

Transfusion Medicine Open Rank: The Division of Laboratory Medicine, Department of Pathology at the University of Alabama at Birmingham is recruiting a pathologist with primary service responsibility in Transfusion Medicine. Depending upon rank, the position could be with tenure, tenure earning, or non-tenured. Rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. The successful candidate must be BC/BE in CP or AP/CP and in Transfusion Medicine. The successful candidate will provide transfusion coverage for all services of this 1,200 bed hospital, including a very active therapeutic apheresis program. The candidate will be expected to develop a limited independent program of clinical and/or basic research and to participate in our educational programs. In conjunction with UAB, this position may involve an appointment at the Birmingham Veterans Administration Medical Center (BVAMC).
