Farewell Dr. Berland

It is with mixed emotions that I announce the end of an era at UAB, the retirement of Dr. Lincoln L. Berland.

Dr. Berland has been a beloved faculty member in the Department of Radiology for over 33 years. After graduating from Washington University School of Medicine, he completed his radiology residency and subsequent fellowship in abdominal imaging at the Medical College of Wisconsin. After a two year faculty appointment following his fellowship, he was recruited to UAB as an Associate Professor. Additionally, he served as Chief of CT for 13 years. He also served as Vice Chair of Planning and Administration and Vice Chair of Development, yet it was his inimitable role as the inaugural Vice Chair for Quality and Patient Safety that established Radiology's culture of safety.

Dr. Berland is considered as one of the forefathers of CT and the world's authority on imaging incidental findings. He is a fellow in the American College of Radiology, the Society of Radiologists in Ultrasound, and the Society of Computed Body Tomography and Magnetic Resonance. He sits on the American College of Radiology Board of Chancellors as the Chair of the Commission for Body Imaging.

Dr. Berland exhibits excellence and devotion in the instruction of our trainees and is regarded as a role model and mentor for innumerable residents, fellows, and faculty. He has touched the lives of so many radiologists. Although we will miss him, we wish him the best when he departs in June.

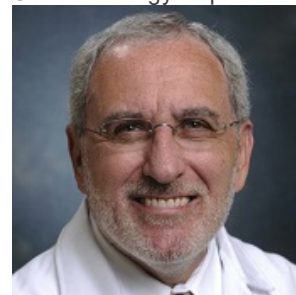

NSQIP Report

According to the most recent National Surgical Quality Improvement Project (NSQIP) report which is sponsored by the American College of Surgeons for the evaluation of hepatic resection results, UAB had the 2nd lowest mortality, the **lowest** composite morbidity, 2nd lowest sepsis, and 2nd lowest readmission rate. "These outcomes are because of our outstanding liver tumor team including our liver tumor clinic support staff, the liver tumor board, our radiology and interventional oncology group, the medical oncology, radiation oncology, liver anesthesia, intensive care support, and the p8 liver nursing staff."
