



Biomedical Sciences Ph.D. student Jazmine Benjamin was selected as an inaugural fellow for the Howard Garrison Advocacy Fellowship program.


Thomas named president-elect of the Society of Behavioral **Sleep Medicine**

The SBSM is an international organization that engages in advocacy, education, and research in behavioral sleep medicine.

The M.D./Ph.D. student has since moved on to clinical studies, but the research into possible drugs to treat Alzheimer's disease continues.



While preventive treatment with vigabatrin delayed the onset and prevalence of infantile spasms in TSC infants, it had no impact on focal seizures, drug-resistant epilepsy, or improvement of





cognitive and behavioral scores at 24 months.

NIH Requesting Information on Updating Mission Statement

The NIH has issued a new request for information (RFI) inviting stakeholders to provide comments and suggestions on updating NIH's mission statement. This RFI will inform NIH's efforts to update its mission statement to ensure that it reflects the NIH mission as accurately as possible. Input sought about the proposed revised mission statement includes feedback on whether the proposed new mission statement reflects the goals and objectives as outlined in the <u>NIH-Wide Strategic Plan for FYs 2021–2025</u>, suggestions for specific language that could be added to the proposed mission statement, and why, and feedback on any specific language that could be removed from the proposed mission statement and why. The deadline to submit comments is Friday, November 24.


