2025 Cell Types Workshop: Describe Your Neurons Like the Allen Institute

In this workshop, participants will gain in-depth exposure on how Allen Institute defines "cell types" and work with direct, applicable examples of how to use the Allen Institute's free, open resources & tools for research. The highlighted tools featured at the workshop are Cell Types Knowledge Explorer and Allen Brain Cell (ABC) Atlas, both of which include definitions and taxonomies of cell types, cell properties used in those definitions, and resources for applying these types to your cells.

Applications are open now and are due on **December 6, 2024.** All applications will be notified of the decision on their application by January 1, 2025. The workshop will be **March 17-19, 2025** at the Allen Institute, Seattle WA. Read More.

2025-2026 Faculty Development Grant Program (FDGP)

The UAB Faculty Development Grant Program provides seed money for research, scholarship and creative activities in a faculty member's discipline by providing funds to undertake new efforts for which money is not generally available. Funding enables faculty to develop manuscripts, publications, presentations, grant applications, future research initiatives, creative works, scholarly activity and new skills to enhance peer recognition outside of UAB. Simons Foundation: Fellows-to-Faculty Award RFA

The Simons Foundation's Autism & Neuroscience division is pleased to announce that the Fellows-to-Faculty Award request for applications (RFA) is now open. This award is a new iteration of the previously offered Simons Foundation Independence Awards.

The Fellows-to-Faculty Award program supports talented earlycareer scientists and their research vision as they transition into tenure-track or equivalent faculty positions.

Awardees receive funding toward the end of their postdoctoral career and a commitment of a \$600,000 USD faculty research grant. Fellows may activate the award funding at institutions within or outside the United States.

The deadline for application submission is **Tuesday**, **January 14**, **2025 at 12:00 p.m. (noon) ET.** Detailed information and application instructions are available <u>here</u>.

2025 UAB NIH Shared Instrument Grant (SIG-S10)

To assist UAB investigators in submitting competitive and successful NIH S10 Shared Instrumentation Grants (2025 PAR Shared Instrumentation Grant Program (SIG)) and High End Instrumentation (2025 PAR High-End Instrumentation Grant Program (HEI)) grants, a pre-submission and review process is being instituted for 2025. The goal is to assist investigators in proposal development as well as obtaining institutional support necessary for submission. The process will include a letter of intent followed by a merit-based assessment of each project. Both the SIG and HEI have a due date of **June 2, 2025**. Read More.


2025 Marchase Lecture & Award Event

Cores and shared resource providers can register and reserve a


poster display easel by <u>completing the survey</u> and uploading their poster. Registration is open now through **December 20, 2024**.


