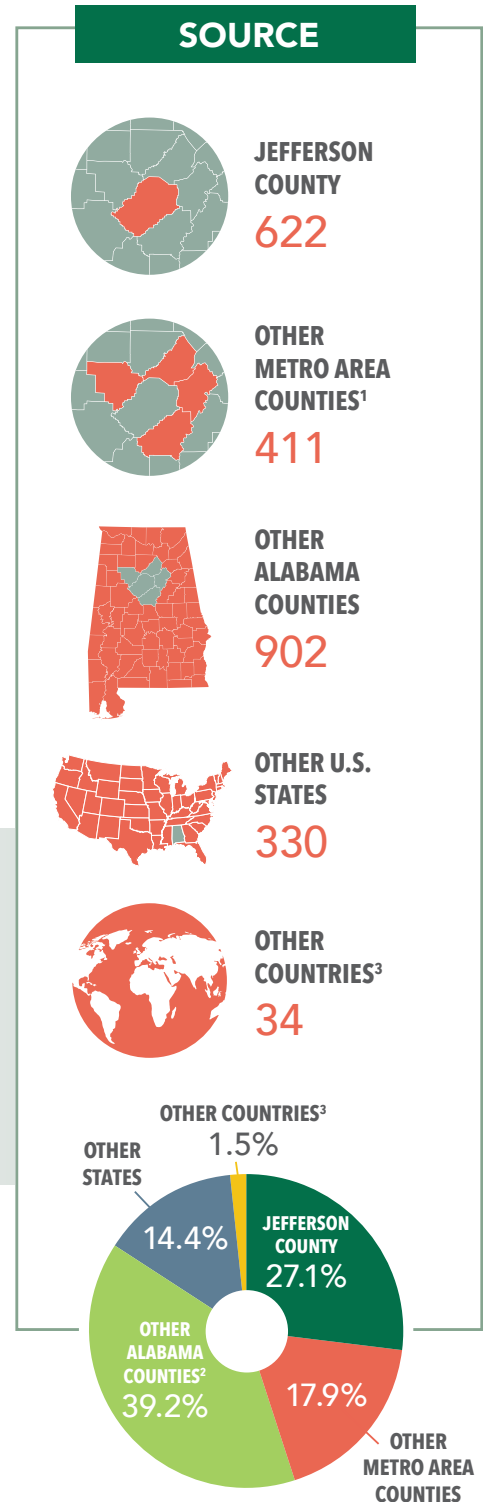

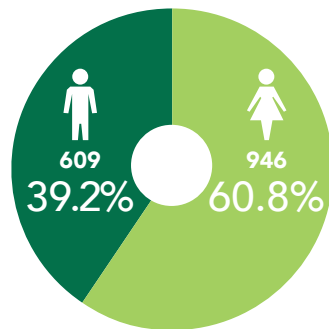

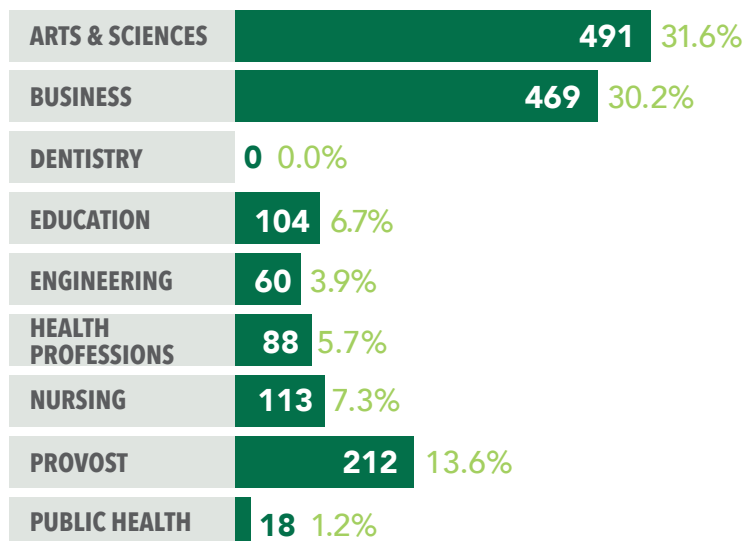

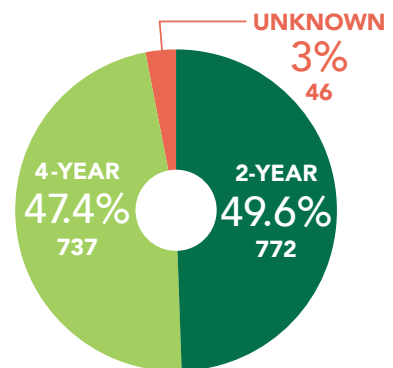
GENDER

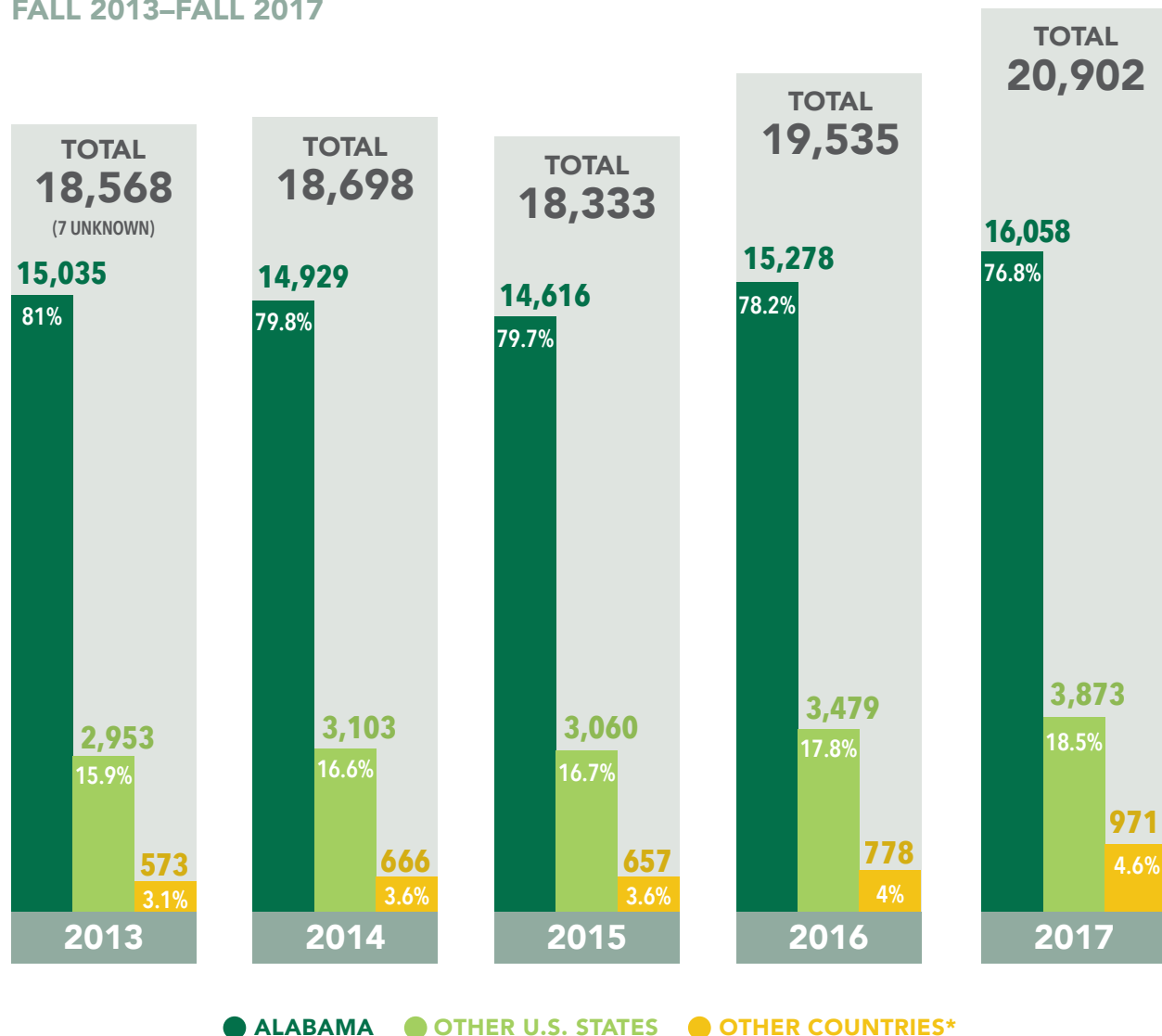

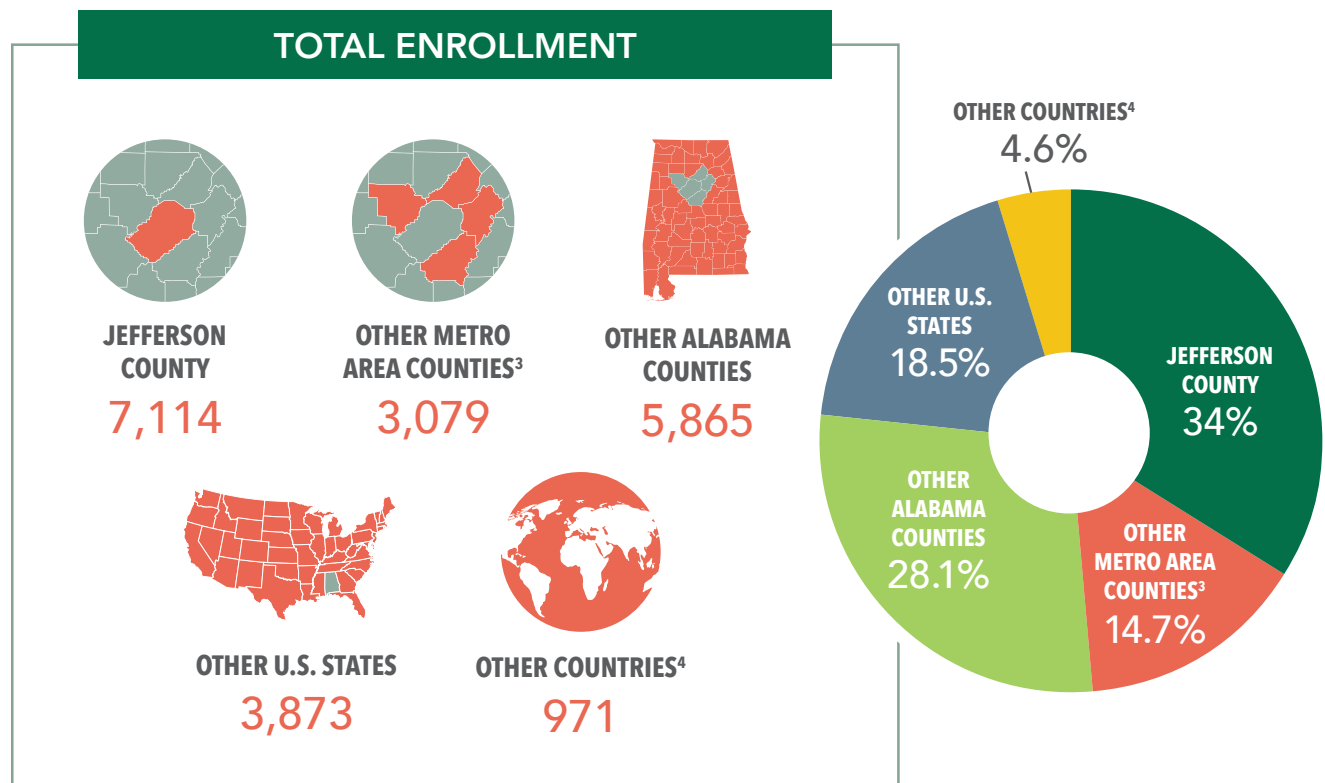

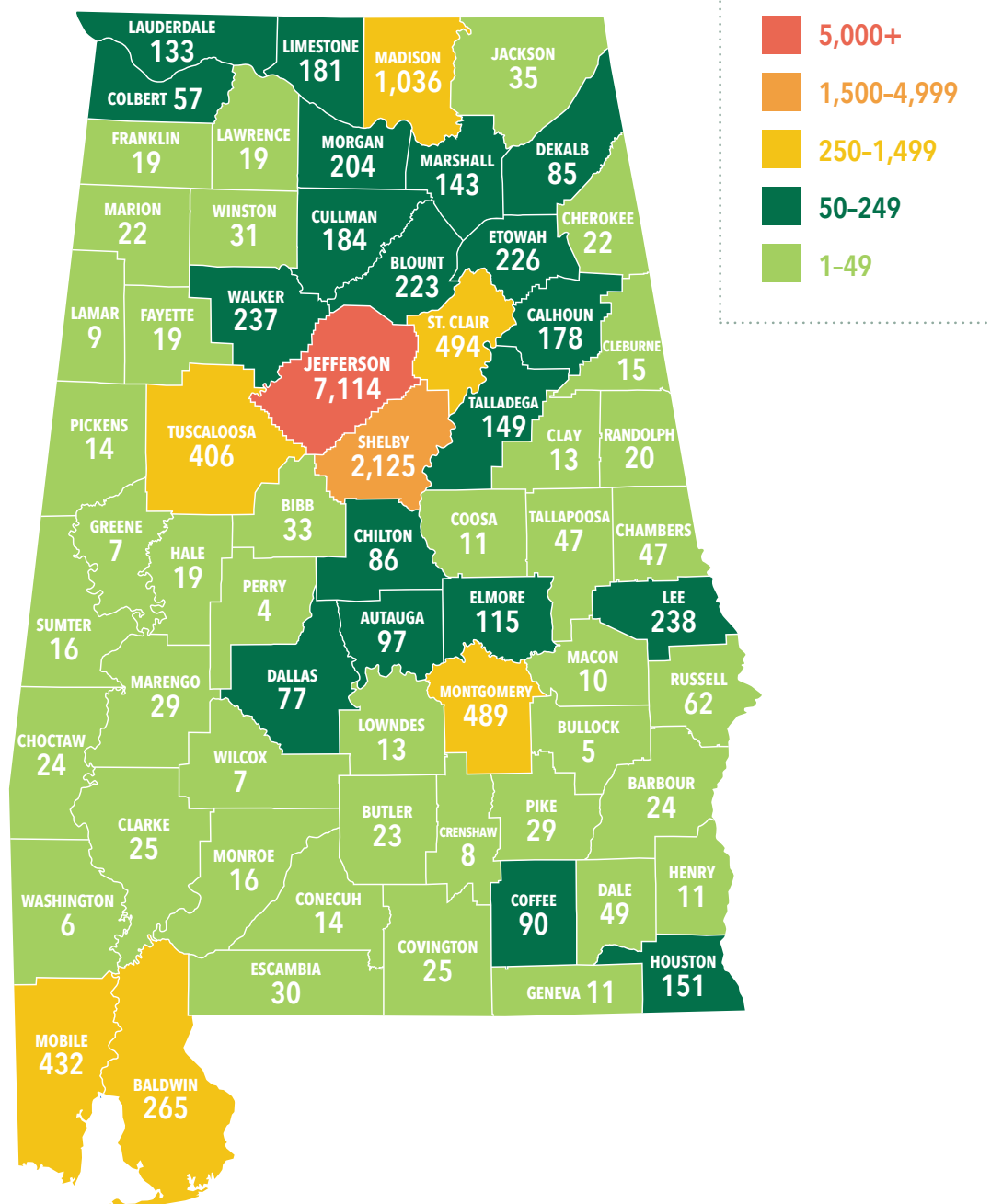

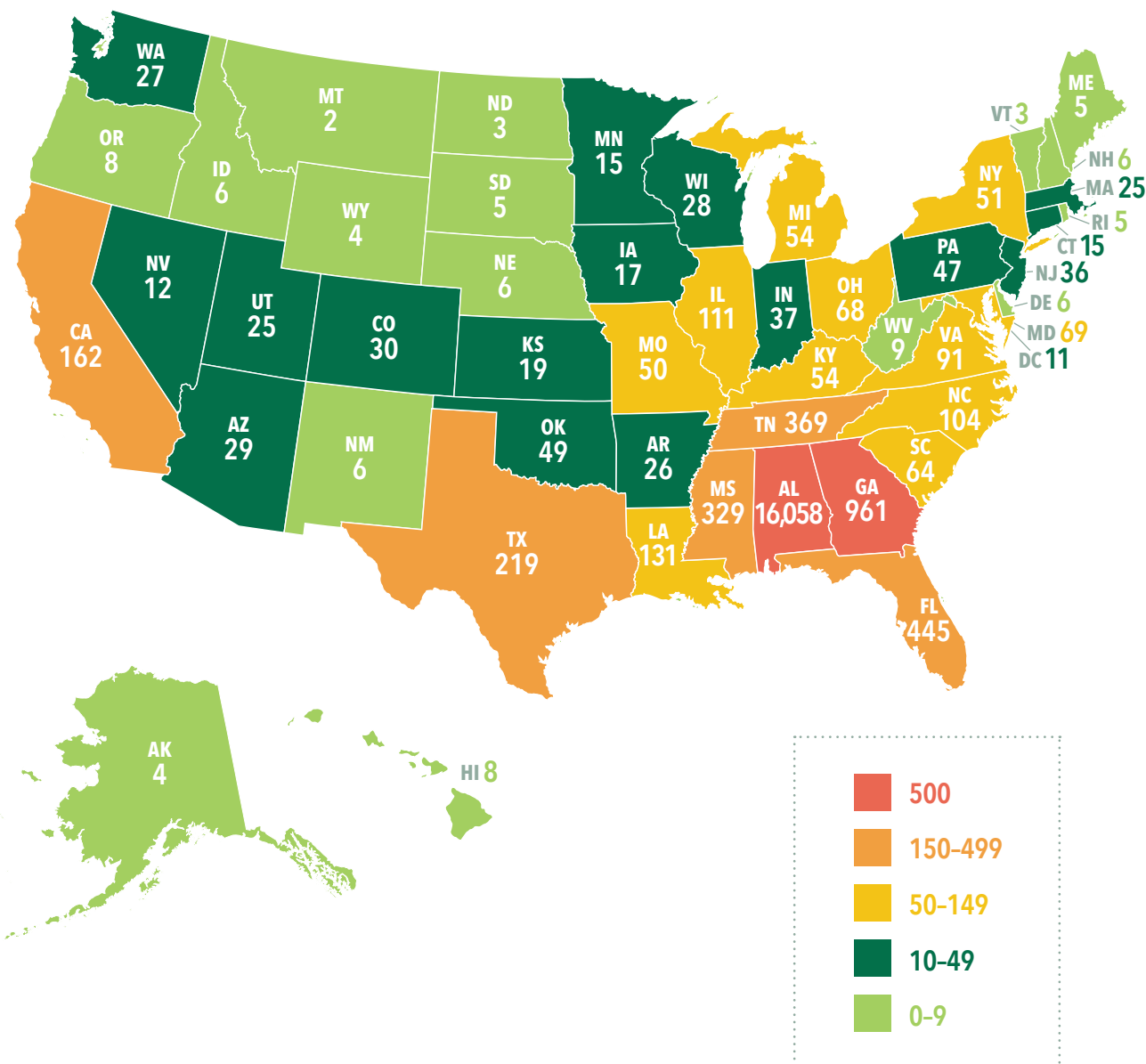

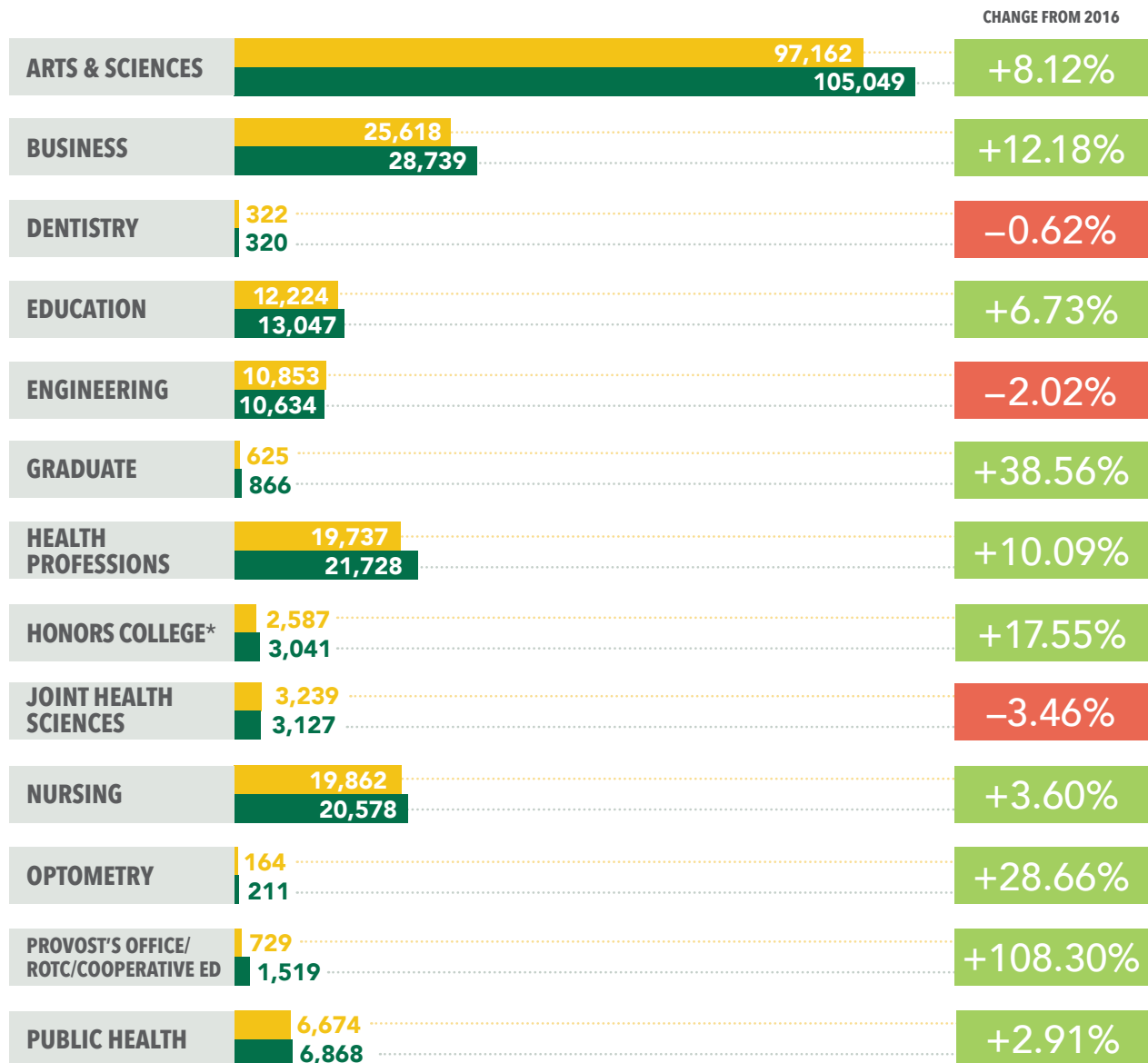

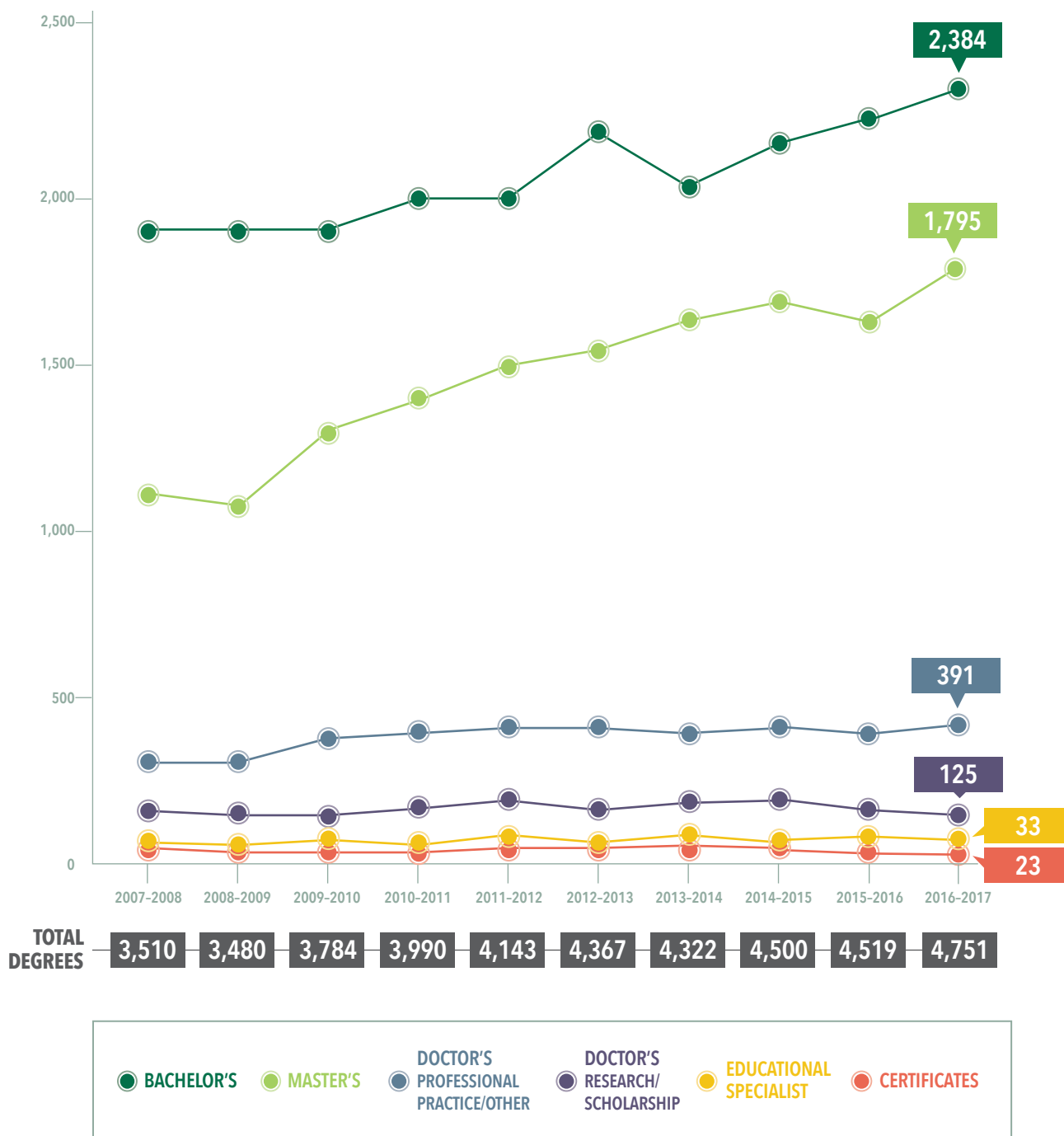

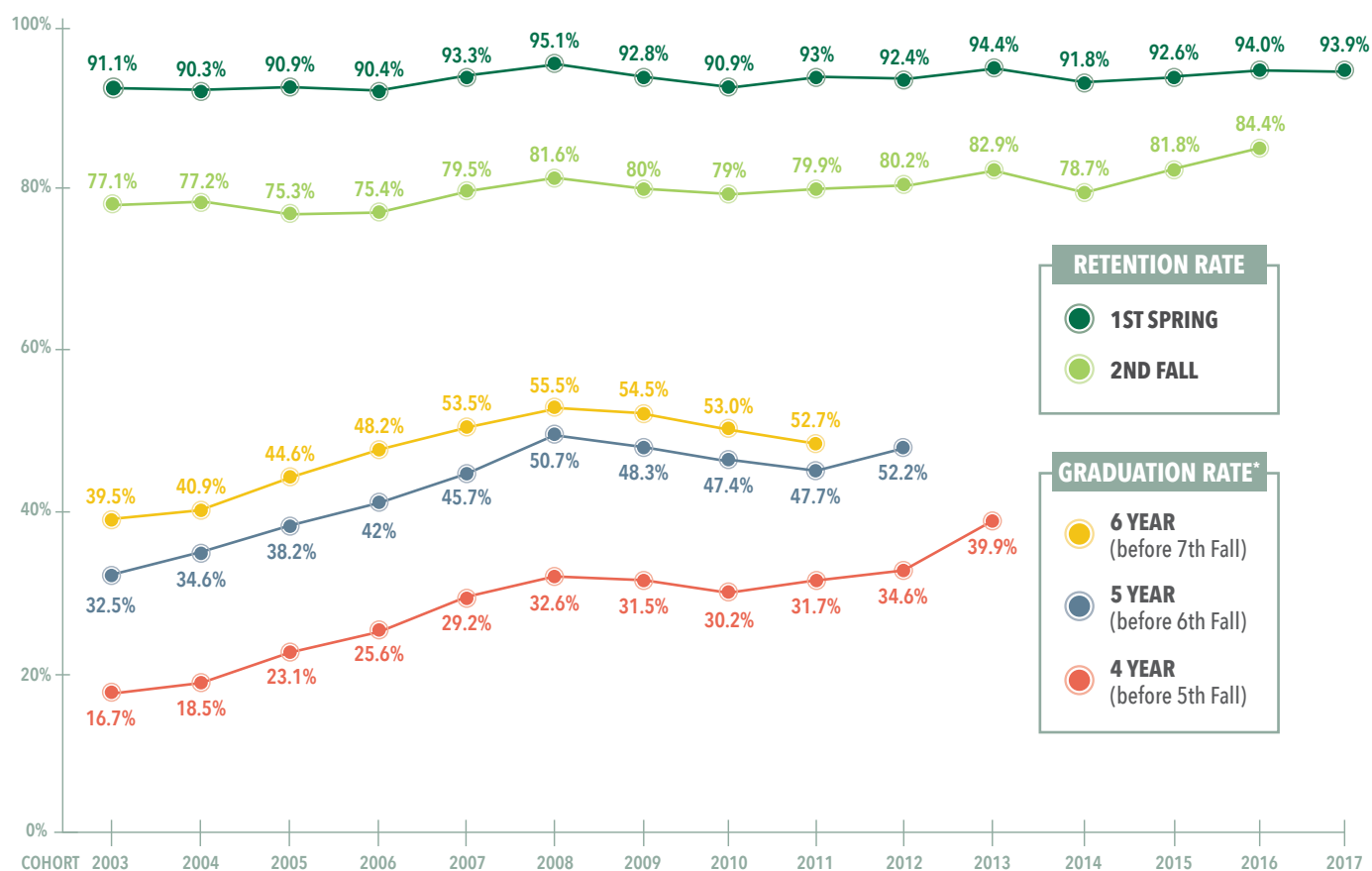

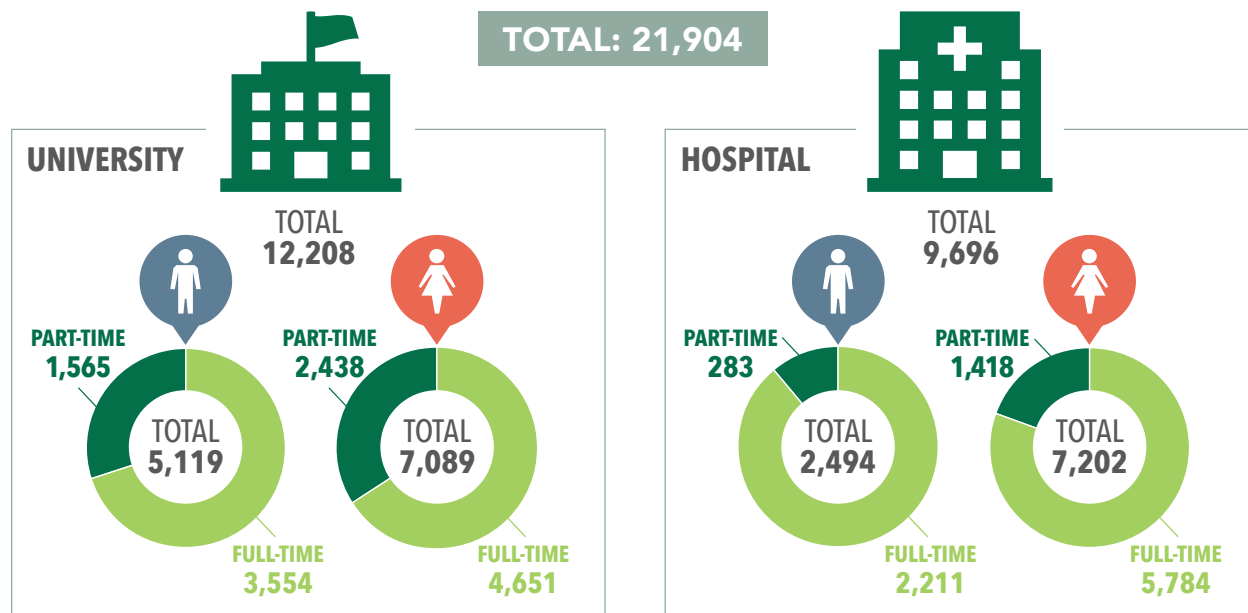

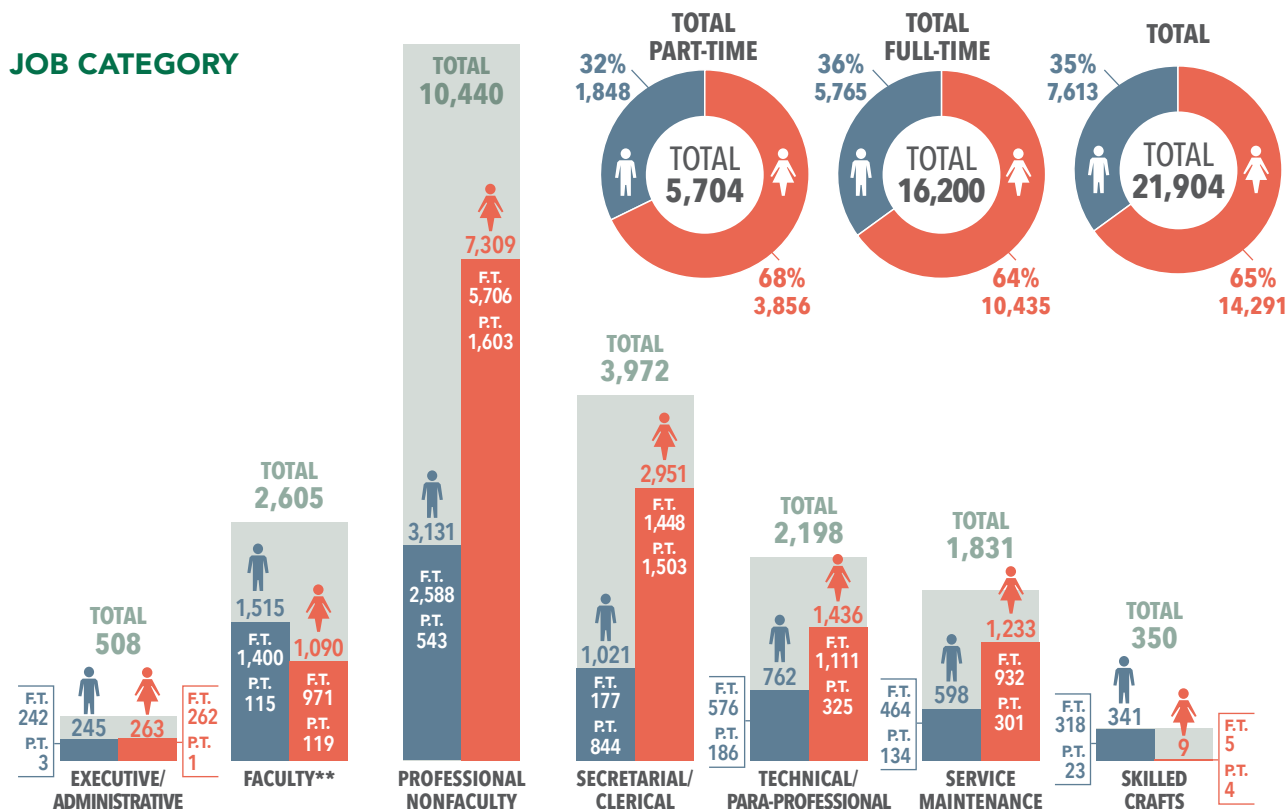

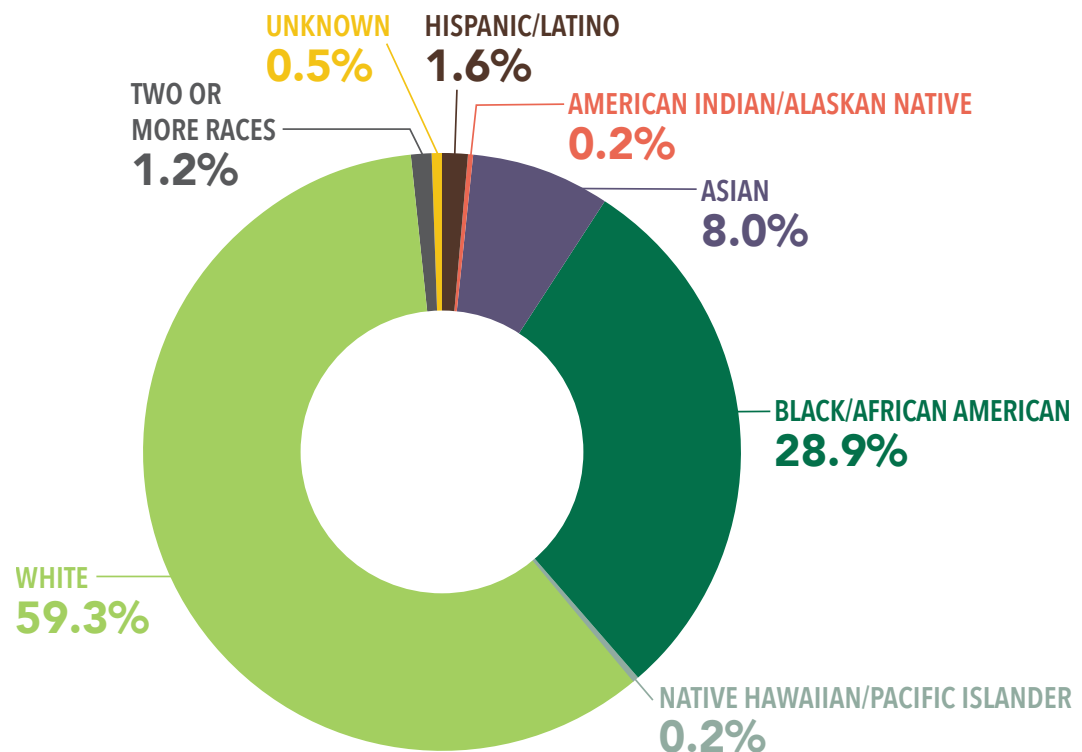

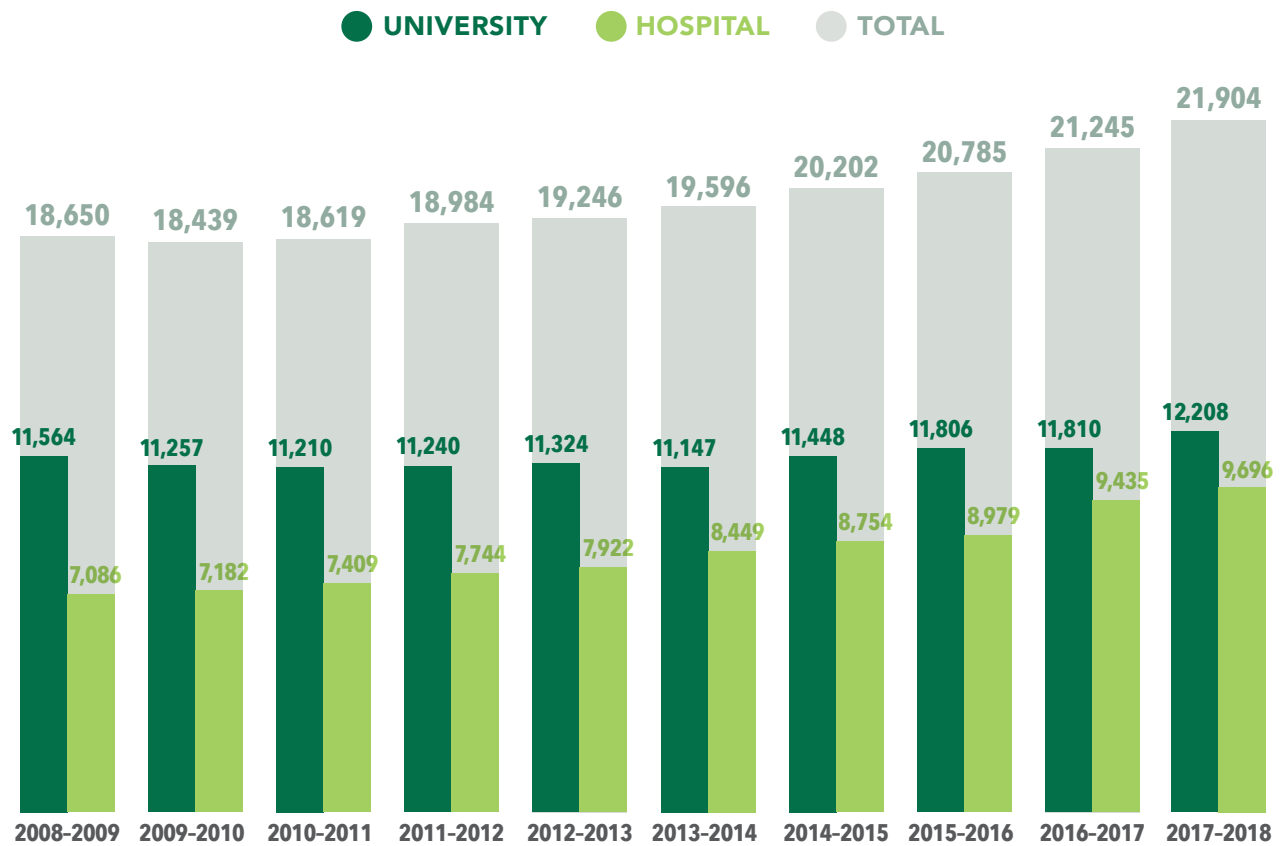

UAB WORK FORCE BY AREA

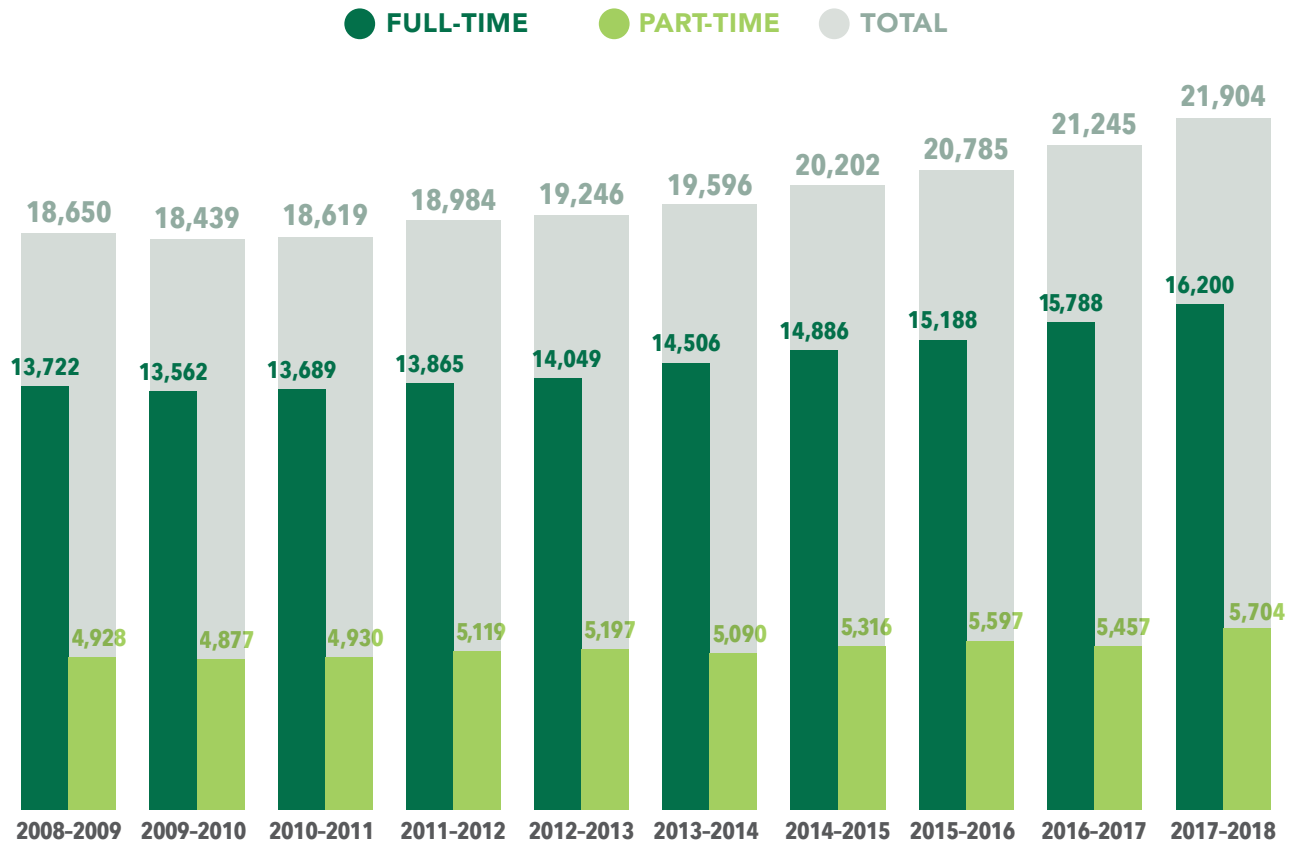
2008–2009 THROUGH 2017–2018

UAB WORK FORCE BY STATUS

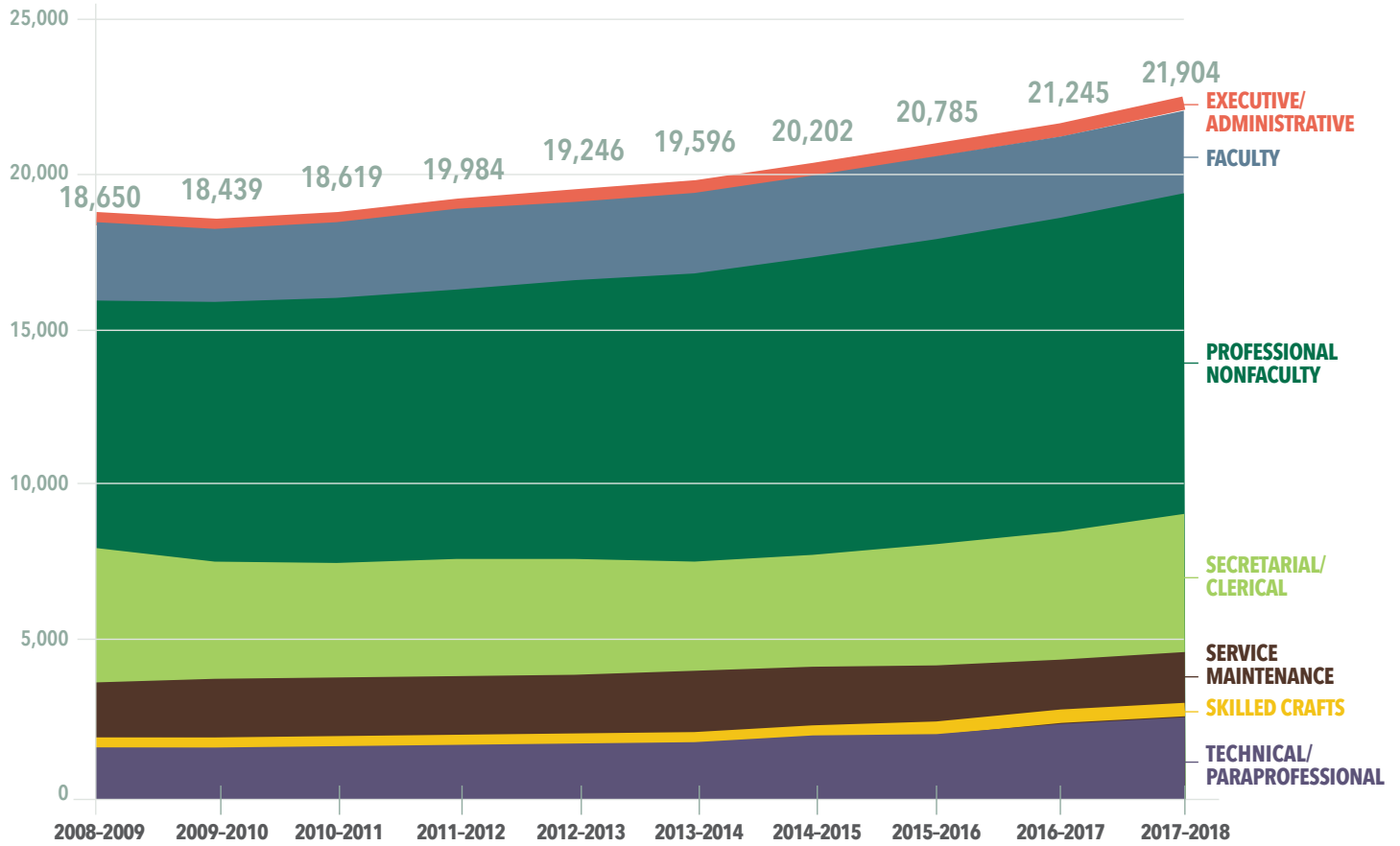

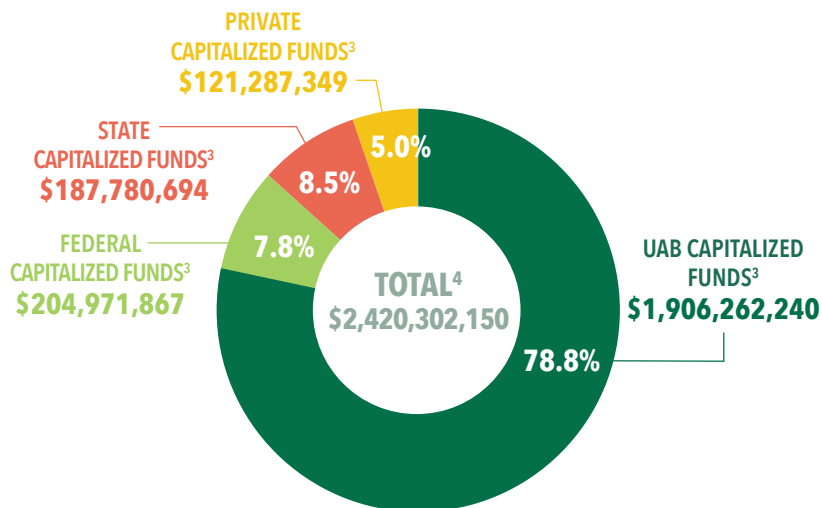
