

ENDOWED FACULTY POSITIONS IN GYNECOLOGICAL CANCER RESEARCH

The Department of Pathology and the UAB Comprehensive Cancer Center has opened a search to fill **multiple endowed positions** for researchers working in the area of gynecological malignancies. This represents a substantial effort to expand the highly successful and nationally recognized efforts in Gyn/Onc research currently ongoing at UAB that includes multiple funded investigators and an NCI SPORE in cervical cancer. Applications are invited for a tenured or tenure-track faculty position from scientists (PhD, MD, MD/PhD) or from scientific collaborative teams that are internationally recognized for their research accomplishments and have an established and actively funded research program in any area of gynecological malignancies. Exceptional candidates will be eligible for appointment to the Hazel Gore, MD, Endowed Professorship in Gynecologic Pathology or the Griffin Endowed Chair in Women's Cancer. The UAB Comprehensive Cancer Center is widely recognized as a leader in cancer research and treatment and provides exceptional support for investigators to develop and expand their research programs. UAB ranks in the top 25 in NIH funding and is a dynamic, collaborative research institution with state of the art facilities and excellent training programs for graduate students and post-doctoral fellows. Successful candidates will be appointed to the Department of Pathology or another department depending upon their background and interests. A pre-employment background investigation is performed on candidates selected for employment.
