I sometimes get messages on my computer saying things like this (usually when I'm trying to do Oracle work):

What is the easiest way to handle that?

SOLUTION:

Most computers in Medical Towers are set up so that when they are restarted, they automatically ask themselves:

“Do I have the most recent version of Java? If not, let me take a moment now to go get that.”

So, if you get a message about Java being out-of-date or needing to be updated, just click “**Run this time**” or “**Later**” and go on with your work.

Then restart your computer (when convenient for you) and that should automatically update it. (And of course if that does not solve it, then let us know.)
