

Growth and Retention Summary:

Alabama Central District Team, Club Officers and members, I am pleased to forward my report. The quarter ending on December 31, 2016 has some encouraging signs and draws attention to growth and retention in our District.

Our District started the 2016-17 Civitan Year with 640 members including 21 Associate members. We ended the 1st Quarter with 632 members including 21 Associate members. We actually had a net +2 gain, but we are carrying 10 inactive members, therefore the -2 loss. This is a good retention/growth sign for what is typically a slow quarter we have just finished.

So far this Civitan Year, 10 (30%) of our existing clubs have a net sum of 0 or more of at least one member! They are: Birmingham, Brent, Montevallo, Fairfield, Sylacauga, Vestavia Hills, Phenix City, Pell City, West Jefferson and Crestwood. We had three other Clubs to add at least one (1) new member since January. They are: Wilsonville, Center Point, and Gardendale. That's over 40% of District Clubs. Civitan International is busy mailing out those Centennial Sponsorship Pins. Birmingham, Vestavia Hills and West Jefferson, you are half way there to earning \$100 in Centennial Civi-bucks incentives. Five more members each will get you there.

Rebuilding the Mother Club/New Club Development: Extraordinary efforts are underway to rebuild the Birmingham Civitan Club ("The Mother Club") to its place of prominence in Civitan and Birmingham. After all, this is the Club that has given rise to Civitan International and nearly 100 years of tireless energies to help make this world a better place to live. The Club meets at the Harbert Center, downtown Birmingham and attracts world-class speakers who are in-tune with the various developments and improvements in Birmingham. Dee Hutsler, John Lanier and Louis Stephens are standing by to provide interested persons additional information about the Club, speaker schedules, etc.

The **UAB YP Club** is in a holding pattern. However, the Club Officers have been advised there must be more persistent efforts to recruit members into the club. The Club must charter with 20 members by March 1st, **Alexander City Civitan** Club Builders Lisa Abercrombie, Tony Ledbetter and Brian Dix, have been putting in time and efforts to charter this club, and they are making slow progress towards chartering this club.
