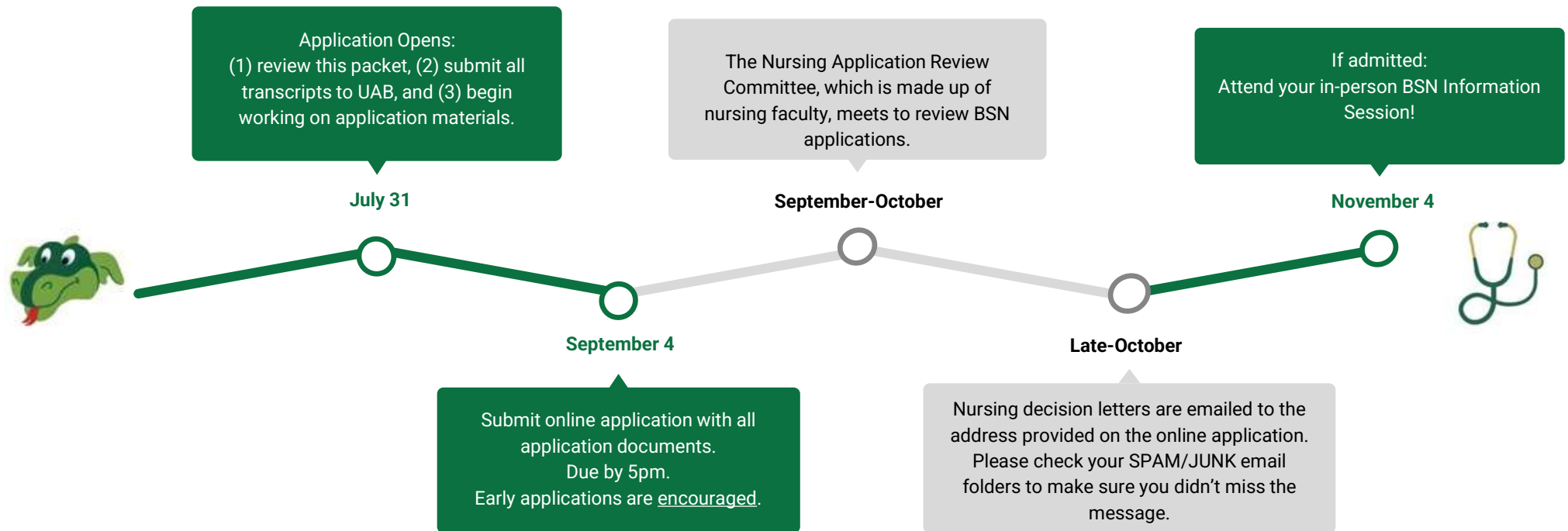

*GPS does not reflect the pre-nursing foundation GPA exactly as it is determined during the admissions process. The GPA the School of Nursing calculates in your application materials may be different, but you can use this GPA to move forward to next steps.

Foundation Courses for BS in Nursing **COMPLETE**

Foundation courses may also apply to Core Curriculum requirements.
Your GPA in foundation courses is 3.15.

Step 2: Confirm Your Eligibility for BSN Admission

There are different requirements for two unique populations:

If you are pursuing your first bachelor's degree, and you are not a Dean's Scholar, you can skip this slide.

Second Degree Students

- Students who already have an undergraduate degree (not in nursing)
- Prerequisite course requirements are limited to the pre-nursing foundation courses (listed under "Information for Second Degree Students": <https://www.uab.edu/nursing/home/academics/undergraduate/bsn>)
- Prerequisite foundation GPA of 2.75 or higher required
- Overall GPA of 2.75 or higher required
 - Applicants with less than the required overall undergraduate 2.75 GPA may submit Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores to complete their application. The minimum scores required are a combined 297 on the verbal and quantitative sections. Only scores completed within the last 5 years are accepted.

Dean's Scholar Students

- Must have been accepted into UAB as a Dean's Scholar as a freshman
- At the time of the application review, must have a 3.2+ Foundation GPA & a 3.2+ Overall GPA
- Must complete all Nursing Foundation courses at UAB

Step 3: Write Your Application Essay

You will upload an essay in the online application. Follow these instructions to write your essay.

Essay Prompt

The essay serves as a personal statement to introduce yourself to the faculty reviewers and explain your knowledge of the field of nursing. Make your essay personal by providing specific examples! Please provide answers to the following:

- While we see nurses as caring and compassionate, what is your understanding of what nurses do each day?
- Nurses work in a variety of healthcare settings with different populations. What experiences and background do you have that will allow you to succeed and thrive in this environment?
- OPTIONAL: If applicable, we recommend that you address any items of concern on your academic record and provide the surrounding context to assist the faculty while reviewing your application.

Essay Guidelines

- 1 page
- Double-spaced
- 1" inch margins on all sides
- 12-point Arial font
- Use paragraphs
- NO NAMES
 - Insert header with your student number (B0123XXX) at top right
- Typically, about 300 words

Step 4: Write Your Application Resume

You will upload a resume in the online application. Follow these instructions to write your resume.

Resume Requirements

This is your chance to highlight your amazing experience! Please follow these requirements closely:

- 1 page
- Post-high school ONLY
- Items listed in reverse chronological order
- Include healthcare-related experience if you have it. This includes shadowing, volunteering, or paid work experience.

Step 5: Gather Supporting Documents

Prepare any supporting documents you have for submission with your online application:

Required Supporting Documents

In addition to your Unofficial Transcripts

Students enrolled in prerequisite courses at an institution other than UAB must submit unofficial transcripts from all institutions with current enrollment.

Save a PDF copy of your unofficial transcript(s) to upload in your online application.

Optional Supporting Documents

Volunteer/Shadowing Hours

Documentation of volunteer hours and work in a healthcare setting will still be accepted, but it is not required.

Create 1 PDF with your documents and limit the PDF to 3 pages.

Documentation may include:

- Official timecards
- Signed letters from your supervisor on official letterhead
- UAB employees can retrieve Employment Verification Reports using these [instructions](#)

- Do not upload a test document. You cannot delete a document once it has been uploaded.

- You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been submitted.

Step 7: Complete Your Online Attestation Form

Complete your online prerequisite check sheet attestation form.

What is a prerequisite check sheet?

Your nursing advisor will complete a prerequisite check sheet that shows how the courses you have completed apply to the prerequisite courses required for the BSN program. This check sheet will be added to your application packet for faculty to review.

What is an attestation form?

Signing your attestation form certifies that you agree to the accuracy of the prerequisite check sheet you receive from your advisor and that you understand the requirements listed within the attestation form.

Step 7: Complete Your Online Attestation Form

Complete your online prerequisite check sheet attestation form.

After submitting your online application, your nursing advisor will create your prerequisite check sheet with all grades and in progress coursework documentation received by Sept. 4, 2026.

Your nursing advisor will send you this check sheet through Adobe Sign (to your UAB email) no later than Sept. 18, 2026*.

You will review the check sheet and sign the attestation form.

If your advisor identifies that a course/transcript is missing from your application, they will email the UAB and personal email address on your application **1 time** to resolve the issue.

If you do not respond to their email within 3 business days, they will move to the next step in this process. Applicants missing items will not be considered for admission.

*Do not email your advisor to request your check sheet until after Sept. 18.

Step 8: Update Your Email Address

Confirm your email address in UAB's system to receive important information.

We will send communication to your UAB email address and/or the primary personal email address on file with UAB.

To update your personal contact email (the email address the university uses to reach you outside of your student inbox):

1. Log into your BlazerNET account.
2. Navigate to the Personal Information section (green link at the top of the page).
3. Locate the Update Email Address to enter your new email.
4. *Make sure the non-UAB email address listed here is one you check regularly.

Complete your School of Nursing scholarship application.

If you're admitted:

(1) Program Onboarding

You're required to attend

A BSN Information Session on **Nov. 4, 8:00 – 12:30 pm.**

A BSN Orientation on **January 6-7, 8:00 – 4:00 pm.**

If you have no holds on your account, you'll register for classes.

(2) During the Program

Over 5 intense semesters, you'll complete 66 credit hours of studies comprised of didactic courses, skills labs, and clinicals.

(3) After Graduating

Graduates are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) to become a registered nurse (RN).

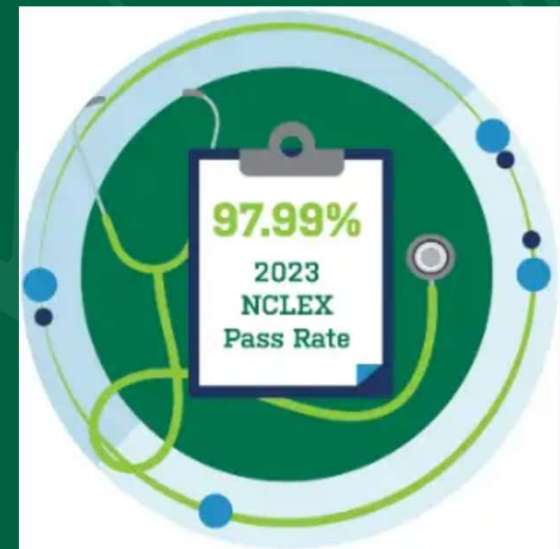

The UAB Nursing Community College Partnership
Joint Enrollment Pathway to the Bachelor's Degree in Nursing

Students must apply separately to both the Community College Nursing Program and the UAB BSN Program. In addition, it will be necessary for students to apply to both the Community College and UAB and to meet the admission requirements for both institutions.

A BSN degree is required for many nursing positions and even for employment in some hospitals. It also is required for admission to graduate programs that prepare nurses for more advanced roles including nurse practitioner, nurse anesthetist, nurse administrator, nurse educator and nurse researcher.

The Joint Enrollment Pathway allows students to earn a bachelor's degree in nursing at the same time they are earning the associate's degree in nursing. The advantages include:

- Completing all general education and nursing prerequisite courses at their home campus;
- Completing all RN to BSN course work in a distance accessible format using an online platform;
- UAB students can remain enrolled at UAB while completing the associate's and bachelor's degree in nursing.
