How to Flatten a PDF

SITUATION/QUESTION:

At times someone (particularly Office Associates) may need to (or be asked to) flatten a PDF.

This may be regarding a signed or unsigned PDF.

BACKGROUND:

In software, the term “Flatten” means to permanently combine all the layers (of an image or document) together. Flattening a file greatly reduces the file size and the ability to change it.

Once a file is flattened, it usually cannot be undone.

SOLUTION/ANSWER:

1. Open the PDF with Adobe
2. Choose FILE→PRINT
3. Choose “ADOBE PDF” as the printer
4. Choose Properties
 - a. UNCHECK “Rely on system fonts only; do not use document fonts”
 - b. Choose OK
5. Choose “ADVANCED”
 - a. Click on Transparency Flattener Preset: Choose → LOW RESOLUTION
6. Choose “OK”
7. Click “PRINT” at the bottom of the page
8. Choose a place to save and a name for the “Printed” PDF, DO NOT save to ITSELF – Choose a new name

Note: This applies to a signed or unsigned PDF.
