## Title IX Student Guide for Pregnancy and Related Conditions

 The university provides appropriate accommodations for students who are pregnant, are recovering from pregnancy and/or conditions related to pregnancy.

What to know:

- The Title IX Education Amendments of 1972 (Title IX) is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex including pregnancy and parental status in education programs and activities.
- Title IX specifically prohibits discrimination against a student based on pregnancy, childbirth, false pregnancy, termination of pregnancy, or recovery from any of these conditions.

• Stay in school, attend regular classes, and participate in extracurricular activities.

What to expect:

- Create a plan to progress towards your degree after your medically necessary leave due to pregnancy or related conditions.
- Access services similar to those provided to other students who have temporary medical conditions.
- Maintain your eligibility to participate in academic and extracurricular programs and activities.

- Submit medical documentation from your treating physician and include physician name, practice/group, and contact information.
- Schedule an intake appointment with the Title IX Office to develop an accommodation plan around your pregnancy or related conditions.
- Access to counseling services, both on and off campus
- Academic support services, such as tutoring
- Assistance with obtaining excused absences
- Assistance with notifying professors of your upcoming absence
- · Rescheduling of exams and assignments
- · Change in class schedule, work schedule or job assignment
- Access to a larger desk
- Access to lactation rooms
- Any other measures that are reasonable and responsive to the student's temporary pregnancy status
