New NSF Training Requirement effective Oct 2025



The U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF) issued <u>Important Notice No. 149</u> outlining its major updates to research security policies in alignment with the CHIPS and Science Act of 2022 and NSPM-33. These changes impact all NSF-funded proposals and awards. Effective **October 10, 2025**, all principal investigators and senior/key personnel must complete research security training within the twelve (12) months prior to proposal submission.

All NSF principal investigators and senior/key personnel must complete the research security training module in UAB's Learning Management System (LMS) to obtain credit. Training must be renewed annually. Read More




