UAB Emergency Management is dedicated to protecting and educating the UAB campus and community about emergency situations and severe weather.

The university’s primary concern during any emergency or severe weather situation is the safety of its students, faculty and staff.

The UAB Emergency Management team continually engages in training and exercises. The goal of that training is to increase awareness, preparedness and response to events that may have a destructive effect on the UAB campus and community.

The UAB Emergency Management team uses NIMS, National Incident Management System, to help identify concepts and principles that answer how to manage emergencies from preparedness to recovery.

If a negative event were to happen on campus, the team is able to respond and provide support to all responding agencies.

They are in continual contact with the National Weather Service, state and local emergency management agencies, local law enforcement, FEMA and the Department of Homeland Security.
