The University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) is a comprehensive teaching and research-intensive university with an exceptionally strong academic medical center and health system. UAB is the only four-year public university in Birmingham, Alabama's largest metropolitan area. The University offers 35 doctoral programs and 45 master's programs. Overall student enrollment exceeds 22,000. The University boasts a significant minority (42.5%) and female (62%) enrollment. The University has grown from 15 blocks in 1969 to more than 100 blocks, with some 213 buildings. UAB's budget of \$49.9 million in 1969 has multiplied to more than \$3.6 billion in 2019. The University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) is the largest employer in the state, with 24,410 faculty and staff within the university and health system, and provides over 64,000 jobs within the university and the community. UAB's aggregate economic impact for Birmingham and the State of Alabama exceeds \$7 billion.
