

region in conjunction with practicing pediatricians and pediatric surgical specialists in our state of the art, full-service facility. The second goal would be to further extend an already exciting learning environment for medical and nursing students, graduate students in biological sciences, house staff, and post-doctoral fellows that provides the educational foundation for their development as future leaders. This focus on training is also part of the long term renewal strategy to provide the next generation of physician scientists. The third goal is to achieve national prominence in laboratory, clinical translational and outcomes research comparable to the best national institutions. By so doing, we will advance discovery that will improve the future health of our patients. Finally, I believe we need to partner with others to extend advocacy for child health, both in Alabama and nationally, through legislative action and participation in academic societies and by acting outside the walls of Children's of Alabama and UAB, to improve community health.

The coming months will be a time of critical, strategic opportunity for the Department. In this Next Era, together with Children's of Alabama and the School of Medicine, we will want to identify strategic priorities that will help us achieve these goals. Please know I am already working hard to learn as much as I can about you and the culture that makes this Department and Children's so special. NOTE: UAB policy requires Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP) to review all sponsored projects prior to submission. Therefore, all KPRI applications will need to be submitted to Carla Parrish (Lowder 606) no later than Friday, September 19th to ensure review by OSP prior to the COA 9/30/14 deadline.

Please include the completed UAB Extramural Support Checklist (<http://www.uab.edu/osp/forms>) and a copy of the application, including a detailed budget and budget justification. You will also need to complete the RPL form. Submitting the applications to UAB OSP prior to the award will expedite the process of obtaining a UAB grant account number for the projects that are funded.
