1821	Board of Trustees of the University of Alabama created by the General Assembly
1936	Extension Center of the University of Alabama opened in Birmingham
1945	School of Medicine moved from Tuscaloosa to Birmingham and became a four-year school
1945	Jefferson and Hillman Hospitals combined to serve as the teaching hospital for the School of Medicine
1949	School of Dentistry, with Dr. Joseph F. Volker as dean, enrolled its first class
1955	First Ph.D. earned on the Birmingham campus






#### **DEGREES AWARDED 2019-2020**







**FALL 2020** 





### **UAB HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT REPORT**


FALL 1969-FALL 2020



















2011-2012 THROUGH 2020-2021




# **UAB WORK FORCE BY STATUS**




