

NIH Limiting Applications per PI and Revising Appropriate AI Usage Guidance



The <u>National Institutes of Health</u> (NIH) has provided guidance to researchers on the appropriate usage of artificial intelligence (AI) to maintain the fairness and originality of NIH's research application process. NIH will not consider applications that are either substantially developed by AI, or contain sections substantially developed by AI, to be original ideas of applicants.

NIH is also instituting a new policy limiting the number of applications that NIH will consider per Principal Investigator per calendar year. NIH will only accept six new, renewal, resubmission, or revision applications from an individual Principal Investigator/Program Director or Multiple Principal Investigator for all council rounds in a calendar year.

This policy applies to all activity codes except T activity codes and R13 Conference Grant Applications.

2025 Civitan International Convention



2025 UAB CAPPI Pilot Grant Program

Purpose: The program provides pilot funds for new pain and/or addiction research. The expectation is generation of pilot data resulting in a NIH or other grant submission after one year of funding.

Award amount: \$25,000

Eligibility: Full-time faculty at UAB only.

Deadline: Apply by September 15, 2025 at 5pm

How to submit: Via the <u>InfoReady portal</u>.

2025-2026 ICAR Pilot Funding Announcement

The Integrative Center for Aging Research (ICAR) solicits proposals for its pilot project research program. Applications may range from basic biology of aging to translational, clinical, and community-based research. Themes of particular interest are: 1) the relationships between aging and disease, 2) interventions to promote function and independence for older adults, 3) serious and chronic illness among vulnerable and under-resourced older adults, and 4) intervention delivery and implementation science in older adults. Integrated, multidisciplinary, and translational approaches are encouraged.

ICAR will prioritize meritorious applications from early-stage investigators; however, established investigators seeking funding to start a new innovative research line that is significantly different from their current research work will also be considered.

The program will provide up to \$25,000 per award.


