An Associate Professor and coordinator for clinical mental health counseling in the counselor education program at North Carolina State University. He has over 15 years of professional mental health experience working in different settings including university counseling, community mental health, and substance abuse treatment centers, as well as in-home counseling services and private practice. The conceptual framework for Dr. Grimmett's research is titled R.A.D.I.C.A.L. scholarship, which means Research Action to Deconstruct Institutionalized Cultures and Advocate for Liberation. This framework currently includes four areas of concentration and corresponding goals, which are: preventing gender-based violence through education, activism, male engagement, and community partnerships. Grimmett is the executive producer, codirector, and co-writer of MY MASCULINITY HELPS.
