**A Resolution in Support of the Movement to Increase Accessibility to Menstrual Hygiene Products on Campus**

1 WHEREAS the University of Alabama at Birmingham Undergraduate Student  
2 Government Association has the honor and responsibility of representing the entire  
3 undergraduate student voice; and

5 WHEREAS it is the duty of the USGA to lead the undergraduate student body towards  
6 positive and relevant changes; and  
7  
8 WHEREAS menstrual hygiene products previously were not easily accessible in  
9 campus restrooms; and  
10  
11 WHEREAS menstrual hygiene products are a necessity to a large portion of the UAB  
12 student body; and  
13  
14 WHEREAS the USGA supports efforts to make menstrual hygiene products more  
15 accessible on campus; and

17 WHEREAS the registered student organization, Planned Parenthood Generation Action,  
18 under the presidential leadership of Erica Webb, has led the movement for menstrual  
19 hygiene product dispensers to be installed and accessible to students free of cost in  
20 women’s and gender-neutral restrooms at UAB; and  
21  
22 WHEREAS the UAB USGA will continue to partner with Planned Parenthood  
23 Generation Action and UAB Facilities in order to extend this project to restrooms across  
24 campus.

26 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the UAB USGA, representing the undergraduate  
27 student population, stands in support of Erica Webb and Planned Parenthood  
28 Generation Action’s efforts to increase accessibility to menstrual hygiene products on  
29 campus.

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the UAB USGA will support the funding of the  
32 installation and upkeep of new menstrual hygiene product dispensers in a number of  
33 currently existing restrooms across campus.

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the UAB USGA stands in support of UAB Facilities  
36 Division’s commitment to restock said dispensers across campus.
