REQUIREMENTS:

- ACT Composite Score of 22 or higher
- Must have earned an ACT math sub score of 22 (or SAT equivalent). Must place in College English 101 or higher.
- GPA of 2.75 or higher
- All incoming students must take the math placement test.

- Have personal insurance coverage uab.edu/studenthealth
- Complete required immunizations, background check and drug screen
