Re: Contrast Coverage

One of the Radiology department's goals is to ensure that the patients that have a contrast-induced reaction are doing well and not experiencing symptoms progressing to anaphylaxis. In emergency cases such as these, it is not important to try and retrieve the Radiologist of the region of the body that is being scanned, but instead to get the closest available radiologist. Therefore, below defines what sections will be primarily responsible for contrast coverage by locations and modalities.

a. Chest 7:30 AM - 5:00 PM
b. Abdomen 7:30 AM - 5:00 PM

B. TKC MRI

a. Neuro 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM (primary)

b. MSK (backup)

C. TKC CT

a. Chest
b. MSK
8:00 AM – 12:30 PM
12:30 PM – 5:00 PM

D. TKC MRI/CT

a. On call Resident (Before 8:00 located in TKC GI reading room, after 5:00 PM located in the MRI Neuro RR)
