
Thank you for all the hard work that often goes unrecognized. Keep it up and Kindle Your Fire for Civitan.



“THE IMPORTANCE OF "PAINTING A PICTURE"”

I know that membership growth and retention is everyone’s least favorite thing to talk about, but we have to. It is the only way for us to grow as an organization. With that, I want to bring a new idea to the table.

Studies have shown that in this day and age people do not want to give their time, money, and effort to service groups. They want to devote themselves to a cause. If people don’t want to join service groups how do we recruit them you ask? We sell the cause! Our job as Civitan recruiters is to “paint a picture” of what Civitan’s cause is, why it matters, and why potential new members should be a part of the movement.

Civitan is unique compared to other service organizations. Civitan clubs can create immediate and long-term change through their work. Your individual clubs have instantaneous positive impacts on your communities through projects like food and clothing drives, holding events for organizations that support people with disabilities, or volunteering at community-wide events. However, you also have the ability to be a key player in research that will change the world. By supporting Civitan’s flagship project, the Civitan International Research Center, through fundraising efforts, you are helping the scientists who work there get one step closer to finding cures and treatments for a variety of intellectual and developmental disabilities and cognitive disorders including Autism, Alzheimer’s, Parkinson’s, Epilepsy, and PTSD.

As we enter the new year I want you all to think about why you joined Civitan. It probably wasn't because of something that happened at a meeting or a social.
